COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS IN NEED OF MORE VOLUNTEERS



In Cadnam, a team of five volunteers spend their free time waiting to help those in need of immediate medical attention.

With the full backing of the NHS South Central Ambulance Service, Community First Responders attend to local medical emergencies such as heart attacks and strokes; often starting lifesaving treatment before an ambulance arrives.

If you have a minimum of 20 hours a month that you can give as a Community First Responder (within a 5 mile radius of your home), email cadnamcfr@sca-charity.org.uk



Minstead: 53% were exceeding the 30mph speed limit. 74 vehicles were travelling over 35mph and have received warning letters from the Police. One vehicle on Mill Lane reached 60 mph.

Lyndhurst: 45%, were exceeding the 30mph speed limit. 84 vehicles were travelling over 35mph and have received warning letters from the Police. One vehicle on Chapel Lane reached 51 mph.

Copythorne: 65% were exceeding the 30mph speed limit. 136 vehicles were travelling over 35mph and have received warning letters from the Police. Three vehicles were travelling between 50 and 60mph.

Beaulieu: 58 vehicles were travelling over 35mph.

Ashurst: 17 vehicles were travelling at over 35mph on Woodlands Road and Whartons Lane.

ANIMALS STRUCK BY 'HIT & RUN' DRIVERS



Each year, many animals are struck by 'Hit & Run' drivers and left to die a long, painful, lingering death.

If you do not report the accident but someone sees you or provides the sufficient evidence to enable you to be identified, **you may be prosecuted for failing to stop and report the accident and for causing unnecessary suffering to the animal involved.**

DO THE RIGHT THING

- **SLOW DOWN** - especially at night and when other cars are approaching with their headlights on. The faster you are going, the greater the damage will be to the animal, your car, and your passengers.
- **BE READY TO STOP** - ponies may step out even when they've seen you approaching
- **GIVE GRAZING ANIMALS A WIDE BERTH** - to animals grazing by the side of the road

IF YOU'RE INVOLVED IN OR WITNESS AN ACCIDENT - involving a pony, donkey, cow, pig or sheep, call the Police 999 (101 if it's not an emergency)

Anyone concerned about an animal should contact the Verderers' Office 023 8028 2052 (during normal working hours) or Forestry Commission 0300 867 4600 (24 hours) so that the animal can be inspected and assessed.
