Statement by Myself as Chair of the Council after Huntingdon Attack

"On behalf of Cambridgeshire County Council, I want to pay tribute to the extraordinary bravery shown by Mr Samir Zitouni, known to many as 'Sam', a customer experience host for London North Eastern Railway (LNER), during the major incident that unfolded on the east coast main line and at Huntingdon station on Saturday, 1 November 2025. In a moment of great danger, Sam put the safety of others before his own. Thanks to his courage and presence of mind, lives were saved. "This is definitely a case of ordinary people doing extraordinary things. Sam embodies the very best of our community spirit, and we wish him a full and speedy recovery. Our thoughts are with him and his family at this difficult time.

Consultation on County Budget

Cambridgeshire County Council is launching a public engagement survey today (Friday, 24 October), to gather residents' views on where the council should prioritise spending and savings in the years ahead

Every year, the council must set a budget which balances spending needs against income from council tax (around one-third of council funding), business rates, government grants, and service fees. These funds support a wide range of services including social care, education, libraries, highways and transport, environmental services, and waste management.

With rising costs, a growing population, and increasing demands – particularly in children's and adults' social care – the council faces difficult decisions about how to allocate resources. More than half of its spending currently goes toward social care, while other major areas of spending include SEND, transport, and the environment.

The council's Business Plan will set out a budget for the 2026-27 to 2028-29 financial years. Our Strategic Framework, which sets out our seven ambitions that will help us create a greener, fairer and more caring Cambridgeshire, is one of the guiding principles that informs the business planning and budgeting process.

Public participation time. 15 minutes allowed

It was asked if the PC would again make a donation to buy sweets for the children at the Christmas Light-up event. It would be in the region of £150, the PC said they were happy to donate, Clerk to arrange the payment to Jill Garnier who is arranging this.

A resident complained about the vegetation overgrowth at the New Road junction, this makes it difficult to pull out as the view is blocked, Clerk to contact Wellcome Trust as this is growing over their fence.

New Road junction- residents and Councillors are worried that an accident is going to occur here due to the sweep being too narrow, having to pull out into oncoming traffic when turning right onto the A1301 or having to stop on the carriageway to let cars exit from New Road. When entering New Road from the roundabout coming from Saffron Walden direction, cars are too close and not expecting cars to be turning left. Residents said that often they carry on round the roundabout until there are no cars following them, Others said they won't use New Rd junction as they feel unsafe and go to the North End junction instead. A Speed survey is to be done: the sweep of the road can be determined by the speed, however the PC said this wasn't good enough, even if speeds are lower the road is still not safe. Cllr McDonald said he would relay our fears to the County Council and Highways and ask them to drive this junction so they can see the problems.

Clapper gates on the permissive path: 2 new gates and fences have been installed which are very much an improvement. Are the other gates going to be installed as the ones there now are broken and difficult to use. Clerk will contact Bidwells.

A car has been abandoned on the Baulk road, it was in the field but now moved to the verge, Clerk asked for a photo and will then report it.
