

Neighbourhood Watch Schemes

***What are they?
Have we got one?***

These are questions I've been asking myself lately – in fact ever since I attended a Community Safety event at the village hall last month and met the couple who co-ordinate these schemes for the Maidstone District. You may be as curious as I was to know the answers, in which case, read on...

Neighbourhood Watch is a charity supported by the police and run by local volunteers but it manifests itself in different ways in different places, which makes it a bit confusing.

Its aims are to encourage people to be alert to the possibility of crime in their area and in their daily lives, and to do what they can to prevent it. This might range from taking basic home and personal security precautions (on which advice and help can be offered) to reporting anything they think might be suspicious.

Neighbourhood Watch encourages local people to do this as a community rather than as individuals but, as it relies on volunteers to organise things at the grass roots level, and as we don't all have a great deal of spare time, the nature of the schemes varies. They can be as big or small as you like, both in geographical area and in the scale of their ambition; some have strict boundaries, some are much more nebulous.

For some years, Judith Woodbridge and Jennifer Butler have operated a scheme for the residents of Liverton Hill and Elmstone Hole (to the north of Grafty Green) that has involved collating names and telephone numbers, organising informal gatherings, disseminating information and generally keeping a look-out for each other.

Meanwhile, at the southern end of the Parish, Sue Burch works virtually alone receiving the same information from the police and trying to make us aware of anything relevant by, for example, displaying notices in the village shop (for which service we should also thank Robert and Hazel, the proprietors).

But that's about the extent of it in Boughton Malherbe – as far as I know! – because no one person has any responsibility for encouraging, promoting, co-ordinating or supporting schemes across the Parish. I've been asked if I will do take on that task. So, how about this for starters:

Is there anybody out there who would like to get involved in a NW scheme in any way?

This could mean anything from just signing up to receive periodic information to starting a new scheme. (A new scheme could, for example, just encompass a short stretch of your road or a small group of houses where you live, and could involve anything from you simply acting as a contact person for the passing of information to and from your neighbours, to co-ordinating wider activities in the way Judith and Jenny do on Liverton Hill).

You might ask 'Do we need NW schemes in our quiet rural area?' Well, in the past, houses have been burgled, tools have been stolen from sheds, oil has been extracted from tanks, and, more frighteningly, the village shop has suffered raids with the threat of violence and at least one serious sexual assault has been committed within our Parish. Add to that the e-mail and telephone scams we are all prey to and the door-step con-men who can relieve vulnerable people of their life savings over time if allowed to, and I think you will agree that we certainly do need to be vigilant – not just for ourselves but for others in our community who are less able to look after themselves.

That's exactly what Neighbourhood Watch is all about and that's why I would urge you to get in touch if you would like to be any part of any scheme of any sort. If you're tempted, just give me a ring or send me an email to let me know and we can have a chat.

Defibrillator And Emergency Help

By the time this edition of Malherbe Monthly reaches the doorstep the newly acquired '*Public Access Defibrillator*' courtesy of local funeral director A W Court will have been installed in a locked cabinet in the porch of their premises in Headcorn Road and available 24/7. 999 callers to the ambulance service in appropriate cases will be given the 'lock code' to access the defibrillator (please note this is the only way to get access to the defibrillator and control its whereabouts).

Again for 999 ambulance callers I am willing (if available), independent of the ambulance service, to provide voluntary emergency first aid help including defibrillator prior to the arrival of paramedics. You can contact Chris Wheal **after calling 999** on 07979 864929.

Again by the time this article is read many local residents will have taken advantage of the short training sessions and although there are no further dates at this stage you can register to be advised when further sessions can be offered. Call Chris Wheal on 01622 858100.





Grafty Gourmet

This is a fine dish using asparagus spears. Just remove the tougher base stalks and throw the rest in the pan.

Asparagus Frittata with Soft Cheese & Chives - Serves 2

200g asparagus, trimmed
1 tbsp olive oil
Salt and cayenne pepper
Nutmeg, freshly grated
3 large eggs, beaten

125g soft cream cheese
30g parmesan, finely grated
2 tsp chives, chopped
Butter, for frying

1. Thinly slice the asparagus spears on the diagonal. Warm the olive oil in a non-stick frying pan, add the asparagus and season with salt, cayenne pepper and a pinch of nutmeg. Cook gently over a low heat until the asparagus is tender and lightly coloured. Tip out on to a plate, set aside and wipe out the frying pan.

2. In a mixing bowl, beat together the eggs, cream cheese, parmesan and chives until smooth. Return the frying pan to a moderate heat, add a little slice of butter and heat until it is just beginning to froth. Pour in the egg mixture, turn down the heat to low and begin bringing in the frothing edges to the liquid centre of the pan using a spatula.

3. Tip the cooked asparagus into the pan and disperse evenly. Continue to gently lift the more cooked parts of the frittata, allowing the liquid egg to slip underneath them until cooked. This should take around 2 minutes.

4. Slide the frittata on to a plate and allow to cool a little before serving.

Christian Message - June 2014

As I write there are a number of major items in the news that are making me think seriously and deeply about the job that I do. It's not that my job is particularly unusual or that it is rare to hear about it in the media. In fact, it is almost constantly that what I do is commented on. In fact, it is one of those topics that is almost constantly in the spotlight for one reason or another.

I work in a school.

It is a Church of England secondary school, closely linked to two Church of England Primary schools by being part of a Multi Academy Trust of around 1700 children from age 4 to 18. We share a common Board of Directors, as well as a wide range of organisational matters and all 250 or so adults are employed by the same Trust.

In the last week the violent death of Ann Maguire in a school and Leeds has rocked us all. A much loved and respected career teacher who was killed with only a few months to go before her much deserved retirement in the school where she had spent decades making positive contributions to the lives of generations of young people. This tragic event at Corpus Christi Catholic College brought such a profound sense of sadness on so many levels that has been almost impossible to shake.

The second major news item has been the comments of the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, defending faith schools. He said,

"People seem to choose these schools in large numbers. They are often in the poorest parts of the country, we seek to love and serve people, as we should, through these schools - and have done for hundreds of years."

For me, his comments go to the very heart of the mission of Church of England schools and of our belief, particularly his phrase 'we seek to love and serve the people'. Christ's message of loving one another, especially his love of children, is lived out every day in schools up and down the country.

What exactly does that mean in our schools? It would be wonderful to be able to say that every child and adult had a strong Christian faith. They don't. It would be comforting to say that there were no quarrels, no lying or deceit. It isn't true, far from it.

Our faith in the teachings of Jesus Christ makes our job more, not less, difficult. To manage conflict by love, to treat wrong doing with forgiveness and to live by a commitment to giving not one last chance but 7 x70 chances isn't easy! What is essential though, is that everything we say and in everything we do the Christian values of the school are there for all to see. The crosses on the wall of every classroom and office are not just pieces of wood but symbols of the strong spiritual dimension in all aspects of school life.

Ideally, all students would embrace Christ as Lord and know Him in their heart. Just as important, perhaps, is that they understand that there is a spiritual part within each of them and that they can, when they are ready to, explore and come to faith. In a practical

sense, this means that Baptism and Confirmation take place in school for those ready to take those momentous steps. For others? I want to make certain that a church is not a place to be afraid of – that when they go to a wedding, Christening or funeral they understand the services. More than anything, when Christ does knock on the door of their heart when they are 26 or 56 – whenever – I want them to know where to look, to whom they can turn to begin the journey.

So, to return to the Archbishop, the Church of England may be in conflict with itself over a range of issues, find it difficult to reconcile different views of its priests and might seem on the decline to some outsiders. All I can say is that up and down the country there are committed Christians trying to do God's work in the corridors and classrooms of our schools.

And Ann Maguire was a wonderful example of just that. May she Rest in Peace.
