WHAT'S HAPPENED?

Bramley Parish Council update

At the Parish Council meeting in January, a number of matters were discussed, including:

• Surrey County Councillor Kevin Deanus stated that the Devolution White Paper was published on 16th December 2024.

Devolution Update – 7th February 2025

The Government this week confirmed that Surrey will be part of the first wave of to undergo local government reorganisation and devolution. This follows the Government's publication of the Devolution White Paper on 16th December 2024. The Government paper wants to implement Unitary structure across Surrey. The 11 borough and district councils in Surrey will be merged with Surrey County council to create a single layer of government with unitary/multiple unitary authorities across Surrey. Cllr Deanus thinks there are likely to be 2 / 3 unitary authorities in Surrey, sitting over them will be a combined mayoral authority - so likely a Surrey Mayor. These will take on more responsibilities for example transport, education and more economic powers. Surrey County council

together with the 11 Surrey district and borough Councils now have a short period to negotiate and agree the general format of a new structure. The 11 Boroughs and Districts currently have 5.5 billion pounds of debt in total. SCC hopes to negotiate a reduction in the debt.

The government has chosen to postpone local elections scheduled for May. It is expected elections to a 'shadow' Unitary authority will take place likely May 2026

It is the view of Cllr Kevin Deanus, Cllr Goodridge and Cllr Austin that the power of Parish Councils could increase.

- Cllr Deanus has had several speeding meetings in the area, one discussing the potential introduction of a 20 mile per hour limit in Shalford. Cllr Austin stated that as Bramley residents drive through Shalford it would be useful if residents could complete the online survey: <u>Shalford village traffic calming, 20mph</u> <u>zone and 30mph speed limit proposals - Surrey County Council - Citizen Space</u>
- Waverley Borough Councillor Jane Austin stated that WBC 5 year housing numbers have been
 published and they are very low at 2.68 years. Dunsfold housing has been deemed not deliverable,
 which causes a lot of problems putting pressure on the infrastructure in the area as most of this would
 have been provided by the Dunsfold housing developers and also puts pressure on the numbers of
 new houses in the parish which has been increased from 746 to over 1400.
 - **5YHLS Update 7th February** this is now 1.28 years (so down further from 2.68 as previously reported). See here for the full report. Cllr Austin updated that this week there has been an application for a further 400 homes in Alfold and a consultation for 80 more also in Alfold, both of which will impact Bramley A281.
- Asda Community Fund Cllr B Stern stated that at the last meeting on 17th December there had been discussions about Gosden House and payments for the Christmas lights in the village, the first payment has now been made by Asda.
- Estates Manager Report Cllr Gravenell stated that the repair of the triangular noticeboard will start at the end of January. Cllr Marshall confirmed that he has now received delivery on the 2 new noticeboards and Cllrs agreed to replace the notice boards in Birtley Green and an the end of Edencroft

You may have noticed the posters advertising a free tree giveaway at the library on Saturday, 8th February which is in support of SCC's 1.2 million pound Tree Strategy for a greener future. There will be 100 trees to give away on a first-come-first-served basis with a limit of one per person from 9.30 am to noon. As background, all the trees are predominantly native broadleaf species such as Hazel, Holly and Cherry. They are all supplied in small pots and are of a manageable size which will fit in a car or can be carried on a bus. A representative from Surrey will be organising the tree distribution and offering planting advice.
