#### **78/2022** Approval of the Minutes for 4<sup>th</sup> January The minutes were approved and signed by the Chairman

## 79/2022 Report from Cllr Lezley Picton

The budgets for 2023/24 have been approved. This means that the Council faces the most substantial spending reduction programme ever.

There is going to be a consultation into Shropshire's draft first 10-year Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP) which sets out new cycling and walking routes, crossings and bridges.

#### 80/2022 Public Forum

Cllr Williams complimented the swift actions of Shropshire Council in removing items that were fly tipped. Cllr Williams also mentioned how helpful and efficient Derek Furlong (Shropshire Council) was with dealing with the road and path sweeping in Sunnyfields and Woodlands Close

#### Cllr Lezley Picton left the meeting.

A request was made for Caernarvon Lane, just past the old cottage, to be swept as it is muddy. **Action Clerk:** to ask Shropshire Council to sweep Caernarvon Lane and Walcot Road

Cllr Stone reported there were several potholes on the road past Villa Farm. Action Clerk: to report the potholes.

Jon Scutt reported that the Parish Room had been awarded a defibrillator and asked if the Parish Council would consider donating towards the purchase of a defibrillator cabinet priced at £495.00 +VAT. Discussions took place around the future of the defibrillators in the village and who would be responsible for them as well as fund raising. **Action Clir Maxwell**: to find out the life expectancy of defibrillators and report back at the July meeting.

# 81/2022 Updates from Previous Meetings:

- Speeding: Withington proposed to be included in 20mph pilot scheme. The urban areas taking part in the scheme have been announced. The rural areas have yet to be announced.
- Ownership of Village Green Hedges/Replace hedge by Blandings: Land registry maps have been obtained. The new hedge has been planted. More free hedge whips have been requested to fill gaps.

# 83/2022 Planning

<u>Church Farm Solar Farm 22/03486/FUL</u>: EEB66 Ltd (Elgin Energy) have sent a "Voluntary Unilateral Undertaking" for the Community Benefit Fund that requires signing. We are approaching Solicitors to review the document on behalf of the Parish Council. EEB66 have agreed to pay up to  $\pounds$ 1,000 towards the cost of the Solicitors.

**Barkers House 23/0057/CPL**: an application has been submitted for a Lawful Development Certificate.

## 84/2022 Health and Wellbeing Board: Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA)

The Health and Wellbeing Board (discharged by Local authorities and CCGs) have a legal Statutory Duty to undertake the JSNA. The JSNA seeks to identify current and future health and wellbeing needs in the local population and identifies strategic priorities to inform commissioning of services based on those needs. To ensure the needs assessments reflect local priorities and what local people think, we gather the views of local residents and professionals working within the JSNA areas by completion of online surveys, on ground face to face engagement and community meetings. **Action Clerk:** To email the village with the link to the online survey.

# 85/2022 National Association of Local Councils (NALC) – Civility and Respect Project

NALC is inviting all councils to sign up for their Civility and Respect Pledge which has been introduced because there is no place for bullying, harassment, and intimidation within Councils. A number of local council's have already signed up. The Councillors resolved to investigate where the pledge sits with regard to the Code of Conduct, obtain further information, the training involved and whether Withington should also sign up to the principle. **Action All Councillors** 

# 86/2022 Policing Community Charter: Withington's Priorities for Next Quarter

It was resolved that the 3 priorities for the next quarter will be:

- 1. Speeding
- 2. Investigation of Fly Tipping on Private Land
- 3. Wildlife Crime

Consideration will be given to including the actions of cyclists on the roads in the future.

Cllr Stone reported that a group had been formed to arrange the celebrations in the village; they met last month and are arranging to organise an evening bonfire and BBQ along with a funday involving music, entertainment and games etc. The group is meeting again on 16 March.
