PCSO Amy Hardy Summer Crime Prevention

As its now getting warmer, it's a good time for me to remind you of a few security tips.

- If you're gardening always remember to lock doors and accessible windows.
- Put all garden tools and equipment away after finishing the gardening in a locked and secure shed or garage, you can also consider property marking these items as an extra preventative measure.
- Going Cycling? Remember to lock your bike with a decent lock even if you're only leaving it for a few minutes.
- Remember to shut and lock your car windows and sunroof even if you're parked on your drive.
- Work together with your neighbours; watch out for suspicious and unusual behaviour in your neighbourhood. Get to know your neighbours so you can look out for one another.

Dunton Green Primary School

Since Christmas it has been an incredibly busy period here at Dunton Green Primary School. We have dealt with school closures, OFSTED, new testing, countless sports and musical events, a wonderful new outside area created by our fabulous parents, a Healthy Week led by the Community, World Book Day, St Georges Day, and the Queen's Birthday to name but a few.

Despite an incredibly disappointing OFSTED report in March the school continues to go from strength to strength and its reputation continues to improve as all of the staff remain committed to work towards a school that is able to provide an excellent education for the children of the village and retain our ethos and vision of holistic education which values manners, behavior and achievement not just in core subjects but across, sport, art, music and the humanities and at the same time to stay firmly part of the community. All of our efforts have been increased by the desire to "prove the inspectors wrong", a new action plan for School Improvement is in place and is being worked on relentlessly.

The tests that all our children sit during the month of May, both nationally reported and for our own records, have shown that year on year over the last 3 years progress of children has improved. Through this we have developed a strong moral code and duty of care towards the well-being and work life balance of staff as well as for our children which is reflected in the positive comments in our inspection report about how we develop our young people's mental and social conscience.

As well as our usual plethora of clubs and trips new opportunities for the children include KS1 dance club, coding club, sewing club and advanced writers club all of which have added to our already rich catalogue of opportunities for the children!

The school has continued its sporting successes with teams competing in rugby, mini-sports, swimming, football and netball as well as the many dance festivals that we take part in. To much delight of staff and students, we won the local partnership rugby tournament.

We do need and welcome any support that you can give us, now more than ever. We have a huge list of children who would benefit from additional reading opportunities which perhaps some of you in the local community would be able to help us with, this would greatly improve these children's outcomes. Dunton Green — Local Business Profile:

The Dukes Head

We speak to Tom Phillips who is Landlord of the Dukes Head in London Road



Chris and Lorraine were Landlords here for many years. When did you take over? Chris and Lorraine are still involved with the pub but are now living in Spain. They are still the owners but I am now the Landlord and am running the Dukes Head. I've been here since November.

Are you local to the area?
My entire career has been in the pub industry and prior to coming here I worked for a major chain running pubs in Guildford and the New Forest. I have close family living locally so know Dunton Green

well and jumped at the chance to come here when the opportunity arose.

The Dukes Head is certainly one of the older businesses in the village. Do you know much about its history?
You can find lots of photographs in books of the pub stretching right back into the history of Dunton Green. I haven't found out a lot of its history yet but it's something I want to know more about. It's been at the centre of the community here for so long and it's great to be a part of it.

What facilities do you have here? We have quite a spacious bar with plenty of room for people to spread out. We don't currently do food but that's something I hope to change in the next few months. Even if we just start off with simple meals and light bites. We do show a lot of football and have Sky which is very popular. We also have a pool table and regular darts matches. The large garden area behind the pub includes children's play equipment as well as seating which is fantastic in the summer.

Po you hold other events and activities?
Yes, we're very keen to be a part of the community and want people to be involved. We hold regular quiz nights as well as holding live music events and other activities. On 2 July we are having an event here with lots of live music in the afternoon, a bouncy castle and other activities and then another band in the evening. I'm hoping the weather will be kind to us but it's going to be a great day whatever happens.

Is it mostly local people that come here? We are very much a local pub catering to local people but we do get people coming from further afield. The Dukes Head has a good sized car park and we do get visitors

who want to come out to the countryside and enjoy the country location of Dunton Green, especially in the summer.

What would you say was the best thing about Dunton Green?

Dunton Green is a fantastic little community. We have several pubs, restaurants and some great local shops. I think it's a great place to live and work.

Are there any aspects of the village you think could be improved?

You've put me on the spot there. I haven't been living and working here for that long so I can't think of anything off the top of my head.

Do you have a website or Facebook page for people to find out about all the events and activities you are putting on?

A proper website and social media is definitely something I want to put in place but it's still on my 'to do' list. Residents are welcome to drop by for a drink and we can always let them know what's going on.

Thank you to Tom who took the time to talk to us. The Dukes Head is on London Road between the school and the recreation ground.

...I NEED THE POLICE?

Dial **999** if there is threat to life or a crime is in progress. Call **101** for all non-emergency matters.

...I NEED TO REPORT A STREET LIGHTING ISSUE?

If the street light in question belongs to the Parish Council then you will need to report the fault directly to the Clerk. Details of where DGPC columns are located:

Ivy House Lane	Pounsley Road
Kingswood Road	Rye Lane
Lennard Road	Vicarage Lane

All other street light issues must be reported to KCC's Highways Department via the 24hr Contact Centre on 03000 41 81 81.

PLEASE NOTE that whenever you report a lighting fault you will be asked for the **column number** (which is on the street light) and the location. Please ensure that you have these details to enable a prompt response.

...I NEED TO REPORT A HIGHWAYS ISSUE?

If you identify a problem with roads or pavements such as potholes, broken kerbs or missing signs you should report these to KCC's Highways Department via the 24hr Contact Centre on 03000 41 81 81 or via KCC's online reporting tool www.kent.gov.uk/roads-and-travel/report-a-problem
