1. Apologies for absence

3. Approval of minutes of the last meeting

Thankfully no-one was hurt when the light cover in the kitchen fell and broke – it was felt unnecessary to replace it.

7. Future Events

- i) BarnbyFest (2nd May) - Clare confirmed that Anthony's plans are on track; stalls in the Village Hall will include glassware, mosaic crafts and candles, with the car park hosting flowers, Newark Community Forst Aid, local Policing team and craft activities; a gazebo can be borrowed in the event of bad weather; activities on the Green will include toys, logs, hook-a-duck, crochets crafts, books, games (for which there will be a small charge, and prizes available) and a charity tombola; open gardens; there will be tea and cake at the Hall for which donations will be gratefully received; Graham to source haybales for seating; donations of plants needed for the Church sale; a rota will need to be agreed for gams and stalls; there may be a last minute addition of a jumble sale safari; donations to the raffle will also be needed and welcomed; any other support and help would be gratefully received for the event.
- ii) BBQ (4th July) - timings have been agreed as starting at 4pm with food at 5pm and the band's first set at 6pm; BBQs have been sourced; band has been booked. **Action – Clare to contact them to enquire if payment can be made by bank transfer; Clerk to apply for TEN with NSDC.**

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- iii) Summer lunch (16th Aug) - it was confirmed to start in Marie's garden and then move to the Hall for a cold buffet with pudding and a glass of Pimms – tickets £12.50
- Horticultural Show (5th Sept) - ideas for the photographic competition needed.
