From Your Parish Council

July and August saw three noteworthy events in our village.

The South Oxfordshire District Council 'Big Clean' initiative came to visit and, as requested by the parish council, cleaned away all the packed tree debris from the footway and roadside gutter along the A329 from the Ferry Lane junction northwards all along the listed Great Meadow wall.

This was closely followed by our first twice-yearly cutting of grass verges in and around the village. When undertaken by Oxfordshire County Council - the body responsible for roads and footpaths - the cutting of grass verges only happened once a year. Now devolved to parish councils, we are able to have grass verge cutting twice a year for a similar cost.

We also had the Swan Uppers visit during July. This fine old tradition goes back 900 years and is, broadly, a census of mute swans along the River Thames from Sunbury to Abingdon. It is conducted by both the Vintners and the Dyers livery companies, they jointly being the only bodies still to exercise their rights as granted by the crown.

On to more pressing village issues, and the playground. You'll have noticed the removal or exclusion from use of various features. This is due to serious rot in the timber forming these features, installed just five years ago. We are currently in negotiations with the manufacturer/installer about replacements. In the meantime, the affected timbers will be removed and stored pending an outcome.

Do please continue to support the Friday socials and make the best of the remaining weeks of summer. And don't forget the next parish council meeting which is in the pavilion at 8pm on Wednesday 11th September.

From the Vicar Andrew Petit

My dear friends,

I hope you have had a great summer. Often, the trouble is returning to normal life! And this year it seems the life we are returning to is far from normal! Parliament is about to be suspended and the probability of Britain crashing out of Europe with no deal seems to be growing by the day. Many are anxious or downright fearful of what the consequences will be in terms of medical and food supply lines, the overall impact on the economy, and the divisive effect this is all having on the United Kingdom.

For some, these anxieties pale into insignificance in the light of their own personal circumstances, whether it is a severe illness, or a bereavement or some other intensely painful personal situation. And certainly, as we look at places like Syria or the Yemen or those whose homes and lives have been wrecked by monsoon floods, we recognise that our problems in the UK are mild by comparison.

One of the wonderful things about the Bible is that it speaks to people in every kind of circumstance, including the most tragic. Around about 700 BC God is speaking to his people who previously turned their backs on Him and had then faced invasion by the ferocious Babylonians; they had seen loved ones killed or die as a result of starvation, and then been carted off into exile into a strange and pagan land. We can scarcely imagine what they had been through or what they feared for the future.

One of the most painful things when we go through tough times is if we feel we are going through it alone, whether as an individual or as a family. Another is if we feel there is no light at the end of the tunnel. But listen to what God says to those Israelite exiles in Babylon:

But now, this is what the Lord says — He who created you, Jacob, He who formed you, Israel:

'Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine.

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you;

and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you.

When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze.

For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour; since you are precious and honoured in my sight, and because I love you... Do not be afraid, for I am with you;

Isaiah 43 vv.1 – 5a

Whatever we are going through, however anxious or fearful we might be, God is calling out to us to tell us we are precious to him, that He loves us and is with us and we need not be afraid.

What wonderful words of comfort in difficult times, whatever they may be! I hope that they bring comfort, encouragement, and hope to you.

50 Years of Bridge

Wallingford Bridge Club celebrates its fiftieth anniversary on 11th September. On that day fifty years ago four enthusiastic Rubber Bridge players met to discuss the problem that the nearest clubs (Oxford and Reading) were an inconvenient journey away. Their solution was to form their own club that initially met once a week in the local school library.

In those days Rubber Bridge was the most popular version of the game even in clubs and it would be several years before the club added a weekly duplicate session on Fridays to its Rubber Bridge sessions earlier in the week.

Over the years Rubber Bridge has faded away and all that is left is a light-hearted social session on Tuesday afternoons. However other aspects of the Club have expanded immensely. The club has six duplicate sessions a week and one of those (Wednesday evening) is divided into two. There are often over 20 tables in play on a Wednesday evening.

The Club has continued to grow since it moved from the Bull Croft to Roke and Berrick Salome Village Hall in 2001. We now regularly have over 70 tables playing over the duplicate sessions each week. The amenities of the Village Hall have improved considerably over the almost two decades that we have been using it.

We have well supported day-time sessions (Monday morning, Thursday and Friday afternoons.) That helps those who can manage daytime but prefer not to travel at night.


The Club continues to climb the English Bridge Union's list of most active clubs in the country. It moved up four places this year to 20th. An achievement for rural club. Most of those ahead of us are clubs based on cities such as London, Birmingham and Manchester.

Alongside the competitive play the club has an active program of teaching. This covers introducing newcomers to

the game as well as providing opportunities for those who want to improve their skills. This year the Club introduced weekend courses for those who want a fast introduction so they can manage the basics and get some idea as to whether Bridge is a game they want to pursue further.

Club members are actively involved in the local schools introducing Bridge at the Primary school level.

As you can see Wallingford Bridge Club has made great strides over the last 50 years and is looking forward to the next 50. From a start of a dozen or so players playing once a week in 1969 it has grown to a club of over 400 with many members playing several times a week. 
