Farming in Crisis?

During a lifetime we have seen the transformation of the English countryside. The yield of wheat per acre has risen from about 1½ to 4 tons. Disease and pests which once decimated crops like hops and apples, have been controlled. Machinery has not only grown in size but also in effectiveness and efficiency. A large farm which once supported an entire village community and filled the church at harvest time can now be staffed by one farm worker supplemented by contractors as necessary.

These farmers too also face great difficulty as crop prices are at an all time low.

Creation does not exist solely to maximise profitability but is for God's glory as well as our enjoyment and to meet our need. The stewardship of creation presents us with one of the greatest global challenges of the Millennium

## FOOTPATH WALK SUNDAY 6TH SEPTEMBER

When I got to Evington Hall, I was amazed to see a crowd of walkers gathered outside, most of whom were unfamiliar to me. Was the new season of walks going to prove unexpectedly popular? Perhaps we would have queues to get over the stiles? But no! It was simply that the Shepway Footpath Group had chosen the same starting point for one of their walks. Disentangling the seven of us from Hastingleigh out of the larger group we made off down the road to the pond and up the path past the Vicarage. Despite gloomy predictions and recent heavy rain, it was fine but cloudy and we set out in good heart and with a firm step.

We took the second path on the left to cut across the field to Evington Lodge and then forked left along the track through the woods eventually emerging on the path which led along the edge of the fields to the north side of Lyddendane Farm. The Shepway Air Show was on that day so we could hear and, less frequently, see some air activity including a Lancaster bomber bumbling along escorted by an aging Hurricane and Spitfire. They seemed so slow now - how could we ever have been awed by their incredible speed at the time of the war?

From Lyddendane Farm, we crossed the road and made our way to Little Coombe, then wheeled left to Smeed and right across the fields until we crossed the Canterbury Road again just north of the reservoir. We filtered diagonally through coppice, crossed the fields at the back of Becketts Close and finally right past the former tennis courts to the road. Then we diverted to Sheila's for a welcome cup of tea.

A comparatively gentle walk designed, Sheila told me, never to be too far from the starting point, so that if the weather broke so could we for home

and shelter. In the event, the precaution was unnecessary.

The next walk will be on Sunday October 11th starting from Elmsted Church at 2pm. Hope to see some new faces there that will come with us not Shepway!

### THE DREADED FLU

Have you ever wondered why most flu's have Chinese names? The answer is related to poultry, pigs and people. The influenza virus needs all three to modify its structure and there are plenty of all three in China. Each year, influenza or flu is a little different and some people become ill, but every so often there is a big change in the virus and very few of us have resistance. The scientists are anticipating one of these big shifts in the near future. You may recall that last year millions of chickens were slaughtered in Hong Kong as it was feared that they carried a new, virulent flu virus.

I don't have to tell you that influenza or flu is an unpleasant illness: it usually presents high fevers, aches and pains with a dry cough for 7-10 days followed by 2-3 weeks feeling like a warmed up lettuce leaf! We cannot treat flu, just the symptoms; you need plenty of fluids, rest and paracetamol while you wait for your body to fight off the virus. If you develop a secondary bacterial infection then you may need antibiotics. What we can offer is immunisation to vulnerable groups for whom flu can be a very serious illness. The following groups are strongly recommended the flu vaccine, especially this year when a "big shift" may mean that a lot of people are susceptible: asthmatics and chronic bronchitics; diabetics; the over-75's; those with chronic heart conditions or chronic renal failure and anyone who is immuno-suppressed by drugs or disease. The vaccine is available at Wye Surgery from early October. Please phone 01233 812419 and ask for an appointment in one of the Flu Clinics.

A lot rely on their workmanship and word of mouth from satisfied customers for recommendation. So don't be pushed or bullied into having work done, check and confirm that it is needed and check the Company before it is too late. Genuine tradesmen will not object the less than honest ones probably will!

If you have any concerns about callers then contact your local Neighbourhood Watch, or if urgent the Police. Working together the Community is a very powerful opponent.

## HYMN WRITER OF THE MONTH

Henry Alford. b. Bloomsbury, 7 October 1810 d.1871.

HYMN 289    Come, ye thankful people, come,  
              raise the song of harvest home:  
              all is safely gathered in,  
              ere the winter storms begin;  
              God, our maker, doth provide  
              for our wants to be supplied:  
              come to God's own temple, come;  
              raise the song of harvest home.

When Henry Alford was made Dean of Canterbury in 1857 he was a renowned biblical scholar as well as a writer and compiler of christian verses and hymns. His time as Dean, cut short by death at the age of 60, was no less successful. Waking up a sleepy Cathedral basking in Victorian England, his immediate task was to introduce summer Sunday Afternoon Services with sermon where his popular preaching drew in holiday makers, although this move was less appealing to the Cathedral Chapter. Another innovation was to organise guided tours in the Cathedral. His gift of music and deep interest in worship enriched the Cathedral Services and in addition he formed a choral society. In short, Canterbury soon became aware that a new Dean had arrived. His life is commemorated by a window in the Cathedral erected by his widow.

Today he is remembered chiefly by this harvest hymn. The other one still retained in Hymns A & M New Standard is 'Ten thousand times ten thousand' (189) which was sung at his funeral. 'Come ye thankful ...' appeared in 'Psalms and Hymns' (1844) compiled by Alford. Then followed revisions of the hymn - in the 4th edition of his poetical works (1865); 'The Year of Praise' (1867) (a book designed for use in Canterbury Cathedral), and finally in Alford's 5th edition of his poetical works, 1868. No doubt this final version was first heard in the Cathedral.

There is, however, a hymn which had its birth in the Cathedral. This is 'Forward be our watchword', found in 'Songs of Praise' and the 'English Hymnal' as well as other denominational hymnbooks, though not included in Hymns A & M. It was commissioned for use as a processional by the Cathedral Precentor for the 10th Festival of Parochial Choirs of the Canterbury Diocese. Alford's first draft, words and music, was diplomatically turned down because it lacked the 'feel' of a processional hymn. Alford's reaction was to accept with grace the well intentioned criticism, and transferring his creative abilities from the Deanery study to the Cathedral rewrote the hymn, gaining inspiration from the building and through pacing up and down the nave. The twelve lined, six versed hymn was sung at the festival, but sadly Alford by this time had died. One verse, now omitted in modern editions, describes the beauty of the Cathedral with its 'arch and vault, and carving, lights of varied tone, softened words and holy, prayer and praise alone'. He is buried in the churchyard of St Martin's, Canterbury. But as long as harvest festivals remain his name will be remembered by this hymn.
