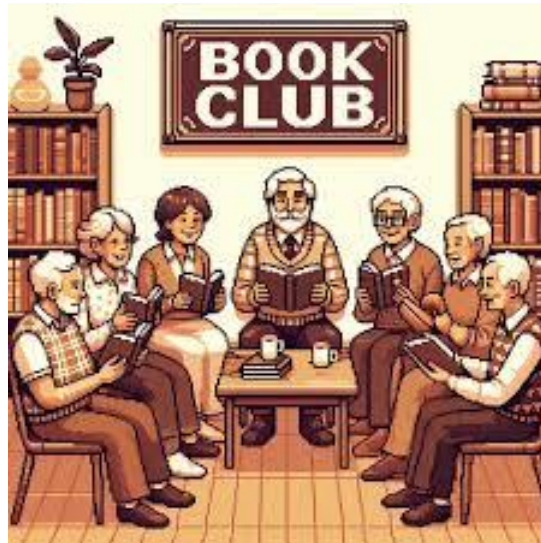
Have a chat with a DM when you next visit, and offer your tuppenceworth! Its a good way to get to know people.

The Shed is often asked to make, or repair, things for other people. We refer to these as **Community Projects**. We have a folder which shows some of the Community Projects. Some of them we have completed - planters, scooter racks, litter picker holders, bunting, banners, benches, etc. Some of these projects generate income for the Shed - we may get the cost of the materials plus a donation. In the last 8 months Community Projects generated 20% of our income. But we have had to turn down some things as we don't have the skills or
