Happy New Year! I hope you had a lovely Christmas and New Year. I expect it all feels a long time ago now, but I wonder if you can cast your mind back and recall your highlights of the season? 

Parish Council

The new owner of the Tithe Barn at Dove House has submitted a revised planning application for the barn's conversion to a residence (P23/S4142/S73 and P23/S4119/LB) and the Parish Council supports this application.

The redesign includes an open living space in the main building with a home office in the western wing and a bedroom wing to the east. The other significant change is that there will not be any rooflights in the barn as previously proposed. Instead the roof of the building will be unbroken and there will be additional openings in the external walls to let light in.

The Parish Council remains concerned about the reduction in the number of trees and shrubs near the road, although any comments we have made to the District Council's Planning Officer about this have been ignored for several years.

The new owner is eager to plant appropriate trees to the front of his property to make the aspect from the road more acceptable.

An appeal has been lodged with the District Council against the rejection of planning permission for the erection of a two storey garage and garden store at 1 Dove House Lane (P23/S1892/HH). The rejection considered the development to be inappropriate in the green belt, but the appeal argues that the new building is a proportionate addition and conforms to requirements for development in the green belt.

The District Council has granted planning permission for the two storey rear and side extension at 27 Parkside (P23/3259/HH).

The carols round the Christmas tree were very successful again this year. Thanks to Mark Chapman who led the carols and to the Flocktons & the Kings who managed the refreshments. And thank you to David Keene who obtained and put up the Christmas tree on Cuddesdon Green and the Baylies for decorating it with lights.

John Howell MP writes... January 2024

Even before the Christmas decorations were down, or perhaps before they went up, speculation on the date of the General Election has been hotting up. It could actually be as late as January 2025, but whatever the date, the campaigning is already underway. Not just in the battle for media attention and getting messages out, but also in more subtle ways. In Parliament the increase in emails on specific issues referring to the next Party Manifesto is noticeable. In parliament the use of mechanisms to promote specific issues, such as Early Day Motions and Westminster Hall debates is increasing.

Early Day Motions (EDMs) are motions that formally call for debate in the House of Commons but there is no timeline, simply at an 'early day' and few ever get debated. They are often used on behalf of campaign groups the reality, known by all involved, is that they rarely achieve anything. In any one Parliamentary session there will be well over a thousand EDMs tabled, and at an average cost of a several hundred pounds each, this is a substantial cost to the taxpayer. Given that they are ineffective, along with many colleagues on both sides of the House, I decided some time ago that I would not sign EDMs. Instead, there are many other more effective ways to raise an issue or lobby government. Whilst EDMs can only be signed by MPs we now have e-petitions which can be signed by anyone. These have much more success in raising awareness of issues and some do get debated.

There is also a note of caution on Westminster Hall debates. I said above that I have often held a Westminster Hall debate. An MP uses a Westminster Hall debate to raise issues of concern to them. They are formal debates recorded in Hansard, but there are not votes. However, they do get a response from a Minister. So, whilst the debate is important to the MP holding it, the attendance of other MPs is neither critical nor representative of the wider support for the issue. Sometimes it is just not possible to attend.

I have made public that it is not my intention to stand as a candidate for the next General Election. I have served the Constituency since 2008 I continue to take an interest in the views of constituents and, with the support of my team, assist those constituents wanting help.



The structure of Government, national and local, can be confusing. When someone needs help with something it can be difficult to know just who is responsible for what, and therefore who can help when things do not go as they should. I often receive requests from people to help them with issues that are not parliamentary matters and with which I cannot help. I appreciate that this can be frustrating and so I thought that it might help if I set out who does what.

It is often thought that an MP sits at the top of a hierarchy of Government and has power to direct local councils. This is not the case. Local councils are autonomous, and MPs do not have any jurisdiction over local council decisions. Hence local councils have their own elected representatives in the form of councillors. People elected to these councils have direct access to officers at the respective councils and so are better placed to take up relevant issues. I have found that referring to local councillors is the quickest way to get action.

So, to help steer through the hierarchy let me set out who does what. Essentially as an MP I can help with issues and concerns that relate to central government departments. In Oxfordshire we have three tiers of local government, the County Council, District Councils and Parish Councils or Parish Meetings. Oxfordshire County Council is responsible for local services such as education, social services, transport, roads, rights of way, libraries, the fire service, and bus subsidies. The constituency is served by two district councils, Cherwell and South Oxfordshire. They are responsible for local services, including planning, housing, rubbish collection, environmental services, leisure services, some car parks and council tax collection. Parish Councils and Parish Meetings deal with very local concerns and can influence the other councils on behalf of residents.

Whilst on the topic of what I can and cannot do it may also be helpful to comment on requests to attend specific events. When Parliament is sitting MPs are expected to be in Westminster from Monday to Thursday, unless on other parliamentary business elsewhere. During a week in Westminster there are many competing demands such as scrutinising legislation, attending debates, committees, and other meetings. These competing demands mean that it is not always possible to attend a particular debate or drop-in session that a constituent may ask me to attend.


