Winterton-On-Sea Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct adopted by a council must, when viewed as a whole, be consistent with the following principles (often referred to as the 'Nolan Principles' following recommendations made by the Committee on Standards in Public Life, chaired by Lord Nolan):

Selflessness

Holders of public office should act solely in terms of the public interest. They should not do so in order to gain financial or other material benefits for themselves, their family, or their friends.

Integrity

Holders of public office should not place themselves under any financial or other obligation to outside individuals or organisations that might seek to influence them in the performance of their official duties.

Objectivity

In carrying out public business, including making public appointments, awarding contracts, or recommending individuals for rewards and benefits, holders of public office should make choices on merit.

Accountability

Holders of public office are accountable for their decisions and actions to the public and must submit themselves to whatever scrutiny is appropriate to their office.

Openness

Holders of public office should be as open as possible about all the decisions and actions that they take. They should give reasons for their decisions and restrict information only when the wider public interest clearly demands.

Honesty

Holders of public office have a duty to declare any private interests relating to their public duties and to take steps to resolve any conflicts arising in a way that protects the public interest.

Leadership

Holders of public office should promote and support these principles by leadership and example.

Non-Pecuniary Interests – Winterton-On-Sea Parish Council Local Code of Conduct

An interest which relates to or is likely to affect:

(i) anybody of which the member is in a position of general control or management and to which he/she is appointed or nominated by the Council;

(ii) anybody—

- (a) exercising functions of a public nature;
- (b) directed to charitable purposes; or
- one of whose principal purposes includes the influence of public opinion or policy (including any political party or trade union)

of which you are a member or in a position of general control or management;

any person from whom you have received a gift or hospitality with an estimated value of at least £25.

^{*&#}x27;Securities' means shares, debentures, debenture stock, loan stock, bonds, units of a collective investment scheme within the meaning of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 and other securities of any description, other than money deposited with a building society.
