6. PLANNING APPLICATION -

17/3509M - Construct a replacement greenhouse and a wooden shed for hobbies and storage on concrete bases which already exist in my garden - Pepper Trees, Common Farm Lane, Snelson. SK11 9BO.

Members considered the content of the application and noted that there are no immediate neighbours which are likely to be affected by the proposed development.

Decision a) No objections.

7. PLANNING APPLICATION -

17/3597M - Proposed installation of 22m Lattice Tower with associated antennas and ductwork on concrete base within 7m by 7m by 2.4m high palisade fenced compound - ENW Electricity Substation, Congleton Lane, Chelford.

Members discussed the application and noted that the existing substation is surrounded by trees which reduce its impact upon the surrounding area. The proposed mast would extend above tree height, therefore, be potentially visible to surrounding residents. Members considered that the proposed location of the mast would not be particularly obtrusive.
