### 149. Minutes of the last meeting

The Minutes of the meeting of 21 June 2018, copies of which had been circulated, were taken as read and approved.

#### 150. **Declarations of interest**

Councillors were reminded that for those with any interest to be disclosed in relation to an item included in the agenda for this meeting, it was their duty to do so at the appropriate agenda item (as required to be disclosed by Section 96(1) of the LGA 1972, and in accordance with the Parish Councils Order 2001. Councillors had each received a form, which they were required to complete with any declarations of interest on an annual basis.

#### 151. **Matters arising**

(138) <u>Speedwatch</u>

A coordinator was still required. Clerk agreed to advertise the need for more volunteers on the Council Facebook and web pages.

(138) <u>SID/SLR</u>

Information had finally been received and was distributed. Cllr Grenville agreed to assess the situation and report to the next meeting of Council.

(138) Vitaplay

A statement showing all remedial repairs effected was requested.

(143) <u>Clerk</u>

Communication difficulties were still ongoing, but it was hoped would be resolved in the near future. An insurance claim had been made, and further information was awaited.

(144) <u>Wolverton Lane</u>

Borough Councillor Bound had visited the site, but no recent report of any outcome had been received. Clerk to contact Water Board for any updates on the situation.

(145) Grass cutting

Third round of cutting had been completed satisfactorily, according to our maintenance contractor.

(145) Grass verge, Wolverton

HCC had advised that they had not been responsible for using weedkiller on grass adjacent to ditching along Wolverton Road at Wolverton Common.

(146) Tree in ditch adjacent to 6 Heathlands

County Councillor Mellor advised that the strip of land between the pavement and fence of the property is not the responsibility of Hampshire County Council. This was equally true of the similar strip of land adjacent to 1 Heathlands.

## 152. County, Borough, BDAPTC and Police reports

- a) County Councillor Mellor reported that:
  - The Chief Constable had been unable to find sufficient time and resources with regard to the attendance of Police at local meetings
  - The issues at Ham Lane triangle had been resolved
  - Repair of potholes on the A339 and A340 were to be effected in the near future.
     Many potholes on major roads in the area had been repaired, and rural roads are to follow shortly

#### b) Borough Councillor Bound reported by letter:

- BDC had passed a planning application for a bungalow in Heath End Road at the corner with Pinks Lane despite the Office for Nuclear Regulation advising against; whether this permission will be 'called in' is as yet unknown. There is a planning application in at the moment (yet to be decided) for an hotel and housing on the golf course. Changes are to be made to the outline planning permission for the Manydown site; Urban & Civic have been chosen as the preferred partners for this development.
- More vandalism to the safety surfacing at Wigmore Park play area has occurred and from looking during the week seems to be continuing. Some police presence has been requested occasionally to try to deter this behaviour. There has also been some anti-social behaviour in the Plantation and Furze Road area with eggs and water bombs being thrown at properties. Information regarding the perpetrators has been passed to the local police.
- The Emergency Planning briefing at Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council attended in June was very poorly attended with only 4 Councillors present. It dealt with emergency procedures relevant to happenings such as floods. One of the main messages to come from the briefing concerned contact with the media and how important it was that anything that was said had to have been agreed with the authority in charge in charge so as to avoid wrong information being passed to the community via the media.
- Community, Environment & Partnership meeting discussed the future of the ice rink.
  The meeting was attended by some 70 members of the public who were very keen
  that the future of the ice rink should be assured through the developers, New River
  Retail. Unfortunately, the rink is in dire need of expensive attention and whether it
  can be retained long term has yet to be determined.

#### 153. Open forum

Residents present discussed various planning applications and their views on these subjects. Concern was also raised about speeding issues in the Baughurst Road, and the condition of right of way No 11.
