## **Tar Road Traveller Site**

Progress to date: WODC have taken action and removed the extensive fly tipping on the site, the concrete posts have been pulled out and the ditch reinstated across the entrance to Tar Road (picture below).



As reported in the last edition, the WODC Lowlands Planning Committee met in May and accepted the recommendation of the planning officers, unanimously refusing 3 planning applications for change of use to a gypsy site. Many local residents turned out to witness the debate which concluded in our 2 local district councillors, Cllr Steve Good & Cllr Hilary Fenton, respectively proposing and seconding the unanimous refusal of all 3 applications. The Local Planning Authority (LPA) were not persuaded that the limited additional information provided addressed the contamination issues nor had the changes to legislation materially altered the position such that an approval could be justified; in addition it was not demonstrated to the satisfaction of the LPA that the development could be undertaken without harm to a protected species; nor was it considered that the benefits of the development outweighed the harm.

We will report further developments as they occur.

# The magic number (3)

The Parish Council is down to 3 members, but contains 6 positions! Three additional parish councillors are needed to make up the numbers to the full compliment, which by law must be accomplished as soon as is practicable. Do you fancy being a parish councillor and entering into the world of politics?

If you do, to qualify you must be:

- 18 years old or over;
- A British, Irish, Commonwealth or EU Citizen;
- Not been in prison in the last 5 years!

Normally councillors are elected; the next formal election is in 2016, until then if there are vacancies councillors can be co-opted. If you fancy taking part in Parish Council then contact the Parish Clerk.

The last Parish Council meeting was at the start of July, minutes of meetings are available on the website below.

If you'd like to sit in on a meeting you are welcome to join them in the village hall on the first Monday of each month at 7:30pm (on bank holidays the meeting is moved to the following week)

Stanton Harcourt had an airfield during the Second World War, RAF Stanton Harcourt was to the East of the village and many of the original buildings can still be seen today on the Harcourt Estate next to the gravel pits, the airfield was the original reason for our "Devils Quoits" being removed (now refurbished and open to walkers!).

The airbase was mainly home to Whitley & Halifax bombers and is notable for being the starting point for the raid on the German battleship Scharnhorst and for being Winston Churchill's departure point for the Casablanca conference. A Whitley from here was said to be the first British bomber to fly over Berlin in the War.
