National Tree week campaign 2018 – too close to deadline for application.

Cllr Tipping contact two arboricultural experts to get a cost for a management strategy and framework for risk managing our tree stock. We have received one reply from All About Trees quoting £740.00 plus VAT. The second firm wanted a plan drawing up, Cllr Tipping has confirmed areas and will contact them again. Cllr Tipping to ask Simpsons for a quotation too, they will actually do the work so may charge less for the survey.

10 Parish Paths

Clerk to contact DCC for some way markers as they have faded, we are happy to replace them ourselves. These way markers are for our ordinary parish paths not the Pennine way.

11 AOB

Clerk to write to the Highway department,

- 1. is there any way to stop people parking on the junction to the back lane and the front street, This is a route of circulation on a narrow route which is quite often blocked now. This is an increasing problem with parking on pavements especially near junctions.
- 2. they have cut the hedge along the Armco barrier and made a good job of it, unfortunately they put all the cuttings back into the hedge. When the wind blew they all came back onto the road and some of these pieces are quite large. If the wind changes direction they could go over the bridge and end up on the A66. the road sweeper still turned around before going to the allotments e-mailed Jimmy Bennett 27/12
- 3. when the snow gates are closed cars/vans are parking and preventing emergency vehicles, snow ploughs and people trying to reach their own homes from accessing the A66 from the west bound slip road. This should be designated a clear way, allowing the police to take action if this occurs again.
