READ, Frederick William

Private L/10033. 1st Battalion, The Buffs (East Kent Regiment).

Born Chilham, Canterbury in 1895. Enlisted Canterbury. Resided Hastingleigh. Step-son of Stephen Prebble and son of Ellen Prebble (nee Read) of Hassell Street, Hastingleigh, Ashford, Kent.

Died Tuesday 20th October 1914 aged 19 years.

Frederick has no known grave. His name appears on the Ploegsteert (Plugstreet) Memorial, Belgium. Panel reference 2.

He had half brothers and sisters Edith, Ellen, Winnifred, May, Sidney and Elsie. Frederick had worked as a farm labourer with his step father.

The day that Frederick died his battalion was on the Bois Grenier – Radinghem Road in France. The battalion fell back to a wood to the south of Radinghem near the Chateau de Flandes. They were involved in heavy hand to hand fighting all day. At the end of the day 85 men were dead and a further 57 were wounded. On the 25th October 1914 the battalion withdrew to a line south of the Le Touquet – La Boutillerie Road.

THE LORRY WAY DOWN (update to Early June 2015).

As planned we met our friends Richard and Jocie, and their niece Kate, in Essaouria, on the West coast of Morocco, They flew in on the Friday, and left us on the Monday, this is made all the easier with Easyjet having direct flights there from Luton airport. There were certainly a lot of British and Irish tourists in town (well more than we had seen since arriving in Morocco). We had a great weekend, with lots of drinking and eating out, and generally blowing our budget! If you haven't visited Morocco before and fancy a city break, then Essaouria is a great way to see the culture, visit a souk, a working fishing port, and a walled city, etc., all without the pushy nature of Marrakech. By the time Monday morning came, we were in truth relieved to be leaving the town, with all the hustle and bustle.

We headed East inland, stopping at the outskirts of Marrakech to restock with food supplies, then up and over the Atlas Mountains. That day we started at sea level and during the epic climb up over the Tichka Pass, we reached the dizzy heights of over 7400ft. Colonel K performed perfectly (even though the "road" was very badly damaged in places, and had indeed been washed away in the storms of last November). Our destination that evening was Ouarzazate, which is fair size town split in two by the river at the base of the valley. It is also home to film studios, where quite a few modern blockbusters have been made, such as Troy, The Mummy, and The Kingdom of Heaven etc.

We followed the signs to a campsite which was about 2km down a dirt road, through a residential area. On arriving we took one look at the entrance and deduced that the Truck would not fit under the entrance arch (this also had living accommodation above it). The owner appeared and assured us that it would fit, and indeed had recently similar trucks in the campsite, so I slowly edged under the arch. Suddenly I felt the resistance of the masonry on the roof bars and we were wedged stuck!! There was only one thing for it, let the air out of the tyres, and carry on through. Once in we settled down and stayed here for 3 nights, it was a great site. Leaving the site was another drama, and you can read about it on lorrywaydown.com

On leaving Ouarzazate, we drove down to Zagora for a couple of days, and then on to the very end of the road, a small village called M'Hamid, this is about 20km from the Algerian border, and there is a huge military presence here. When in M'Hamid, there was a strong wind from the dunes and this was causing quite a dust storm, so we didn't stay here, we retraced our route back towards Zagora. We had previously noted that there was a short cut across country from just South of Zagora, and as we wanted to see how Colonel K performed off road, we thought that it was the perfect opportunity. The "piste" started off as badly broken tarmac, and then a there was a sign saying that ahead was 54km of dirt and gravel track. I can tell

you that in well over 40c and no-one else about for miles, you really do start to feel quite vulnerable. The "piste" wasn't too taxing, but Colonel K came through with flying colours (even the contents of the cupboards remained in place!).

We then spent a few pleasant days in Erfoud, before heading back to Agadir, where we were due to pick up our Carnet de Passage from the local DHL office. We stopped for a couple of nights in an oasis called Skoura, visiting the fantastically preserved Kasbah, built in 1680. While here we received a message from a couple that were west of us, who wanted to know if we fancied meeting up and discussing the possibility of travelling with us through Western Sahara, Mauritania, and Senegal, then them returning to Morocco on their own. So next day we drove 200km to meet them. We explained to Richard and Sally that we needed to go to Agadir to collect documents, and would then proceed South with them if they were up for it. Yup, they even said that while in Senegal they would come into Gambia with us, before we left them for the Mali border. Trouble was, I think they were totally unrealistic in their time scale; they were looking to do the whole trip, and back to Morocco in about 3 weeks! I think this is impossible, and despite them buying anti-malarial drugs in Agadir, and looking into getting a Yellow Fever jab in Dakar Senegal, after a few days together, they changed their minds. I also think that the month or so that they would be South of Morocco would have started to be quite expensive for them (the Visa into Mauretania is approx. £120 per person if obtained at the border, plus fuel costs etc.). It also meant that they would have to do the return trip on their own. We wish Richard and Sally all the best on their 2 year trip. So we are now back to the original plan, and are on own.

As I write this we are still in Agadir, and awaiting our package consisting of Carnet de Passage, and a few small items for the truck. It is over 2 weeks since it was posted via DHL from the UK, and has been stuck with Moroccan Customs officials in Casablanca for 8 days now. I must say DHL have not helped us in any way, and unless we actually drive into Agadir and see them face to face, we are just brushed to one side. Hopefully we will get this in the next couple of days and be on our way South.

If you are interested, after just over 70 days away (40 days in Morocco), we have covered over 4300 miles, our fuel consumption is 12.8mpg, we have used 1.5 litres of engine oil, our average daily spend in Europe was £72.49, and our average daily spend in Morocco is £52.47 (so far).

I read with interest the item from Wye Patient Participation Group in the June issue of Community News. It mentioned about choices that patients value are where they are treated and cared for and where they die but there was no reference to hospice care. As I am a volunteer at Pilgrims Hospice Ashford I asked the Senior Nurse Manager in-patient Services, Lyn Folan, if she would be kind enough to write something about hospice care for the Community News and she very kindly sent me the following. I do hope it will help readers understand more about what wonderful work the hospice does.

The role of the hospice in caring for patients approaching end of life

It has long been perceived that the hospice movement only cares for patients with cancer for whom curative treatment is no longer appropriate. However approximately 25% of the patients cared for by Pilgrims Hospice in East Kent have other life limiting conditions such as heart failure, lung disease and neurological disorders.

The majority of patients approaching end of life when questioned would prefer to die at home and the hospice works with other health providers to try and make this a reality. Part of making this happen is to be able to plan for the last phase of life in advance and to ensure that patients and families are aware of the services that the hospice can offer and how to access these services.

Referrals to the hospice can be made in a number of ways and not all parts of the service need to be accessed. Health professionals such as GP's, Hospital Doctors and Specialist Nurses can make a referral to the hospice team if appropriate. The hospice runs a variety of programmes aimed at keeping patients healthy and providing support and guidance in managing symptoms such as breathlessness and fatigue. In addition there are a whole variety of day centre services for patients and carers providing much needed respite for both parties. The ethos of the hospice is to enable patients to live as full a life as possible and to provide support and care as

patients approach end of life.

The hospice team includes doctors, nurses, social workers, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, chaplains, counsellors and complementary therapists. As part of planning for the future the team can help with providing advice on care options including choices relating to which treatments patients would prefer **not** to receive, The hospice social workers can provide advice and guidance on how to access on-going health and social care and benefits entitlements. The hospice team can also help to support families to be able to have the sometimes difficult conversations concerning what is important at the end of life.

Most patients cared for by Pilgrims Hospice remain in their own home throughout their illness although integral parts of the hospice service are 3 in-patient wards at Ashford, Canterbury and Margate. It is often reported that patients only go into the hospice to die however the reality is that at any given time more than 50% of patients admitted to the in-patient wards go home again after a short time. Patients are admitted for numerous reasons including symptom management and adjusting medication.

For some patients approaching end of life remaining at home may not be possible or desirable; decisions may change as the time gets closer or carers may not be able to continue and patients can be admitted to the hospice for a short period of time at the end of life. Staff work with the patient and families to provide a 'home from home' environment and actively encourage visiting – including family pets!
