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## **INTRODUCTION**

### **TYPES OF POTENTIAL EMERGENCY RISKS WHICH MIGHT IMPACT ON THE PARISH.**

Public Health pandemic  
Major transport accident (road, rail, air)  
Pollution/chemical release from transport accident  
Total or partial loss of main services - Electricity, Gas, Water  
Explosion / Major Fire / Gas leak  
Building collapse  
Severe weather/storm damage, may include some flooding  
Parish very severely affected by snow / cut off to an unusual degree

### **THE PURPOSE OF THIS PLAN IS TO PROVIDE INFORMATION FOR:**

The Parish Emergency Management Team, the Emergency Services and Bassetlaw Council in the event of a major incident which may threaten the safety and welfare of the community, both residential and employed, property and livestock.  
Its key objective is to provide speedy communication and help to the Emergency Services (or to deliver appropriate action while awaiting the Emergency Services); and in particular, to provide appropriate support for vulnerable residents and reduce the level of panic in the community.

### **PARISH COUNCIL EMERGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Advise local residents what the emergency organisations plan to do.  
Follow the requests made by the emergency services and the local authorities.  
Maintain a contingency plan to cope with a serious situation until the Emergency Services arrive.  
Keep people informed so that they can help themselves.  
Ensure as many vulnerable people as possible are contacted and assisted.

## **ACTIONS FOR LOCAL PEOPLE IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION - FLOODING**

In an emergency follow these simple steps to help you stay safe:

- Check on other people & pets in your household to make sure they are safe.
- If the flood water hasn't reached you, move your car to higher ground.
- Gather essential items and put them upstairs or in a high place.
- Fill jugs and saucepans with clean water.
- Turn off gas, electricity and water supplies if safe to do so. DO NOT touch sources of electricity when standing in flood water. If you have an electric pump running you will need to leave your electricity supply on.
- Put plugs in sinks and baths to stop water entering your home. Weigh them down with a sandbag or plastic bag filled with garden soil. This is only a short-term solution. You may need to consider a longer-term solution such as non-return valves, as groundwater can be high for months.
- Keep listening to local radio updates or call Floodline on 0845 988 1188. Stay safe. Always listen to the advice of the emergency services and evacuate when told to do so.
- If evacuated, you will be taken to an evacuation centre run by your local Council. Free food and bedding are provided and most will let you bring your pets.
- Bring spare clothing, essential medication, pet food and baby care items if you have an infant.
- Stay tuned to the local radio.

## SNOWFALL

**NATIONAL SNOW CODE** According to the County News there is no law stopping you from clearing snow and ice on the pavement outside your home or from public spaces. Use sand or salt – not water! If you use water to melt the snow it will refreeze and turn to black ice. When you are shoveling snow take care where you put it so it does not block people's paths or drains. ## Pandemic

A Public Health PANDEMIC is the UK's highest risk.

TRIGGER – PANDEMIC DECLARED BY WORLD HEALTH ORGANISATION (WHO).

Parish Council to discuss Flu and any other Public Health pandemic's at council meetings on an annual basis and certainly at key times, for example: Flu season.

### DURING PANDEMIC THE PARISH COUNCIL WILL:

- Put up NHS posters, and share with churches, village shop, etc.
- Consider cancelling public gatherings and meetings, as advised by the NHS / Government
- Activate volunteers to help people living alone with:
  - Dropping off food
  - Dropping off prescriptions / anti-viral flu drugs
  - Looking after pets
  - Keeping in touch with infected people through email / phone.
