10. PARISHIONERS' QUESTIONS	 The Parish Council was asked about the following: If there was any update on the new school build. As far as the Parish Council is aware this is on schedule. Changes to the Village Magazine Editorial Team. Kent Barker had left the team. Peter Thomas and Ruth Clark are the current co-editors. Minnie Garnier is currently too busy with the NDP to re-join the team but will input and help when she can. Difference in income from HMT between 2018 and 2019. Prior to HMT transferring to the Benenden Village Trust the Parish Council paid the Clerk's salary which was reimbursed by HMT. The balance of Parish Council funds. It is good practice to have healthy reserves, which should at least match the current precept figure. Reserve funds are being used to meet the cost of the Neighbourhood Development Plan, and the Parish Council will be making a substantial donation again this year to the new playground. Citizens Advice Bureau support. The Parish Council gives £100 annually to the CAB, as with other similar organisations. The Parish Council will consider a request to increase this amount when received from the CAB. 20mph limit. The Parish Council was under the impression that 20mph outside the new school would be permanent. It has however been advised that this limit will be timed to coincide with school times. The Parish Council has written to KCC. Parish Councillor Co-option Policy. The Parish Council follows the set procedure for co-option but does not have a specific policy. Any candidate who wishes to find out more about the role is invited to meet with/ask questions.
