



Emergency Plan

In extreme conditions such as heavy snow and flooding, there is a possibility that the emergency services may not be able to reach the scene immediately. In such circumstances, the initial response may rely entirely on local people. To coordinate such activity, some councils have formulated a Community Emergency Plan to help their community to prepare for an emergency and reduce its impact. The idea is that local communities may know about particular hazards and problems that affect an area, be aware of individuals who might need assistance in an emergency, and have access to people, resources or buildings that allow them to respond more effectively to specific incidents. Your Parish Council has developed such an emergency plan which contains vital information and guidance, the plan is reviewed annually to ensure it remains current. All personal details are held in confidence, unless the plan is activated when such information is required, as required by the Data Protection Act. The plan contains details such as:

- Meeting venue
- Medical contacts
- Holders of equipment (i.e. water pumps, generators, etc)
- Details of vulnerable residents

in the event of extreme snow, a prolonged loss of power, a serious traffic incident, flooding or other emergency, local people may be required to provide an initial level of support. If you feel that you could be called upon in an emergency, i.e. you are medically trained or have equipment which could be useful, please contact clerk (trudigasser@rocketmail.com) so you can be added as a contact. Please include your full contact details and what you feel you can offer in the event of an emergency.

B4449 Update

Work has started on the B4449, it is slower than we hoped but it is progressing. The footpaths along the B4449 have been cleared of 'overgrowth', the road drainage system cleared, the roundabout on the B4449 has been cleared of moss and bushes cut back at junctions to improve visibility. The council have initiated traffic surveys both in the village and on the road to Eynsham, we will let you know when we have the results. We still need action to address the speed and volume of traffic travelling through Sutton cause both excessing noise and vibration. Progress of the Cycle Path and engagement with OCC disappointing. OCC tell us they undertaking background work to further assess the feasibility of a cycle path to Eynsham but cite pressure of work for slow progress and have marked the B4449 for forthcoming repairs

Gravel Extraction

The Minerals and Waste Local Plan: Part 1 – Core Strategy was adopted by OCC in 2017 and they have now commenced work on Part 2 – Site Allocations see OCC Minerals and Waste Local Plan. We are watching with interest as this process progresses.

The timetable states that the Consultation on Preferred Site Options is scheduled for publication June/July 2019 with a target date of November 2020 for Site Allocations.

The main purpose of the Sites Plan is to allocate sites for minerals and waste development, as specifically required by policies of the Core Strategy. As there are so many local sites that are under consideration both extension of existing site and new developments) along with their potential traffic impact – we are watching developments closely.

A40 Update

The results of the A40 Consultation was published by OCC in May. The next phase is detail design, then a planning application which will be submitted in spring 2019. This first phase development is the A40 Eynsham Park & Ride proposal:

- A40 Eastbound Bus Lane from Eynsham park and ride to west of Duke's Cut
- · canal and railway bridges proposal; and
- short sections of A40 westbound bus lane on the approaches to Cassington
- traffic lights, and Eynsham roundabout.

Litter Picking

Monthly Litter Picking is on-going. A particular thank you to the organisers and the all participants doing such a fantastic job keeping our village tidy. Such activity demonstrates that each and every one of us, young and old, can make a difference to our environment.

Road Closures

3rd-4th June – carriageway works on the A40 at Eynsham will mean a speed restriction from 60 to 20mph around the Eynsham Junctions

24th – 25th June - OCC have posted a Temporary Road Closure Notice. The B4449 will be closed from the Hardwick junction of the A415 and B4449 to the roundabout at Friars Farm to facilitate carriageway surface dressing overnight.

27th June for upto 4 weeks – Main Road Stanton Harcourt (the road out of the village towards Standlake) will be closed to allow new sewer pipe installation.

Any updates will be circulated via email lists and published on the pc website

OVO Energy Women's Tour professional cycling race

Full details of the route have been unveiled. On Wednesday 12 June the race will start Henley and the 145 kilometre-leg that will finish outside Blenheim Palace. From Henley the race will cross the River Thames at Wallingford, then through Didcot, Harwell and Wantage, crossing the Vale of White Horse to Faringdon, before looping through the West Oxfordshire towns of Burford, Charlbury and finally Woodstock.

So, if you are planning to travel on Wednesday 12th of June be aware!








Festival Day: Saturday 22nd June 2019
