What is a Men's , Women's or Community Shed ?

Men's Sheds are not unlike a traditional Shed in its nature – a place full of tools and machines – but on a larger scale with room for many.

It is essentially a safe space for people to come together and share conversation and tools whilst engaging in practical projects

Sheds are places of skill sharing and informal learning, of individual pursuits and community projects, of purpose, achievement and social interaction.

Questions and Answers

- **What's the best way to find premises ?**

- Tell lots of people locally you're looking for premises
- Approach Schools, Colleges & Churches
- Approach local Councillors and your local MP
- Possible empty Shops
- Can you share with another Group – e.g. Youth Club, Age UK, Cricket Pavilion, Scout hut
 - Note sharing premises when Sheds are undertaking activities such as drilling, sawing etc can sometimes be difficult.
 - Note – Many “empty” premises in Cornwall have been converted to Holiday lets!
- Doesn't need to be huge (A double garage)
- Some Sheds don't yet have premises but still function
- There are some mobile sheds in Buses and Coaches

- **How do you finance it ?**

- Examples given – Services PAT Testing, Christmas Reindeer sales
- Charge members to attend (e.g. £4 per session / £1 per session)
- Approach Lions, Rotary, Round Table , Age UK, SWW Neighbourhood Fund, Isles of Scilly Steamship Company in Penwith, Community Foundation (Launceston), Co-Op Funds
- Community Groups (e.g. Volunteer Cornwall, Cornwall Rural Community Charity (CRCC))
- Approach local Town and County councillors
- Local council – Community Chest
- National Lottery
- Contact Supermarket community champions at Asda , Tesco & Waitrose
