DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT FOR THE NEWCASTLE BOROUGH

**Staffordshire County Council (Regrading of Public Footpath No.20 in Betley Parish
to a Bridleway) Modification Order 2025**

The above Order made on 28th January 2025 if confirmed as made, will modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by:-

The regrading to public bridleway of a length of Public Footpath 20, in the parish of Betley, in the borough of Newcastle. Commencing on Common Lane approximately 173 metres from its junction with the west side of Main Road, Betley (point A on the map NGR 375219,348607), and proceeding in a generally westerly direction for approximately 526 metres, then in a generally west north westerly direction for approximately 317 metres, then in a generally westerly direction for approximately 98 metres to its terminus at the County boundary and the eastern end of Public Bridleway 5, Chorlton Parish (Cheshire East) (point B on the map NGR 374339, 348717).

If no representations or objections are duly made to the Order, or if any so made are withdrawn, Staffordshire County Council instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State may confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with it.
