ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE CHAIRMAN

Cllr Wilson nominated Cllr Dearing as Chairman . Cllr Matthews nominated Cllr Dolan as Vice Chair all in favour.

PRESCRIPTIONS AND OVER THE COUNTER MEDICINES (OTC)

NHS England has published guidance to reduce prescribing medicines or treatments that are readily available to buy over the counter in shops and chemists. This means that some medications will no longer be available on prescription, even if you are entitled to "Free Prescriptions". All patients effected by these changes will be notified individually in due course.

Also, if you seek advice from a Doctor for a common condition, such as a cough, cold, sore throat etc, you will be referred to your local pharmacy, where they will be happy to help without the need for an appointment . Obviously , if your symptoms do not improve after a few days you should seek further advice.
