1 WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

6 DEFIBRILLATORS – Installed at Old House at Home and Iron Bull Roadhouse.

.1 **Purchase and installation** As supported by the 2021 Parish Assembly (held online) the Parish Council has purchased two x Public Access Defibrillators (PADs). The first located

with kind permission of Donna and Chris at the Old House at Home, and the second recently, with kind permission of Paul at the Iron Bull.

The Parish Council received with thanks grant funding of £500 (some time ago) from the Clubroom; plus £800 from County Cllr Elaine Still's devolved budget for the Old House defibrillator, and £1,000 from Ward Cllr Grants toward the Iron Bull defibrillator. (Noted – that it's good to see money paid to the Councils coming back into the Community.)

Thanks to the Pubs for hosting the defibrillators plus installation and wiring for the cabinets. Thanks also to June James and Pauline Hedges for co-ordinating with the respective pubs.

- .2 Defibrillator demonstration** To thank Nick and Penny from Hartley Wintney Fire Station for demonstrations on using a defibrillator and the importance of both early intervention and dialling 999 without delay. The Iron Bull hosted two sessions – with coffee – for total of 48 people – the majority being Water End Park residents, but also from the Andwell Brewery Cafe and Hackwood Business Park.

7 NEWNHAM GREEN

- .1 Ponds** HWARG continue to survey – report of 23rd March:

'It is looking like this is an exceptional population of GCN now. Previous surveys have been pretty good counts, but this years has soared up from an average good peak count of 30-40 adults to approaching 50-80 peak counts of adult GCN. With extrapolation to include unsurveyed areas of the bank, we are looking at a peak count of 115-125 adult GCNs in the main pond. Bearing in mind, this is the peak count, so there will be more newts than counted, your pond is looking to be something special locally and we believe it is a key local amphibian pond.'

- .2 Green Maintenance 2021** – Lengthsman and Schröder working party of 9th December
APPENDIX II.

Ditches were cleared on 9th December

- by Ridge Lane east of Tithe Barn
- by Tilney Lane across the Green as far as the telegraph pole by Well Cottage.
- by the 'Triangle' on Newnham Lane.

Utilities plans show there should be no cables in these sections of ditch.

- plus again the east side of Church path but restricted here by tree roots.

Spoil from Newnham Lane and Crown Lane taken to midden by pond.

- Ditches in front of Well and Quince Cottage cleared by hand.

Ditch banks Tylney Lane opposite the pub planted foxglove and cowslip plugs

Triangle mown, scarified, all arisings raked and removed. Wildflower plus planted (with thanks, donated by Hatch Warren Nature Group)

Main pond margins - cleared by hand

Pond by Naishes Barn – c 60% Willow saplings removed from around the pond.

Bulbs – Bluebells and snowdrops planted in Green by Crown Lane. Weed shrubs and saplings cleared by hand.

- .2 Green Maintenance 2022**

AGREED To contact Manor Farm re potential plans and schedules for this year's Green mowing.

- .3 Metal detecting and finds** – A metal detectorist has recently been working on the Green with the permission of the Malmesbury Trust. Finds have been reported to the Hampshire Finds Liaison Officer and pictures supplied for the *Villager* **APPENDIX III.**

Finds include: 'A 1940 half crown (50% silver), a 19?? sixpence again 50% silver, a 1920 full silver sixpence (soft and worn) and a silver three pence. (Silver comes out of the ground pretty well.) Also a 1919 penny, a very surprising 1854 Napoleon 3rd 10 centimes (Napoleon 3rd exiled from France and buried in Farnborough), a 1938 penny, a 1950 German pfennig, and a 1864 Victoria half penny (showing how badly copper deteriorates). Most of the coins that have come out along the road have been George V. In the fields surrounding the village a notable find has been a cut penny from King John.'

Also found a large section of an engraved Crotal bell. (Crotal bells, also known as rumble bells, were used on horse-drawn vehicles before motorised vehicles were common. They were often made of bronze with a slot cut down the side. Used to warn other horse-drawn vehicle users (mostly on country roads) that another vehicle was approaching.

- 8 JUBILEE** (Extended bank holiday Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June.)
- .1 Events** – <https://www.royal.uk/platinum-jubilee-central-weekend>
 NOTED Official timetable includes Beacon lighting on the Thursday evening (beacons lit 9.45pm) and the Jubilee lunch on the Sunday.
Discussion:
- The official gas beacons at £490 are not value for money and, using two gas bottles each, arguably not in accord with current climate emergency and energy crisis. Option to have one made, but again outlay for something which won't get much use. To consider alternatives, maybe a fire pit or bonfire.
 - Holding a Thursday evening Community event corresponds with the national event and makes sense if people may go away for the weekend.
 - Ideal would be to have the pub involved.
- ACTION Chairman to discuss with Old House at Home.
 ACTION Clerk to pursue Jubilee event grant applications.
- .2 Jubilee Tree** – Queen's Green canopy.
 AGREED The Parish Council would like to plant trees, looking for suggestions as to location(s). Also noting recently lost a lot of big trees in and around the Parish (storm Eunice then Franklin).
- .3 Jubilee Bench** – Suggestion put forward by VCC. Agreed not to spend a lot of money on eg a carved Oak bench due to overall limited resources. To request suggestions.
- 9 LITTER**
- .1 BDBC Street cleaning A30** – Report from Nick Walker supported by Pauline Hedges that: 'I have noticed of recent months the amount of litter and debris on the A30 from Water End and through Nately Scures has increased significantly. Email received on 14th March from B&D Street Cleansing Manager, to say: 'I will assess the route this week and arrange for any litter picking to be done asap.' Awaiting further action.
- .2 Newnham Litter pick** Sunday 20th March – part of the national Keep Britain Tidy Great British Spring Clean 2022. Thanks to Alan Richmond for organising and to all taking part.
- 10 BUS SHELTERS**
- .1 Maintenance** – Area around the Water End bus shelter has been cleared of weeds and rough grass, raked and sewn with a 'bee & butterfly friendly' seed mix. Noted the residents are proud of the bus shelter and surrounds to the entrance to the Park.
 AGREED Parish Lengthsman to clean and maintenance check all five bus shelter on the A30 – including brushing out the bus shelter at Water End Park. To make regular routine checks.
- 11 PLANNING**
- .1 Parish planning applications** See Planning Update **APPENDIX IV**.
- .2 Local Plan Update** progress has been delayed – citing uncertainty over national policy and also to change of leadership. (Following Ken Rhatigan's resignation, Simon Bound is leader of the Council with Cllr John Izett (Evingar) as Deputy. Jay Ganesh (also Sherborne St John & Rooksdown) has Planning and Infrastructure portolio).
 The present LPU schedule is to consider housing in June, with Reg 18 Consultation for late summer / autumn publication.
 AGREED To continue pressing BDBC re the Settlement Study and Settlement Policy Boundary.
- 12 GREENING CAMPAIGN**
 The Greening Campaign requires the support of the Parish Council to sign up to it – but is for the Community to lead on and engage with. Idea being that big differences can be achieved by a multitude of small actions. However the Phase 2 Expert Advice packages – as funded by Hants County Council - are now available immediately.
 There is an info evening tomorrow about the support package **APPENDIX V**.

- 13 FURTHER REPORTS**
- .1 Footpaths Report** - Newnham FP 3. Localised flooding on the path – at the dip by the Strings boardwalk – and at central section of the path near boundary of Wild Green Acres and Tithe Barn – remain on Countryside Services' works schedule to be fixed.

- 2 Clubroom Update** - The Clubroom Committee now comprises Chris Alliston, Alastair Jeffries, Rosemary Richardson and Leah Stenning. Noted all Covid restrictions now lifted, only limit is the insurance maximum capacity of the Hall which is 60. Chris noted that unfortunately the prohibition on hire for teenage parties has been reinstated due to a problem incident when a party was gate-crashed.

The Clubroom as previously noted has Solar plus battery storage, and Wi-fi. CCTV also installed monitoring surrounds of building and car park. Window double glazing units have been recently been replaced.

3 Water End

- i. Road surface repairs Recent A30 closure from Water End towards Scures Hill for four nights, repairing cracks in the road with new tarmac, both carriageways.
- ii. Signage Pauline Hedges again reported the quantity of signage at Water End to be a significant problem. So many signs that at night impossible to register all, or visually separate signs from vehicles. Signage need to be rationalised.

ACTION Clerk to contact Hants Safer Roads, also County Cllr Elaine Still.

- iii Report of sheep loose in Water End Lane.

4 Highways and Lengthsman

- i Lengthsman – County funding for Parish Lengthsman confirmed for 2022/23
- ii Newnham Road signage – Hampshire County Council have improved signage in the vicinity of the Traffic Calming buildout by the Clubroom (funded by the Parish Council under the Community-funded initiative), plus added cats eyes and repainted the white lines. The posts have also been painted white with a rail added to increase daytime visibility.

5 Police Update

- i Police Community Meeting 'Barn Meet' of 3rd February held in Rotherwick Village Hall, c14 police attended, c50 guests. Speakers included Horse Watch, Equine Liaison, CPS, Chief Inspector. Main message is that all local policing is intelligence led, reporting of any suspicious incident including details, number plates, photos from the public is vital in building an evidence base for targeted policing and for prosecution.
- ii Police reporting – QR code Police are seeking means to make reporting easier. Hants Constabulary has recently circulated a new QR code via which to report crime, information and anti-social behaviour. **APPENDIX VI**
- iii Recent spate of thefts and attempted break-ins Theft of metal, also any type of oil – including heating or cooking oil. Both Old House and Iron Bull suffered attempted break-ins. PCSO Andy Jones attended. Red car sighted traced to a London Metropolitan area. At the Iron Bull two men in a van came across the fields behind the pub from Water End Lane, caught on CCTV climbing over the wall.
- iv Also noted that Newnham is not presently well-positioned in terms of policing and not having a dedicated rural police officer. Neither Newnham nor Mapledurwell & Up Nately are officially part of Rural South area, but M&UN is more included being South of the A30. Newnham is between the Candovers, Hart and Basingstoke Policing Areas, officially part of Basingstoke East but B/stoke focus is on urban crime, domestic violence etc. PCSO Andy Reid will attend in Newnham if an emergency – if a crime is taking place.

- 6 Incinerator** – meetings not resumed since Covid. Noted the lights from the incinerator / treatment plant (Veolia and Thames Water sites) ever-increasing – looks like a city at night, massive light pollution.
