Equality Act 2010

Stretton under Fosse Parish Council will achieve this by following the Equality Act 2010 which applies to all public bodies. The policy states that no individual will be discriminated against on the grounds of:

- Age
- Disability
- Gender
- Marital Status
- Pregnancy
- Race
- Religion and beliefs
- Sexual orientation
- Ethnic origin
- Nationality

The act places a public sector duty on Stretton-under-Fosse Parish council to eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct prohibited under the act.
