

# **Community Health Champions**



Providing a vital bridge between local people and services in their community.

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### What are Health Champions?

Community Health Champions signpost friends, family, colleagues and neighbours to support in their own communities. They enable a large number of individuals to access health support and advice and are aware of the wider determinants of health e.g. support such as housing, education and debt advice. Health Champions can be very effective at integrating with local communities and providing a bridge between local people and other services. The Health Champions receive locally tailored training and are part of the Health Connections Mendip Service.

#### Who are Community Health Champions?

Anyone who is interested in finding out about what is available in their community and would be keen to pass this information on can be a Community Health Champion.

#### How do I become a Community Health Champion?

You can become a Community Health Champion by attending a free half-day training course.

#### Why do we need Community Health Champions?

The more people there are that know about the support that is available in the community, the more we can all support each other. There are great services in our community but sometimes people don't know about them.

## What impact has the project had?

Over the last six months our Health Champion Coordinator has trained 31 Community Health Champions who have so far signposted 270 people to support in their community.

#### What are the plans for 2016?

As Health Connections Mendip is always patient-led we train the people who are interested in becoming Community Health Champions. During 2016 we have training sessions planned for patients, staff from a large supermarket, care agencies, housing associations, local community cafés, community police, town council staff and students and teachers from a local secondary school.

We have had requests from community members to roll the project out across Mendip. The project is currently supported financially by Frome Town Council and we are now seeking the support of other Mendip town and parish councils.
