

Parish Council report January / February

Following the news of the planned closure of the Methodist Chapel, members considered whether to meet at the Village Hall or the new hall at the school in November. The Clerk contacted both halls to check availability. At the December meeting members felt they needed more information and agreed to visit the newly completed school hall. In late December, members met with the Head and had a tour round the new hall and left impressed by the facility. It will be a huge improvement for the school, staff and pupils, and everybody involved in the expansion project should feel very proud of what has been achieved.

At our January meeting this week members agreed to hold our future meetings in the school hall and are grateful to the school for facilitating that. We remain very grateful to the Methodist Chapel for hosting our meetings in recent years. Once arrangements are in place for the switch we will post details in the magazine and on our website, but for now we will continue to meet at the Chapel, while it remains open. Three grants were applied for and awarded by members. The WI applied for a grant of £125 towards the cost of a new screen for the Village Hall. The WI also applied for a grant of £250 towards the cost of a new projector to support their members with poorer sight. The school applied for a grant of £500 to contribute towards the refreshing of the playground markings which were last refreshed 21 years ago. If organisations would like to apply for a grant then they should apply to the Clerk. These are ordinarily awarded at our January meeting and need to be applied for by the end of December.

Earlier in the public participation session of the meeting a member of the Carnival Committee asked for the council's support in securing a permanent Christmas tree.

This was informally widely wel-



Op the Earden Path with Topiarius

Spring clean

Although a little dangerous to say that the end of winter is in sight, it is the time when the gardener can set his or her sights on the new season. One of the first thoughts is or should be clearing up and preparing, and two important jobs to this end are sharpening tools and spring cleaning glasshouses/ potting sheds. I find it very satisfying to sweep and tidy, although the pristine state does not last very long. I remember a columnist writing a long time age that life is too short to wash and disinfect pots and trays every year. Quite right I thought and carried on just tapping out any compost/soil and using them again. However, it seems that Matthew Biggs writing for Which Gardening still does carry out a pot cleaning routine. Having had no problems, I will not be changing my habits, but will continue to ensure that seedlings in particular get adequate ventilation.

If you have been carrying out work over the autumn and winter to fulfil the actions that were identified in an assessment last summer, now is a good time to review progress. There are only a few weeks left until your time will be taken up with planting and cultivating so, if necessary, plans can be changed to fit the time remaining.

On the subject of trays, I am sowing more and more vegetable seeds in tray inserts rather than direct in the ground. This is partly due to the influence of reading of Charles Dowding's advice in this direction but mainly because I increasingly have found it to give a better guarantee of success and actually does not add to the effort needed. Interestingly, Beth Chatto was advocating this approach more than 30 years ago.

Thinking of historical precedence, Charles Dowding is seen by many as the modern day guru of the no digging approach to cultivation. As so often is the case, this is nothing new. James Gunston invented no dig in the 1950s and wrote a book "Successful Gardening Without Digging" in which he describes his methods in detail. He ran a successful market garden on land that previously was thought unusable. His tool for producing a tilth was an ordinary fork with a hoe handle and the tines bent downwards at 900 to the shaft, which he called a chrome. I have found that a 4 pronged cultivator is fine for relatively small areas. His second tool was a marker with was a piece of 3" by 2" with five sharpened 2" wide and 9" long "teeth" screwed to the back and a handle attached. With 12" spacing of the teeth, this was bit big for most of us who are not market gardeners but a smaller version is worth thinking about. He would not have been too happy with the modern organic movement. One of his comments was "Minerals that are mined or quarried cannot be said to be artificial." ♦



Tanat to Perry Community Wildlife Group Curlews in North-west Shropshire Please help with our 2024 bird survey.

The Tanat to Perry Community Wildlife Group area extends from Oswestry in the north to Kinnerley in the south, and eastwards from the Welsh border to Ruyton-XI-Towns: from the Tanat to the Perry.

We will be organising our bird survey again this year, to find Curlew and Lapwing, and we need more helpers, please. It's all done from public rights of way, and it's only necessary to record where the birds are seen or heard. No nest-finding is involved. It only takes three 3-hour visits between the beginning of April and mid-June, simple instructions and a map to record your observations are provided, and there will be a training session if you want to come.

A meeting will be held on Wednesday 6th March at 7.30pm at Morda Social Club, Weston Road, Morda, SY10 9NS, to present the results of our work in previous years, and plans for 2024. All welcome!!!

Our bird survey is the first stage of the Curlew project, as it locates the pairs of Curlews to focus the efforts of the nest-finders.

In 2023, the two groups located 12-15 pairs altogether, 9-10 in the Tanat to Perry area, and 3-5 in the Three Parishes. One nest was found and fenced, north of Oswestry, and three of the four eggs hatched, but all the chicks were predated. A chick from a nearby nest went on to fledge, and two other separate pairs near Trefonen each also produced at least one fledged young, so there has been some success to build on.

If you saw or heard a Curlew in 2023, particularly if you observed evidence of breeding, please tell us: don't assume we know about it.





(Continued from page 21) AI and the Clergy of voice expresses a need for help. For the clergy, exposure to the flock at the Sunday service, funerals, marriages, baptisms and attendances at functions such as harvest suppers and public events offers opportunities for connection and caring.

Missioners in the church have used Al to gather data, and try to draw conclusions, from activities that people do, but statistical manoeuvres do not sway people towards God. They have sought to emphasize the use of AI in digital campaigns targeted to specific audiences, such as members of the community. and to children. Attached to these are scoring modules to allow the missioner to evaluate whether the target audience has been reached. It all becomes a a vital rôle for any priest in their being a marketing exercise and most of us dislike being bombarded with questionnaires asking us how well the company

in question has done after we have purchased some item from them. Undoubtedly AI can be a help, but personal contact is vital. Although safeguarding has inhibited people from bodily contact, 'pressing the flesh' as modern stylists would have it or a friendly arm around the shoulder can provide immeasurable comfort.

There are instances in the Bible in which Jesus touches someone to heal them. The reverse, as in one instance described by the physician Luke, Jesus felt something was being transferred from him when a woman touched his clothing knowing that, by touching him, she would be healed. Communication with people especially at public events and not necessarily only by touching, is shepherd to the flock, and is one that AI is unlikely completely to fulfil. ♦



ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE AND THE CLERGY

Michael Davie

The Clergy are included among the professions at risk of their rôle being subsumed by Artificial Intelligence (often abbreviated to AI, though this abbreviation has other connotations for country folk). That being so, what can the purveyors of the gospel do to flourish?

As might be expected, an entire church service including the sermon has been put together and delivered by AI. In this experiment the reactions from the congregation to the service were that "it was interesting but don't let's do it again"; "the human element was lacking...it seemed to in some way prevent us from connecting with each other. ... the heart was missing." The clergyman in charge said that the service seemed stilted. The reactions to the AI service emphasize the need for a human connection between clergy person and the flock. What can a human being offer? Here creativity comes into play. The audience (congregation) is missing the human input that creates interest. A human can read the service with varying tones of voice, deliver the sermon with passion. If the service is a communion, ordained priests must according to the Prayer Book break the bread and lay their hands upon the chalice to consecrate the wine. Services have been run with recorded sermons from distinguished preachers, but the pastoral, a word derived from the Latin for shepherd, aspect is missing. The com-

ment that the AI service prevented people from connecting with each other, suggests that a priest was necessary to bring people together.

Connecting with people correlates with those professions seen to be at no risk from AI. Vocational occupations such as medicine and its allied professions which involve caring for people and sport come high on the list of occupations that AI will be hard to challenge. How then can the clergy adapt? In the past medicine was a large part of the clergy's role. Monasteries provided medical assistance and monks produced their own herbal remedies as described in the Brother Cadfael stories by Ellis Peters. Many present hospitals had a religious origin (think St Bartholomew's and Christ's hospitals). Over the centuries religious input into healing has declined and after the advent of the NHS only a token input has been maintained.

The connectivity that people felt was lacking at the AI service and the gradual disengagement of the clergy from the healing services are both examples of the detachment of the clergy from their basic duties, namely caring for people. The old saw for success "it's not what you do, it's the way that you do it" applies to many professions, not only the priesthood. Many lawyers, doctors and other professionals tell of clients or patients wanting to come back and see them at intervals more frequent than necessary. Often a tone

Shrove Tuesday and Lent

Why is there a tradition of eating pancakes on Shrove Tuesday? How did Ash Wednesday and Shrove Tuesday get their peculiar names? And why is this time of year associated with early versions of football, cock fighting and the strange figure of Jack-a-Lent?

Ash Wednesday, which this year falls on February 14th which is also Valentine's day, is the first day of Lent – a forty-day fast in the run-up to Easter. In the past, Christians would mark this period by avoiding meat, cheese, cooking fat and eggs, and trying to behave in a sombre and serious fashion.

This had the inevitable effect of encouraging people to get their fill of rich fatty foods and to indulge in boisterous behaviour before this downbeat time started.

This is why the tradition of wolfing down pancakes – made of butter, eggs and lard – on Shrove Tuesday (the day before Ash Wednesday) arose. As well as enabling people to enjoy these foodstuffs before the long weeks of frugal meals began, pancake-making was a chance to use up any such ingredients.

A number of customs are associated with Shrove Tuesday pancakes. Britain's oldest pancake race takes place in Olney, Buckinghamshire, with the competitors – dressed as traditional housewives – flipping their pancakes as they run.

In Bedfordshire, there used to be a custom of children running to a certain hill and putting their ears next to the earth to "hear the old lady frying her pancakes underground."

Nowadays only Catholics and very devout Anglicans seem to observe Lent, and their fasting often involves giving up just one indulgence, like chocolate or alcohol. But though the practice of strict fasting at Lent has gradually decreased, pancake eating on Shrove Tuesday has survived.

About 52 million eggs are consumed in the UK on Shrove Tuesday, which is 22 million more than normal.

Shrove Tuesday was traditionally a time of disorder. It was a day for cock fighting and cock throwing (hurling objects at birds tethered to the ground). It was also a time when many 'football matches' were held.

Past versions of football were different to the game we know today. The ball could be carried or thrown as well as kicked, the teams could have scores of members, and there were few rules – often the games resembled little more than all-out brawls. The goals might be several miles apart and the game could take most of the day.

Many of these Shrove Tuesday football matches were banned due to their roughness, but a few have survived, in slightly cleaned-up forms. One such game takes place in Sedgefield, County Durham.

This game is played with a cricket-sized ball, which is passed through a metal bull-ring on the village green at the start and finish of the match. Though the action in Sedgefield is still fairly robust, play stops sometimes to let a pensioner or child have a 'lucky kick' at the ball.



The Feltonians

West Felton **Feltonians** was an organisation of its own time - and it ran out of time some years ago. Have you noticed there are no 'old-age pensioners' any more? We're all supposed to carry on as if we are still middle-aged, "seventy is the new fifty" etc. When Americans were asked in 2009 what "being old" means, the most popular response was, "Turning 85". In 2022 the average lifespan in the USA was 76 years - apparently the average American dies before getting old. Are we going the same way?

Well, in 1976 there *were* still Senior Citizens. On 10th February 1976, Major Jim Pearce, President of the Royal British Legion, West Felton Branch, and his very active wife Betty (*WI, Meals on Wheels, Poppy Appeal organiser, etc.*) invited members from the various organisations of the village, viz. WI, Church, Chapel, Parish Council, etc, to a meeting at Lane End to discuss the formation of a Senior Citizens Club in West Felton.

It was attended by Mrs L Beddoes from WI; Mr & Mrs Stan Roberts representing the Chapel; Mr Bob Edwards from the Parish Council and Mr Joe Stokoe, a British Legion member.


Jim Pearce proposed that a tea party be given for the Senior Citizens on 3rd March, to find out if a Senior Citizens Club was wanted or needed, the cost of the tea to be paid for by the Royal British Legion, West Felton Branch.

Mrs Pearce invited to the party all the retired people of the village and a Mr Thomas, Secretary of Age Concern. Mr Thomas opened the proceedings with a talk on how to run a club.

Mrs Pearce was appointed President Mr Stokoe - Chairman Mrs Lloyd - Secretary Mr Gittens - Treasurer

Mr & Mrs Coles - Entertainment Mrs Kenyon - Savings Organiser It was decided that the Club would be called **The Feltonians** and would meet every Tuesday at 2pm. Tea would be made and served by Mrs Pearce and Mrs Kenyon, biscuits would be provided by three members on a rota system. A Savings Group was started for members to save for Christmas, holidays etc.

The Club was very popular and active for more than 35 years, the last big

outing may have been Christmas Dinner at The Brow in 2011, but unfortunately I cannot confirm this date.

At weekly meetings on Tuesdays in the Methodist Schoolroom plans were made for trips to the seaside, longer holidays, formal Christmas dinners, anniversary celebrations and, really, any excuse for a party. After refreshments, games were played: whist, and scrabble and all the old favourites. As the membership naturally dwindled, there being no more Senior Citizens to continue it, the club folded.

Chris Hayes and family of the Avenue inherited a wonderful photo album from two of the last Feltonian members, most fondly remembered Olive Hayes, who joyfully celebrated her 90th birthday at the club in 2009 - and went on to enjoy more years as secretary, and Chris' late beloved mother Cissie who was a keen member and appears in most of the photographs. Olive's sister Evie and her husband later came to live in West Felton and soon joined the happy gathering. The late Mrs Dolly Jones was a particularly active organiser and keen to preserve the club as long as possible. (*We saw her husband Fred playing bowls in last month's story of the Fox & Hounds*).

The oldest photo (*date unknown*) shows West Felton Brownies serving the tea to more than twenty members in the Schoolroom. Christmas 1984 sees the members enjoying Christmas Dinner in The Boat House, Ellesmere; the following year they were at The Black Gate, Oswestry. In December 1986 the Christmas party is in The Pedigree with about forty guests. Later years saw the Feltonians travelling further afield for their formal dinners.

Summer garden parties at Lane End, The Milloon, and other members' gardens were a particular delight, and good opportunities for fundraising.

Handicrafts were still popular, many of the members were particularly skilful; prize-winners in WI shows as well as those organised by **Oswestry Association for the Elderly** (what a name for a club! Ed.).

Looking through the album, one feels as if one is on a long road trip: Bridgemere; Burlton; York; Morecambe; Church Stretton; Ludlow; Hereford; Pebble Mill Studios Birmingham; International Convention Centre, Birmingham; Stratford upon Avon; Llandudno; Audlem; Southport; Llanfair PG; Aberystwyth; Aberdovey; Machynlleth; The Wirral; Bowness; Newquay; Great Yarmouth; Grasmere, the Peak District - to name just some of their holidays and day trips. And as for hostelries? Too numerous to mention! They certainly knew how to have a good time. •
