A Very Special Thank You.. The team at the Practice were overwhelmed and delighted to receive such lovely and thoughtful messages/cards and generous gifts during the Christmas period and New Year period. On behalf of the whole team at the Practice, we would like to thank you all for your kindness and generosity during these challenging times, they are gratefully received. Thank you.

Have you got a couple of hours each week you could spare to support someone in our community? The Much Wenlock & Cressage CoCo Group are recruiting for more volunteers to help support a frail or vulnerable person to maintain their links within our community. This could involve phoning them on a regular basis; calling in for a chat; accompanying them to the shops or assisting them in those little tasks of daily living such as household paperwork or walking the dog or a bit of gardening. This won't involve personal care but things which help the person remain active in the local community.

Full training and support will be provided, and you will be making a real difference for someone in your community. Interested? Then either leave your contact details with reception at Much Wenlock or Cressage Medical Practice.

Calling all unpaid Carers An unpaid carer is a person of any age (adult or child) who provides unpaid support to a partner, family member, friend or neighbour who, without their help, would not be able to live at home or whose health and wellbeing would deteriorate without this help. This could be due to frailty, disability or a serious health condition, mental health issues or substance misuse.

The person being cared for would typically be in receipt of benefit for their disability / condition.

Unpaid carers are likely to be in receipt of carers allowance (or an underlying entitlement - such as carers premium or carers addition).

If you are an unpaid carer, please get in touch with the Practice and let us know as it is important that this information is documented for the patient you are caring for and helps to ensure records are kept up-to-date and accurate.

LOCAL ROTARIANS CONTRIBUTED TO PLANTING TREES & BULBS DESPITE THE WEATHER!

Rotarian Julian Hargreaves eagerly investigated the possibility of participating in the tree planting project to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. However, this failed to materialise due to delays in identifying the legal ownership of the land. 





LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR FEBRUARY

One of the most moving services I have ever attended took place on Ash Wednesday 2009, in Westminster Abbey. I was an ordinand, in training for ministry, and was on placement at the Abbey. As the choir sang the achingly beautiful setting of Psalm 51 "Miserere mei, Deus" (Have mercy on me, God) by Allegri, complete with perfectly piercing top C from the chorister given the solo that year, we all went forward.

The Dean said the solemn words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you will return," as he marked my forehead with the sign of the cross, using ashes from the previous year's palm crosses.

It was a new experience to me, as the imposition of ashes hadn't been part of the tradition I'd known up to then. I confess I was overwhelmed - by the depth of my human sinfulness, the depth of God's mercy, and the depth of the love of Christ in going to the cross for the sin of the world, including mine.

Far from being frightening, or leading me to despair, those words, "Remember you are dust, and to dust, you will return," seemed in that moment to be strangely comforting. They reminded me of words from Psalm 39, where the Psalmist says to God, "Show me, Lord, my life's end and the number of my days; let me know how fleeting my life is." We, humans, are frail and fragile creatures of the creator – a truth we don't always recognise or accept. To dwell on that truth during Lent, holding it together with the equal and opposite truth that we are, as the title of a book says, "**Beloved** Dust" seems to me a good spiritual discipline for these 40 days.

For by the grace of God in Christ, we are both fragile *and* strong, mortal *and* immortal. We are dust, and to dust, we will return, yes. But that's not the end of the story, for from dust we shall rise, clothed with life and immortality, to live with God eternally.

As we move through Lent together, I invite you to take time to meditate on these paradoxical truths: that we are creatures, limited, finite, and weak, *and* that we are held in the hands of an unlimited, infinite, and strong God; that our time in this life is brief, *and* that our time with God in the world to come is eternal; that we are as humans deeply flawed, *and* we are deeply loved – and that in the cross with which we are marked in baptism, and may be marked on Ash Wednesday, all of that comes together. *Archdeacon Fiona*

Dear Friends,

As I write this letter, rain splashes against my study window. I hear low rumbles moving along the roof above me, the musical accompaniment to each gust of wind. The dark night feels cold and unforgiving. January is sliding into February. The joys of Christmas and the New Year are fading memories, and the giddiness of Spring feels far away. We are in the heart of winter. We long for sunny days, lighter nights, and the sound of birdsong. But we wait. We must, for now, navigate the wilderness.

The people of God had their own time of navigating the wilderness. It was a time of searching, holding on to a hope that hadn't quite arrived, while longing for the safety and security they had left behind. The Promised Land lay ahead, but the people had to seek it out, find it, cling to its hope.

Jesus also journeyed through the wilderness. But, unlike the people of God who had Moses for their guide, Jesus was alone. He only had himself, his doubts, questions, and temptations for company. Our season of Lent follows this story. Like Jesus, we spend time searching. We ask questions of ourselves, our actions, and our intentions. We reflect, and we pray. We bring before God those things we would rather hide away. And as Jesus came through his own time in the wilderness, we fix our gaze on the promise that lies ahead. Light will drive out darkness. Truth will triumph over division. Hope will rise in place of fear. Life will conquer death. Winter will give way to Spring. Easter is coming.

Back to my study with the wind, rain and dark outside. My computer playlist has switched to what, in my opinion, is one of the most beautiful songs ever written. The words echo that hope in our hearts, for the Spring that is to come. I'm sure many of you will recognise them.

April, come she will When streams are ripe and swelled with rain May, she will stay Resting in my arms again June, she'll change her tune In restless walks she'll prowl the night July, she will fly And give no warning to her flight August, die she must The autumn winds blow chilly and cold September, I'll remember A love once new has now grown old



The Honeypot is very fortunate to have two weather watchers who are regular contributors to our magazine.


Claire Nicholson has been observing and recording the weather in Ticklerton for many years. Her monthly rainfall records are always shown on our back page. This month's entry looks back over the last twelve months and beyond.

The rainfall at Ticklerton in November 2022 was 162mm (the wettest month of the year) and in December was 65mm.

The driest month in 2022 was July with 33mm. The total for 2022 was 922mm.The average annual rainfall that I have recorded since 2011 is 868mm.Claire Nicholson.

She has recently amused herself by compiling a graph of rainfall last year, compared with the average over the last 12 years.

We thought you might be interested to see this and to make your own observations..



Our other weather watcher is **Peter Steggles.** He is a photographic weather watcher. He records the weather with his camera and sends the photographs on an almost daily basis to Central Weather [and The Honeypot]. Keep an eye out for his photographs on the TV weather reports!


