News from your local MP – Helen Whatley

There's been a lot of change in Westminster recently.

I know Rishi Sunak will be an outstanding Prime Minister. I worked with him in the Treasury and saw his grip of the economic challenges we face first hand. There is no one better to steer our economy through these difficult times. He showed during his time as Chancellor that he will always support the most vulnerable when times are tough, both with the furlough scheme and with the energy support package.

We now need to get on with the job. We must steady our economy and bring inflation under control. We need to transform our domestic energy network while standing with Ukraine against Putin. And we need to unblock our NHS as we go into winter. I was honoured to be appointed Minister of State in the Health Department at the end of October. Both of my parents were doctors, and fixing our healthcare system was the reason I first considered standing for Parliament.

As Minister of State for Social Care I've got straight to work on the challenges currently facing our care system – getting healthy people out of hospital and back into care where they belong, finding more people with the right skills to join the care workforce, and making sure residents' loved ones aren't prevented from visiting them. I'm also continuing to work hard as your local MP, and you can find an update on some of my local campaigns below.

Cost of living roundtables in Faversham and Maidstone

Everyone is being hit with the rising cost of living at the moment. But for some families, even doing everything right, it's becoming increasingly hard to make ends meet. That's why I hosted two roundtables recently, one in Maidstone and one in Faversham, to bring local organisations together to discuss how we can make sure support reaches those that need it.

With many people who have never needed financial support before now struggling it's not always easy to find out who they are. It's so important to reach out if you're struggling. The cost of standing up to Putin's war in Ukraine will not last forever, and in the meantime it's vital that support reaches those that need it

Campaigning for an Operation Brock Taskforce

People are fed up of the disruption caused by Operation Brock. This year alone has seen two long spells of the barrier being in place – causing misery to motorists and

businesses. That's why I've called for a new Taskforce to be set up to come up with long-term solutions that mean we don't need to turn the M20 into a giant lorry park each time there is disruption at the Channel Ports.

I got Kent MPs together with the Transport Secretary to discuss the idea, and we're now hoping to get the green light to go ahead. Getting Kent moving is crucial for unlocking our economic potential and improving our environment.

Getting local voices heard on Maidstone's local plan

Maidstone Borough Council's new Local Plan will determine the future of development in our community for the next decade. It's crucial that we get these important decisions right and that the views of local residents are heard by decision makers. I've written to the Planning Inspectorate to express these views directly to planning officers.

I've stressed that any new homes need to come with improvements to infrastructure – including a Leeds-Langley relief road to ease traffic problems in these villages. I've also made clear the huge concerns local residents have about the two proposed 'garden villages' at Lenham Heath and Lidsing.

Big boost for community transport funding

I know how tough it can be to get around in rural places like Faversham and Mid Kent. Driving isn't an option for everyone, and access to reliable public transport is so important to some people's lives; so they can get to work, go and see a doctor, or just simply go to the shops. It's no surprise then that some people were worried when they heard about KCC's plan to stop subsidising certain rural bus routes, and prioritise funding for the services people are using more often.

I, along with councillors like Shellina Prendergast, have been pressing KCC to consider local solutions to help these residents. It's great to hear that they're now going to increase Community Transport Grant Funding from £100,000 to £450,000, with a scheme opening to applications later this month.

Happy Christmas

Finally, I want to wish each and every one of you a very happy Christmas.

Times are tough right now, and I know that this isn't going to be an easy Christmas. But I'm so pleased that for the first time in three years we will have a proper Christmas – one with no restrictions, together with our family and communities.

And together, just as we did with the pandemic, we will get through these difficult times.

59 BUS NEWS

Nu-venture is making some changes to the 59 timetable, some of which affect Grafty Green.

During the closure of Ulcombe Hill for water main renewal work, the **services from Grafty Green to and from Maidstone Town Centre** are continuing to run **on Mondays and Wednesdays only** but the departure times have been tweaked to allow people a bit more time in Maidstone.

From Monday 12th December, the departure from Grafty Green will be at 09.37, arriving in Maidstone, King Street, at 10.33.

The return service from Maidstone, King Street (Stop L2, close to Greggs), will depart at **13.00**, due to arrive at Grafty Green at 13.52.



Please note that there will be no services from Grafty Green on the days between Christmas and New Year, the service resuming on Wednesday 4th January.

#### M01/11/22 Apologies

Apologies from Cllr Prendergast (Kent County Council) and Cllr Round (Maidstone Borough Council) were received and accepted.

RESOLVED: the Minutes of the meeting held on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2022 were taken as read, confirmed and signed as being an accurate record of the proceedings.

#### M05/11/22 Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) Report

Cllr Trzebinski reported that MBC's project to acquire 1,000 houses specifically for Maidstone residents was well on its way. MBC had run cost-of-living help sessions giving advice on saving money and claiming benefits and would be running a session in Headcorn after Christmas; details would be sent to the Parish Clerk for advertising as widely as possible. The Meadows planning enquiry had been adjourned.

#### M07/11/22 Local Policing/Community

Police/Crime Report: It was noted that the latest information was for September and 1 crime had been reported.

M08/11/22 Speedwatch: Cllr Kennaird reported that he was trying to encourage support for digital training. One volunteer was waiting for confirmation that non-digital training could be carried forward. The Chairman volunteered to undertake training if it would help to move the project forward.

#### M09/11/22 Water Leaks

The Chairman reported that South East Water appeared to have finally fixed the long-standing leak at the junction of Woodcock Lane and Church Road.

#### M10/11/22 59 Bus

The Chairman stated that members of Kent County Council had voted on 20<sup>th</sup> October to support the proposed cuts to the bus subsidy on a number of routes which included the 59 service. He invited Mr John Collins, the Parish Council's representative on the East of Maidstone Transport Group, to comment. Mr Collins reported that he had discussed the service with the operator, Nu-Venture. One option going forward would be for the Parishes along the route to work together to apply for grants and fund the service on a couple of days per week. It was noted that Nu-Venture provided a very reliable service; and that passenger numbers had increased since the temporary service, introduced due to the closure of Ulcombe Hill, had run into Maidstone town centre. Cllr Trzebinski offered to move forward with the other Parishes and liaise with Cllr Prendergast.

The Chairman thanked Mr Collins for all his work on behalf of the community with the East of Maidstone Transport Group.

#### M11/11/22 Highways Improvement Plan

There were no changes to be made.

#### M12/11/22 Footpaths and Grafty Green Stile Replacement

The Parish Council discussed the replacement of three stiles along public right of way KH427. Kent County Council had offered to supply three gates free of charge but had informed the Parish Council that one stile was not positioned on the actual right of way, which complicated plans for its replacement.

RESOLVED: to go ahead with replacement of two stiles positioned on the public right of way; and to defer replacement of the third.

RESOLVED: to try to obtain three quotations for the installation of the two gates.

#### M13/11/22 Councillor Reports on any External Meetings

Cllr Turner reported that he, the Chairman and the Clerk had visited NatWest Bank in Maidstone to transfer both account balances to the newly-opened Lloyds Bank current account.

Cllr Eastwood had attended a meeting organised by Broomfield and Kingswood Parish Council to address the matter of road closures.



These mince filled gingerbread cases, topped with mini gingerbread men combine two great Christmas flavours together.

## **GINGERBREAD MINCE PIES**

## For the filling

400g of mincemeat 50g of stem ginger finely chopped, plus 1 tablespoon of ginger syrup from a jar

## For the pastry

250g of plain flour plus extra for dusting <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon of ground cinnamon <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon of ground ginger 25g of cold unsalted butter cut into small pieces 3 tablespoons of golden caster sugar, plus extra for sprinkling 1 egg, beaten

You'll also need 8cm round biscuit cutter. mini gingerbread person biscuit cutter

**1.** For the pastry, tip the flour, spices and butter into a large bowl with a large pinch of salt. Rub together with your fingertips until the mix resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar. Add the egg and use a cutlery knife to mix everything until the ingredients start to clump together. Tip out onto a lightly floured work surface and knead briefly until you have a smooth dough. Or, pulse the ingredients together in a food processor. Shape into a disc, then wrap and chill for at least 30 mins.

**2**. Heat the oven to 190C/170C fan. Mix the mincemeat with the ginger and syrup. Roll the pastry out on a lightly floured surface to a 3mm thickness. Stamp out 12 discs using an 8cm biscuit cutter and lightly press into a 12-hole cupcake tin.

**3**. Fill each pastry case with 1 tablespoon of the mincemeat mixture. Re-roll the pastry scraps and stamp out 12 mini gingerbread people, then place one on top of each pie.

**4**. Bake for 20 minutes. Leave to cool in the tin for 5 minutes, then lift out onto a wire rack to cool completely. Dust with icing sugar. Will keep in an airtight container for up to four days.

## Anniversary

My anniversary this month is 22<sup>nd</sup> December, the birth date of Giacomo Puccini (22 December 1858 – 29 November 1924). He was an Italian composer known primarily



for his operas. Regarded as the greatest proponent of Italian opera after Verdi, he was descended from a long line of composers, stemming from the late-Baroque era. Though his early work was rooted in traditional late-19th-century Romantic Italian opera he later developed his work in the realistic verismo style, of which he became one of the leading exponents. His most renowned works are La Bohème (1896), Tosca (1900), Madama Butterfly (1904), and Turandot (1924), all of which are among the most frequently performed and recorded of all operas.
