Dear friends.

Day-off: Monday

You will have guessed from previous letters in this magazine that I love looking at nature for inspiration. I write about it a lot, and not just because there is so much of it around us here in South Shropshire. We can learn from nature. It teaches us about God and ourselves.

For the Church, this is nothing new. Not only have some of the wisest Mothers and Fathers in Christian history observed the patterns of God in the natural world (St. Francis of Assisi comes to mind!), but Jesus himself often used the natural world to illustrate God's love for us. There is a particularly beautiful passage in the Bible where Jesus asks his listeners to observe the 'birds of the air and the lilies of the field' (See Matthew 6. 25-34). Here Jesus uses the patterns of nature to explain how God cares for us in the way He cares for creation as a whole. Sometimes Jesus uses the patterns of the Agricultural Year to tell teaching stories known as 'parables.' The 'Parable of the Sower' (See Luke 8.4-15) is a good example, as Jesus uses the fate of seeds fallen in different places to explain the different ways God's word and love can be received in our hearts.

We can learn about God as we observe the natural world.

So, what are we observing at the moment? I sometimes think of May as a 'rushing' month, where so much springs to life so quickly. Bluebells appear, and they appear quickly. 'Forget-me-nots' burst into life, almost overnight! The month of May feels like the time for nature to go 'pop!'. And, just like the relationship between Easter and early Spring, it seems fitting for the Church's festival of Pentecost on 23rd May to coincide with the time where nature rushes into life. It's fitting, because Pentecost helps us to remember another time of rushing: the outpouring of God's Holy Spirit. The Bible uses words like 'Wind' and 'Fire' to describe this moment - this assurance of God's presence, peace, and creative energy in our lives. (See Acts 2. 1-13). The Spirit came upon the disciples at Pentecost, and then through The Spirit and by The Spirit they built the Church, spread God's message of love made known in Jesus Christ, and served others (See the rest of the book of Acts to read more of what happened next!).

Yet, importantly, this is the same Spirit through which God created all things (See Genesis 1. 1-3) and keeps creating. It is therefore appropriate to contemplate The Spirit in a month where so much creation is bursting into life! Moreover, we recognise that this same Life dwells in all of us – guiding, inspiring, and empowering us to be disciples of Jesus in the world, and agents of God's creation.

How important, how vital, therefore, it is that we safeguard God's creation for generations to come.

May The Holy Spirit bless you, and dwell in your hearts,

EATON UNDER HEYWOOD & HOPE BOWDLER PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The draft Minutes of the parish council's meeting on 15th March 2021 are available to view on the parish council's website.

The date for nominations for prospective parish councillors closed on the 8th April and on the 9th April we were informed that of the seven places on our parish council, only six candidates had come forward to fill them, so the six candidates are automatically elected and no actual election will take place in our parish on the 6th May 2021. Those thus nominated to serve on the parish council for the next four years are Graham Watts, Peter Jenkins, Steve Jones, Tony Madeley, Colin Pugh and Bruce Orme. We will be able to co-opt an additional councillor at or after our meeting on the 17th of May 2021.

As the law currently stands, Zoom meetings will cease after the 5th of May 2021 and parish councils will revert to open meetings in village halls. We believe therefore our 17th May meetings - Annual Parish Meeting, Annual General Meeting and an ordinary business meeting - will take place from 7.30pm in Hope Bowdler Village Hall. Everyone attending will be required to wear a face mask, sanitize their hands on arrival and observe social distancing throughout the meeting.

We also use the SMS text messaging service to communicate with our patients on an individual leve. 



LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR May 2021

Pentecost or more traditionally Whitsun is I think the Cinderella of Christian festivals, it has never really had the impact of Christmas and Easter. It doesn't have the same traditions or social events around it which make it stand out in the wider culture either. I think increasingly the church doesn't really know how to mark the occasion and even the recent 'Thy Kingdom Come' prayer campaign which has actually taken off across the churches in recent years doesn't really make much of Pentecost itself. Yet Pentecost is perhaps one of the most exciting of the church festivals for it marks the moment when God started the church! It is in effect the Church's birthday, the day that God sent the Holy Spirit to inspire and empower ordinary Christians to do extraordinary things for Him.

The Holy Spirit is given freely to all of us as a free gift from God. Jesus promised his disciples that we would receive this gift so that we might know his presence with us as we live out our faith on a daily basis.

"And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another comforter to help you and be with you forever— the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you..." - John 14:15-16

The problem is when most of us think of comfort we think of the luxuries of life, or being wrapped up in a warm blanket or duvet. We also think of comfort as something that consoles us when we are upset or in need. Whilst all these things are true the word used in the New Testament has a completely different meaning to those we might expect. The word comfort is the same word that we find in relation to prodding, strengthening or stirring into action. The Bayeux Tapestry has a wonderful panel of Bishop Odo, forcing his men into battle, at the end of his battle club, with the abbreviated Latin words: which when translated means: "Here, Bishop Odo, comforts his troops." As individuals we might not find such 'comfort' comforting but the Holy Spirit is given to equip and spur us into action! In fact, the word comfort has traditionally also meant to give or add strength to someone or to encourage, urge or exhort. When we see the coming of the Holy Spirit in that way it makes much more sense of both Jesus' words and what we see in the book of Acts as the early church begins to emerge.

The Holy Spirit also empowers us to be the people God created and knows us to be, in that sense the Holy Spirit fills us with God's wisdom and power for the tasks which he has called us to. On the day of Pentecost it is the Holy Spirit that takes the group of timid and bewildered disciples and equips them to declare the gospel message. Jesus before his Ascension had promised them that they would receive the Holy Spirit to equip them as His witnesses throughout

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."- Acts 1:8

This power that comes with the Holy Spirit is very real and is available to us just as it was to the first disciples. It is power to live our lives as God intended, power to encourage us and to strengthen us for acts of service. It is not to make us feel better, or for our own benefit but it is the power to build one another up and to inspire the Church. So as Pentecost approaches perhaps we need to re-evaluate this slightly misunderstood Christian Festival and celebrate the birthday of the church with a bit more style and flair! Our prayer certainly needs to be 'Come Holy Spirit!' May the Spirit, who set the Church on fire upon the Day of Pentecost, bring the world alive with the love of the risen Christ. Amen.




NOTICE OF ELECTION

The Honeypot Book Reviews

"The Day Of The Triffids" by John Wyndham

Some may be aware that this book was the basis for a 1962 film and that the author also penned The Midwich Cuckoos which was filmed as The Village of the Damned. Several of the author's books are still readily available via second hand book stores and from Penguin.



Wyndham, as a science fiction writer, was renowned for his post-apocalyptic views of society following cataclysmic events. The triffids are developed as a new source of high quality vegetable oil and farmed on an enormous scale. They have unusual features including an ability to uproot and shuffle long distances; they seem to communicate and congregate with one another; they can inflict fatal stings with a 10 foot long stinger with disconcerting accuracy – often hitting the face or hands to deliver a fatal dose of poison.

The book follows the endeavours of Bill and Josella to establish a new life in the countryside having lived in London which, like most cities and towns, has been abandoned. It is a disturbing book and while the author will have been influenced by events in the Second World War like many enduring "classic" books it has a salient message for today. How can society accommodate a new and persistent change or threat in circumstances, for example, where a lethal plant can linger around every corner? While the main characters try to establish a new social order, where most of the population is blind, there remains the lingering fear that one day the triffids will break through the protective fences that surround the homes and small holdings, that help to keep small groups safe.

The book is a relatively short and compelling read; it shows why some older titles should stay in print.

Cut the birds at the wrist end to shape into a tummy(see picture).


Colour a small paper plate with a green wax crayon and, looking at the picture, stick your paper hands onto it.


