

Aldborough & Thurgarton Parish Emergency Planning

The BT outage has again highlighted the dependence that villages like ours have on power and digital services.

While we would like to think that we are a relatively close community and neighbours generally look out for each other it is important that we ensure that people that need some help and support during these difficult times are able to access it.

The Surgery, for understandable reasons are unable to release patient data and there are Data Protection implications for any personal data release and storage. However, we should look at how those issues can be respected yet still have information that enables us to offer support to those who need it.

The Parish Council, together with the Community Centre (incorporating Village Care) would like to provide that support within the community during these extended periods of services failures so, on a voluntary basis, if you consider yourself or members of your family might need help or just someone to check on you, please leave your name, address and contact details with the Parish Clerk at aldboroughandthurgartonclerk@gmail.com or in a sealed envelope at the Community Centre. There will be a postage box in the entrance area during the month of November.

By voluntarily giving the information we believe we can meet the Data Protection issues and information would be stored securely and only shared with Emergency volunteers on a need to know basis.

Greener Aldborough & Thurgarton

We are an informal group of volunteers who look after the area around and including the pond to improve the habitat for wildlife and promote the well-being of our human inhabitants! Thank you to those volunteers who have got involved with meadow cutting and baling, planting bulbs and generally helping to preserve this important area for wildlie Throughout the summer, many villagers and visitors have enjoyed seeing the moorhens with their broods and the abundance of wildflowers and insects. We can't change the world but we can try to protect and look after this small area of Aldborough which is so important for nature.

The reed growing in the pond has recently been reduced and approximately 550 spring bulbs have been planted in the area around the cherry tree together with both perennial and annual wildflower seeds. Alongside the pond, the tree which now shows little sign of life will remain to provide a 'hibernaculum' (overwintering place for newts and amphibians). Following advice about future planting we will introduce several small native fruit/nut trees such as crabapple and hazel, in the area of long grass behind the goal. These would absorb 'run off' from the Green and provide flower, fruit and shade for both wildlife and people. Any planting of this nature would need to be approved by the Parish Council and the idea would be to seek Grant funding for the cost.
