From the Vicar

Dear friends,

I hope that you are well and enjoying the summer? I must admit to finding it a little hot at times, particularly when wearing my clerical vestments or robes, in a crowded church.

This weekend, I've had the joy and privilege of conducting both a wedding and a baptism around the Benefice, as well as our normal Sunday services. In the rather peculiar language of the Church, we refer to baptisms, weddings and funerals as 'occasional offices,' in contrast to the regular services we conduct on Sundays. It's a huge privilege to be able to conduct occasional offices, marking these significant points in the lives of individuals, couples, families and, frequently, the wider community. Weddings and baptisms are, generally, joyful occasions, and it's wonderful to walk alongside couples and families as they make their wedding vows, or baptismal promises, in the presence of God, and their families and friends. While much sadder and more solemn occasions, helping people to say farewell to their loved ones, and commending and committing those who have died into God's loving care, is also an immense privilege. Even if you don't attend church regularly, and are unsure about your religious beliefs, if you live in Cuddesdon, Denton or Chippinghurst, then All Saints' is your church. You are welcome to pop in when it is open: to worship with us, to enjoy the history and peaceful atmosphere or - in this hot weather - just to enjoy the cool interior.

We will shortly be launching a 'Friends of All Saints', Cuddesdon,' so that those who love our church, or appreciate its history, atmosphere, spirituality and place at the heart of our village, can develop their link with the church and show their support. For many, this may mean financial support, though we recognise that this will not be possible for all, in the current financial climate. But if you care about All Saints', and would like to help ensure it is available for weddings, baptisms and funerals, and regular Sunday worship, for generations to come, please do consider becoming a 'Friend.' (Watch out for further information soon).

I would also like to take this opportunity to draw your attention to the Pet Blessing service we are holding on Saturday 15th July, at 2pm. All are welcome. If you fear your pet might be at risk, please keep it in a cage or safe container, or leave your pet at home and bring a photograph. Similarly, if you have a reactive dog, or one who might eat smaller pets, please either keep it on a lead, or leave it at home and bring a photograph. There should be sufficient space to give nervous pets some space. It would be helpful if you could let me know in advance if you wish to bring a horse, cow or more unusual animal that might not easily fit inside church – but farmyard animals, reptiles, and ‘unusual’ pets are all most welcome.

Do come along and meet up with friends. We would love to welcome new members especially anyone new to the village.



Sit to Stand

Being able to stand up from a chair is something that we take for granted until we can no longer do it. The action itself is a good exercise not only for the lower body but also for maintaining or improving balance.

To start, move the bottom forward to the forward edge of the seat and bring the feet back towards the front edge of the seat's legs. Keep the feet shoulders width apart and lean from the hips so that the shoulders are over the toes. Push through the feet extending the knees and hips until you are stood upright. To sit down is the reverse.



To make this easier use your hands and arms to help push up. There are lots of ways to make it more challenging. Have the feet closer together will challenge your balance more. Having one foot in front of the other will target the rear most leg and make it do more work. Slowing the speed down, especially on the sitting down will work on endurance. Doing repetitively but only allowing the bottom to lightly come in contact with the seat before standing up again will also work on endurance. Doing with eyes closed will work on balance. And doing from a low height will work on strength through an unusual range.

As I said at the start this is an exercise that we take for granted until we cannot do it. To help you keep doing it without thinking, try doing it 10 times taking 2-3 seconds to go up and 2-3 seconds down without fully relaxing into the seat with your right foot in front of your left and then 10 more with your left foot in front of your right. As with all exercise make sure you warm up before and stretch after and do it in a safe environment. Good luck! **Nige.**

Parish Council

The search for replacement parish councillors continues. In summary, four people were elected as councillors unopposed in May's election. The Parish Council co-opted three more to bring the Council up to strength. Some people expressed concern about the co-options. Three councillors resigned in June. This meant that, if ten electors wanted it, the three new vacancies would be filled by having an election. By the time you read this the closing date for calling an election will have passed.

So, there will either be an election or the three vacancies will be filled by co-option. There is no parish council meeting in August so, if co-option happens, it is scheduled to take place at September's meeting. If you are interested then this is another chance for you to become a councillor. Please let me know in writing at cuddesdon.dentonpc@gmail.com by 29th August if you want to be considered for co-option.

The Parish Council would like to thank the three resigning councillors, David Keene, Paddy McGuinness and Richard Palmer, for all the hard work they have given over the years.

Natta have sold the tithe Barn at Dove House. The new owner intends to redesign the plans for the building, based on the design of the first planning application, which was for only one dwelling. They hope to start building work before the end of the year. The green fencing is going to remain in place around the site for the foreseeable future, for reasons of safety and security.

A tree has been planted near the bus stop at the end of Parkside. This is part of an initiative by the County Council, who have planted a tree in every village in the county.

A while ago we asked for wheelie bins and kitchen waste bins to be removed from the curb side after the refuse collectors have been. Can we appeal again for this to be done. Some of the residents of Field Lane seem to be particularly bad at taking their bins home.

We have also asked on several occasions for dog owners to clear

up after their pets but there are still some areas where dog mess is left. Please take it away.

The planning application for a garden room at The Forge (P23/S0679/HH) has been granted.

Over the past 58 years, the Oxfordshire Historic Churches Trust has given £3.5million for the renovation of many of Oxfordshire's 650 church buildings. Last year continued to be difficult, with COVID-19 still having an impact on the Annual Sponsored Ride+Stride for Churches. Even so, the event took place and Oxfordshire's Riders+Striders raised a little under £84,000, an extraordinary amount given the prevailing conditions, and a significant contribution to the Grants that the Trust are able to award. Our own cyclists (including some from our very own Cycling Club, OX10 CC), walkers and sponsors raised a splendid £635!

The Ride+Stride Organisers continue to prepare for this year's Ride+Stride on Saturday 9 September 2023. If for any reason you are unable to participate on that day, your Ride+Stride can be done any day, anywhere! Most of the churches normally involved intend to participate, although some might offer a self-sign service rather than a fully-manned service and others might not offer refreshments or toilets. The List of Churches Welcoming Riders+Striders, together with the latest posts, is available on the Trust's website, www.ohct.org.uk. This website allows Riders+Striders to register on-line and access downloadable copies of the literature, including route planners, sponsorship forms and details of the 2023 website for collecting sponsorship monies.



John Howell MP writes... June 2023

In a month when the temperatures are rising, and many people are getting out and about more to enjoy the countryside it is good to see some recent announcements that will benefit the countryside and also support our farmers. Of course, this is not to suggest that these issues are of concern all year around!

In the middle of May the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) announced new funding for farmers and landowners to support projects to create new habitats for wildlife, help protected sites and boost efforts to reach net zero. It builds on the success of the first round of the scheme announced last year and will help with work to protect and enhance landscapes. It will deliver environmental benefits while also supporting farmers.

Also announced last month was a commitment to protect the interests of our farmers in future trade deals. I know that this has been a concern within the constituency and am delighted that the Prime Minister has brought together representatives from the whole food supply chain for the 'UK Farm to Fork Summit.' This will include representations from the UK's farming, horticulture and agri-food sectors and is welcomed by the NFU.

Then at the beginning of this month DEFRA launched another initiative with the publication of 'Unleashing Rural Opportunity.' This is a policy paper setting out plans to grow the rural economy and communities. It involves some key planning proposals which will involve consultation in the near future. Details of this are yet to be published. I hope that anyone with an interest in the growth of our rural communities will take an interest in this paper which can be found on the GOV.UK website by searching the title of the document.

Perhaps with a focus on the rural economy it is worth also mentioning the Procurement Bill which has its final reading in the House in this week that I write. The Bill was introduced last year and, among other things, seeks to bring forward more effective Government procurement and to help smaller businesses (SMEs) win a greater share of government expenditure. I know from correspondence with constituents in business that some of the former complexities of the government procurement process has effectively ruled them out. I am pleased that this has been worked on to create easier access.

Ready, Set, Read!


