The **Village Hall AGM** was held recently. No new volunteers came forward to join the management committee, which is a shame, but the existing stalwarts all agreed to serve for another year and so the committee continues to comprise myself, Carol Hulm (Secretary), Robert Turner (Treasurer), Sue Burch, Liz Burgess, Stefi Graziola, Sandra Pilborough, Jacky Simmons, Jacqui Thompson and John & Angela Thompson.

Our finances are in good shape, thanks to the efforts of this team in organising social events like last year's 'Animal Antics' and the Mexican Fiesta, and fund-raisers like 'Phil The Bag'. Hall lettings also contribute very significantly to our income, and letting income was up marginally last year, following a small increase in the hourly charge a year ago. The rate will be reviewed again at our next AGM but presently remains at just \pounds 7.50 an hour for local residents and regular hirers. Do consider hiring the Hall for your own private parties or commercial events, as it will help to sustain us. Carol Hulm is the contact for bookings. Looking ahead, I must offer a huge 'thank you' to the several people who have now come forward to help the committee with this year's **fete**, which will be held on **2 September** and which will have a medieval theme. Grafty Gourmet

This is a great dish and only takes about 20 minutes to prepare. Serve with vegetables and potatoes of your choice, or simply with rice. Either way, it's a great tasting and simple dish for 3 to 4 people.

Roast Marmalade Duck

2 x 2kg (4lb) of duck 450g of thick cut marmalade 12 kumquats (Chinese oranges), halved lengthways (4 normal oranges can be used instead, each cut into 6 segments) 200ml of fresh orange juice 250ml of chicken stock 2 tea spoons of brown sugar

1. Heat the oven to 180°C. Wipe the ducks and prick all over with a sharp knife (pierce the skin but not the flesh underneath). Roast the ducks on a rack in a large roasting tin, breast-side down for 40 minutes (make sure they don't touch each other).

2. Remove the ducks from the tin and pour the fat into a bowl. Return the ducks to the rack, breast-side up, and spread each breast with some of the marmalade, giving the duck a good coating (you may need to warm it slightly to make it spreadable). Return to the oven and cook for a further 40 minutes. Cover with foil if the marmalade is catching and burning - it should be a dark golden colour with the odd bit of peel slightly blackened.

3. Meanwhile, make a sauce by bringing the remaining marmalade, halved kumquats, orange juice, stock and sugar to the boil in a small saucepan. Simmer for 10 minutes, then pour over the ducks before serving.

Minutes of Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council on Monday 8th May 2017, 7.45pm in Grafty Green Village Hall

Present: Clirs R Turner (Chair); A Allum; R Galton; T King; J Collins Clerk Mr Chris Hume

In attendance: Clirs Shellina Prendergast and Martin Round(MBC)

Two members of the public

Clir Turner opened meeting and congratulated and welcomed Clir Shellina Prendergast, newly elected to KCC.

- 1. Anybody filming or recording this meeting to declare it: No declarations made.
- 2. Apologies to receive and accept apologies for absence Chris Wheal, John Boyd
- Robert Turner was elected as Chairman of Boughton Malherbe Parish Council for 2017/18 Clerk to arrange for the Chairman to sign the Declaration of Acceptance of Office
- Ron Galton was elected as Vice Chairman of Boughton Malherbe Parish Council for 2017/18 Clerk to arrange for the Vice Chairman to sign the Declaration of Acceptance of Office

5. Declarations:

Any lobbying - none Any interest in items on the Agenda - none Any changes to the register of pecuniary interests - none

6. The minutes of the meetings held on the 6th March 2017 and 20th March 2017 were approved. Mike Hitchins pointed out that the minutes of the meeting on the 20th March are not on the website – Clerk to arrange this

7. Public session

Maidstone Borough Council - Clir Shellina Prendergast (MBC) drew the council's attention to the consultation on rail services and the rail franchise. It was agreed that Clir J Collins would draft a response to the consultation and circulate this to other members. The Clerk will then submit the response. Shellina agreed to send, via the Clerk, a copy of the Headcorn publicity on the proposed timetable changes for the council to consider replicating.

Cllr Martin Road briefed the meeting on two issues: firstly, the local plan which is nearly complete. Secondly, potential mergers of councils which could have implications for Boughton Malherbe which need to be monitored.

Members of the Public

Mike Hitchins asked if the council had any plans to use the reserves comprising the legacy left to the parish. Cllr Turner outlined some of the potential ideas but explained that due to their commercial sensitivity it was not possible to place these in the public domain just yet. Cllr Turner thanked Mike for raising the issue and assured him that as soon as it was possible there will be public consultation and that the council will continue to actively seek appropriate use for these funds.

Mike Davidson drew the council's attention to increasing speeds from vehicles on Liverton Hill and an accident involving a cyclist last week.

8. Annual Reviews

Clir Galton presented a short note outlining proposed procedural changes which had been circulated earlier in the day. Following discussion, it was agreed that:

(a) The following pre-amble will be inserted ahead of the list of "portfolio holders" agreed at the meeting on the 20th March 2017:







Christian Message June 2017

The world seems very dark. Homeless men and women sleep on our streets; literally millions have died in the Middle East in the last few years; thousands risk their lives in the Mediterranean Sea hoping to find safety in Europe while still others spend years in refugee camps.

A dark world in which Christians cling on to their belief that God sent his Son into the world to dispel the darkness.

The Bible study group of which I am a members has discovered much which is heartening by studying a Lent course prepared by EMBRACE the Middle East. EMBRACE was formerly known as Bible Lands Society and uses its funds to alleviate suffering in Egypt, Israel, Palestine, Lebanon and Syria.

Here are just some examples of the way money given to them is used to bring light into the darkness of many lives. We learned , for example about the Zabaleen people in Cairo. Their name means 'Garbage people.' They sort the rubbish on the city's refuge dumps and attempt to sell it. Many build flimsy shelters from the material found on the dumps. Inevitably their living conditions are insanitary and dangerous. The Salaam Centre is a place of safety for women. Sisters from a nearby convent live alongside them and give counselling. A Zabaleen woman said: *I get support from the centre. My husband can get help to overcome his addiction. I know there is a way for healing; I can now get food, find a job and know that I have rights.*

Christians in Lebanon are funded by EMBRACE to help refugees from Syria. 13 year old Tariq has been helped. Back home in Syria his family sold falafel, humus and other delicacies to restaurants. The war came and he was nearly killed making a delivery. His family fled to Lebanon and he is now able to study at the EMBRACE supported education centre.

Nahla was diagnosed with a brain development disorder when she was 7. Now 20 her needs are complex. She is being helped by speech and movement therapy at the Zvartontz Centre in Beirut. She has discovered a talent for embroidery. Government funding is limited so EMBRACE is funding 10 Syrian refugees.

We learned this and much more from this course and were reminded that, '**the light** shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it.' (John 1:5).

The light of Christ will continue to shine in the dark places of the world as long as Christians continue to obey the teaching of their Lord by their actions as well as words.
