Building Development

Many of you will be aware that SMBC have a significant shortfall of new houses in the Borough and have therefore had to revise their Local Plan, which runs until 2028. This is due to be finalised in 2019. This, together with a central government stance that greenbelt land should be used more often for new housing, means our

land owners and developers will probably already be putting together proposals for housing development in our parish. Many of our neighbours like Balsall Common, Berkswell, Knowle, Dorridge and Bentley Heath are putting together what are called, Neighbourhood Development Plans (NDP). These NDPs put forward the views of residents specifically about housing development in their locality, in our case our Parish. If acceptable, SMBC adopt the NDP into their Local Plan and it is used by the planning officers and committee considering proposals when developers. It does not guarantee that we will not be adversely affected by housing, but it really does help. Problem is, it takes a lot of resource to put together a NDP, that is both money and manpower and the Parish Council does not have it. We can apply for grants for the former, the latter needs your support. We need residents to come forward and volunteer to be actively involved in the working party.
