Wye PPG - NHS Changes

YOUR SERVICES, YOUR FUTURE' HEALTH INFORMATION DAY FRIDAY 25 OCTOBER 2019,

LARGE VILLAGE HALL WYE 10 am -3.00pm

n June 18 last year Wye Surgery PPG held a Health and Information Day as part of National Patient Participation Awareness Week. The event received positive feedback from the many members of the public attending, with requests to organise a further day in due course.

We are aware that there are intense discussions and consultations taking place about the future delivery of services and the need to deploy limited human and financial resources in the most effective way possible, both for those who use and those who provide services. However, there are all too few opportunities to receive accurate information about what is being planned and to participate in constructive discussion. Nor is there any comprehensive route map, which can help negotiate the system. At times this can be at best bewildering and at worst distressing, especially when you

are feeling vulnerable through illness or disability.

The focus of the day will be the proposed changes and the future operation of the new Ashford Stour Primary Care Network of which Wye Surgery will be a part. There will be a series of presentations including input from a Wye Surgery clinician and a question and answer session.

In the afternoon we will broaden the focus a little to look at modern challenges to health and wellbeing in a rapidly changing landscape. Presentations will include a Neighbourhood Watch film and a Kent Crime Prevention Officer will advise on how to avoid the anxiety of increasingly sophisticated scams and cyber crime.

There will also be Information Stands and representatives from some of the health and welfare related East Kent organisations, of which many of us are unaware until we need them and maybe not even then. Information about



e are delighted to announce that our Hastingleigh and Elmsted deaf charity is 70 years old. It was established in 1949 by Miss Mary Harwood and Miss Phyllis Graham. Originally there were many branches of The Guild but over time branches have closed or changed name, we believe that ours is the only Guild still operating.

Obviously as a deaf charity, it is people that have hearing impairments that we help: to promote treatment, education, training and welfare to those living in the East Kent area.

Over the last 70 years we must have helped hundreds of people in East Kent and that has only been possible by the continued support from the community of Hastingleigh and Elmsted and beyond – so a big thank you to the community past and present.

You may be wondering about the charity name – well originally we were called 'The Hastingleigh and Elmsted Branch of the Canterbury Diocesan Association for the Deaf', but that was a bit long-winded so ended up being called 'The Guild of St John of Beverley for the Deaf' (St John was the Archbishop of York in the 7th century and was known to be a healer and stood out in deaf history). We have considered changing the charity name but it would be a shame to be the last Guild and change our name.

Hastingleigh Parish Council Superfast Broadband Update

he subject of Superfast Fibre The subject of Superfast Fibre

Broadband provision in our area was optimistic that fibre broadband was brought up at the Annual Parish Meeting in May. We contacted Kent County Council (KCC) to discuss the Government's Rural Gigabit Connectivity programme (ie Superfast Broad- information: band).

Businesses and residents in some of the hardest-to-reach places (which we are) in the UK are eligible for additional funding towards the cost of installing gigabit-capable broadband to their premises when part of a group project. Rural premises with broadband speeds of less than 30Mbps can use vouchers worth up to £3,500 for each small and medium -sized businesses (SMEs), and up to £1,500 per residential premise to support the cost of installing new gigabit-capable connections. KCC are likely to launch an additional Voucher scheme in September.

Group projects are when two or more residents and/or SMEs get together to combine their vouchers towards the shared cost of installation. Single connections are not eligible for additional funding.

Our initial discussion with KCC to premises in most of our immediate area is feasible if we all work together.

Farming Notebook

ell, harvest started promisingly...

Whilst the country basked in some of the hottest temperatures on record the combine began to bring in the Oilseed Rape, Winter Barley and herbage seed. All dry, or nearly, and in good condition. The dilemma then was whether or not to start the wheat. Still 18% moisture-4% above that for ideal storage-and with the straw quite green. Not really ripe. Past experience and wise words from another farmer stating "better 18% at the beginning of August than 18% at the end of September..." encouraged us to press on. The second year wheat came off very well, and that was followed by some first vear wheat. Then the weather changed... I have just driven past some very sorry looking wheat. Wet through as another squally shower passes through. The forecast for the next few days is terrible. Rain front after rain front sweeping across the coun-

try. I am very conscious that up to now we have been very lucky. Those further north and west have had a torrid time. Who would be a farmer??

We were tempted out last evening and cut two trailer loads of wheat which was far too wet at 21%. We will have to be patient and wait for the weather to change. At least it will give me time to dry the soggy heap that sits on the grain store floor.

It is supposed to be summer, but I feel it more appropriate to start looking for the Christmas decorations than the BBQ!

Talking of BBQs makes me think of succulent home produced beef burgers. Once cooked, with a little added cheese, placed in a bun, what could be better? Sadly we are bombarded by the media to believe that beef and dairy are very bad for the planet. I become increasingly frustrated that the banner headline is not debated or discussed. It is a statement. It is simplistic at best and biased at worst.

Why have cattle hit the headlines? Cattle produce methane a greenhouse gas and thus a contributor to Global temperature rise. However, methane is a gas

that degrades quite quickly in the atmosphere, unlike Carbon Dioxide which remains there. In Britain, if the number of cattle had remained the same since pre industrial times-before global warming- there would have been a status quo in methane in the atmosphere. But numbers have not remained the same, they have declined. Between 1984 and 2017 the UK cattle herd reduced by 25%. And as such have no global warming impact. Even globally there has not been any increase in cattle numbers. If methane levels have risen in the atmosphere then the blame cannot be put on cattle.

"Beef and dairy are bad", therefore it would be much better to grow crops on the land instead of use it for livestock production. Has no one looked at the most beautiful parts of our green and pleasant land and seen how steep the hills are? How small the fields are within the dry stone walls? It is grazing livestock that have made our countryside and they are there because other

OK, then plant trees on it... Trees sequester, or lock up, atmospheric carbon so that is good... All green plants photosynthesise and trap carbon using the energy from the sun. Trees photosynthesise in their leaves, an do so during every daylight hour. Trees have leaves for about 5 months of the year. Grass is green and photosynthesises all vear round.

Grass is a very efficient, environmentally friendly way to offset our carbon emissions. Two thirds of UK farmland is grass and most could not be used for other crops. The best way to manage this resource and convert it into food is to feed it to cattle, which are capable of deriving all of their nutritional needs from it.

Now, not all beef is equal. While free range, grass fed beef is good for the environment and is part of sustainable production cycle, the same cannot be said for the intensive beef lots such as those found in the USA. In such systems, the cattle are fed on sova and cereals. This is a highly inefficient use of a food resource which could be used for human consumption. Consumers can

choose. A few minutes reading the label will allow the free range, grass fed, sustainable, British beef to be the product of choice.

Now we come to dairy...
We are mammals. We are designed to drink milk. Milk provides all the vitamins, minerals, proteins and fats that we require, especially when we are young.

There is a trend now, brought about by the media banner of "dairy is bad" to go for milk substitutes. Soy milk and Almond milk to name but two. On the one side, we have a cow that eats grass and produces milk. Simple. On the other side we have synthetic "milk". Soya does not have the highest environmental credentials. 90% of the crop in the USA is GM, and in South America it is one of the main drivers for deforestation. Sova is toxic to all animals until it is cooked. Cooking requires energy, which in turn releases carbon into the atmosphere. It is then manufactured into "milk"

by adding the essential vitamins and minerals lacking in the plant. The main regions for growing soya are the USA, Brazil and Australia. Not exactly on our doorstep. Food miles are not impressive!

Almonds are mainly grown in California. They use a massive 5.5 litres of water per nut. California has been in drought since 2011. Between 2007 and 2014 the amount of water used to irrigate almonds has risen by 27%. In a state with a population of 39.6 million, the 6000 almond growers consume 10% of all the available water! Aquifers are being drained at an alarming rate. Hardly environmentally friendly or sustainable. Again, the food miles are not insignificant.

We have access to whole cows milk from the Milkmate vending machine at Ottinge Farm Lyminge where the milk is made from grass by a cow and has 8 food miles (There and back...). You decide...

Oh, and as I know to my cost, the grass is only watered by natural rainfall!
