The Hall management Committee held its AGM on 16 May and, in the absence of anyone new putting themselves forward to serve on the committee this year, the following existing members were duly re-appointed:

Sue Burch, Liz Burgess, Stefania Graziola, Carol Hulm, Richard Pilborough, Sandra Pilborough, Jacky Simmons, Jacqui Thompson, Angela Thompson, Jon Thompson, and Robert Turner.

One important decision taken at the AGM was to raise the Hall hire fee slightly. The last time we did this was two years ago - but that increase was only to compensate for the loss of income suffered as a result of our removing the 'coin-in-the-slot' electricity meters. Our outgoings increase year by year and we feel that our hire fee must now rise to cover these unavoidable increases. We have therefore decided to raise the hire fee by 50p/hr to £7.50 for regular hirers and £8.50 for others which, considering the further improvements made to the Hall recently, we hope will be acceptable to all.

Also at our AGM, we confirmed that we will aim to run an outdoor event in the 'fete field' in Church Road in the late summer. This is to be an animal-themed event for which we are now seeking ideas, contributors and helpers. Please see the full page ad for this fun event elsewhere in this magazine and do mark the date in your diaries now.

As usual, we will not be running any evening events in the Hall over the summer months but will be back in the autumn with some regular favourites and, perhaps, some new ideas to tempt you. Watch this space!

News from Helen Whately your MP

After what seemed like a never-ending winter, we appear to have gone straight into summer. Like many, I seized the chance of sunshine to spend time in the garden. The peas in our vegetable patch had just begun to peep above ground, though sadly the rabbits noticed them first and thought them extremely tasty.

This month, among other things, I've been campaigning to raise awareness of meningitis B. In February, two-year-old Faye Burdett from Maidstone died of this awful disease. After her parents Neil and Jennifer, who are my constituents, published a picture of their daughter gravely ill in hospital over 800,000 people signed a petition calling for more children to be vaccinated. As a result a heart-felt debate was held in Westminster, in which I paid tribute to the Burdett's and asked the Government to do more to protect children from meningitis B. Following the debate the Public Health Minister announced a new national awareness campaign to help parents spot the signs of meningitis and septicaemia, which will be launched later this year. This is a change in Government policy that will save lives.

Autism is another condition which effects people's lives profoundly. Parents of children with autism have told me how isolating it can be. At present some children are waiting over three years for a diagnosis, without access to support which can make such a difference for children and their families. I'm supporting the National Autistic Society's awareness campaign and I spoke in the House of Commons recently about how we need to improve diagnosis and understanding of autism.

People have told me how noise from HGVs thundering down the M20 is blighting their lives. It's getting worse every year as freight traffic increases. This part of the M20 has an old, concrete surface which is particularly noisy. I wrote to the Roads Minister, asking him for an upgrade to a quieter surface.

In his reply, he told me that parts of the M20 are due to be resurfaced, but not the section between junctions 8 and 9. Instead, this section will be 'retextured' between 2017 and 2019, subject to the availability of funding. This will improve safety but have little or no impact on noise. I was disappointed by the Minister's response and I'm urging the Government to reconsider. The stretch between Junctions 8 and 9 is close to several villages, and a quieter surface would make life better for hundreds of people.

As well as the noise, people have complained to me about HGVs parking illegally at Junction 8 of the M20. I wrote to Highways England, the agency responsible for roads, about this and I'm pleased to report that bollards will be installed in June to bring an end to this problem.

I know there's an ongoing problem of HGVs parking in lay-bys and lanes, and I'm talking to KCC about what more we can do to tackle this.

These are just some examples of how Kent's roads are bearing the burden of increases in freight as the economy grows. I'm pressing for significant improvements to Kent's roads to be included in the Roads Investment Strategy for 2020-2025. With the planned development in and around Maidstone, and the forecast increase in traffic along the M2 if the new Lower Thames Crossing is built – this is becoming urgent.

I'm continuing my work to support residents concerned about the expansion of local Gypsy and Traveller sites. Maidstone Borough Council are currently assessing an application to make some temporary pitches on one of the largest sites - The Meadows - permanent. I have written to the council outlining the serious concerns of local residents, and have also spoken to a planning officer to understand how they are considering the application.

I am also working to get more action on the non-planning issues. For instance, I have written this month to the Environment Agency asking them to investigate whether sewage from the Lenham Road sites is polluting The Beult. They responded, saying that they are aware of the problem and are working with MBC to get it resolved.

I am meeting Baroness Williams of Trafford, the Minister responsible for Gypsies and Travellers, to discuss the situation and also to encourage her to come and meet local representatives in the constituency.

From our newly elected Maidstone Borough Ward Member

Dear Residents,

I am absolutely delighted to have received such a great mandate from the residents of Headcorn ward - I think it was one of the highest majorities (if not the highest) of the borough wide election on 5th May. It's good to know that residents have the confidence to trust me with representing the needs and views of all sections of the community at the Council - and I hope some of that is based on the work I have done to assist the community over the last few years.

Outside of the ward, I am expected to contribute actively to the formation, development and review of the Council's policies, plans and budgets - with regular meetings with Officers, Members, committee sessions (FYI - I am on Planning and Strategic Planning, Sustainability and Transport committees and a substitute member on Democracy) and full Council meetings. Whilst carrying out these functions you can be assured that the local issues and needs will always be at the forefront of my mind and my actions.

Returning to the ward, you may be aware that it is one of the largest within the borough - over 60 square miles and covering the parishes of Headcorn (incl. Hawkenbury), Ulcombe, Boughton Malherbe/Grafty Green and East Sutton. I met a lot of local residents whilst out and about prior to the election, and several have already been in contact seeking help with their concerns. I can't promise that I will always have a solution

Headcorn ward has more than its fair share of major issues to contend with - but I can promise that I will listen and do my very best to help. Additionally, it is my intention to attend all regular full parish council meetings and assist my parish council colleagues wherever I am able, and I will keep everyone well informed about the Council and the services it offers.

Coming to the question over regular dialogue with residents, my election literature was clear that I would welcome contact from local residents on issues that concern them - at any time - and meet with them face to face if necessary. With such a big ward, I really believe that this is a better way to communicate rather than restricting myself to monthly quarterly sessions. Grafty Gourmet

Another very simple recipe, yet tasty Spring recipe. This is a great dish for anyone who does not like preparing food. Simply peel the potatoes and everything is ready to cook.

Simple Salmon with Asparagus

400g peeled potatoes, (halved if large)
2 tbsp olive oil
8 asparagus spears, trimmed and
halved

2 handfuls cherry tomato 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar 2 salmon fillet, about 140g/5oz each Handful of basil leaves

- 1. Heat oven to 220C. Place the potatoes and 1 tbsp of olive oil into an ovenproof dish, then roast the potatoes for 20 mins until starting to brown. Toss the asparagus in with the potatoes, then return to the oven for 15 mins.
- 2. Put in the cherry tomatoes and balsamic vinegar and nestle the salmon amongst the vegetables. Drizzle with the remaining oil and return to the oven for a final 10-15 mins until the salmon is cooked. Scatter over the basil leaves and serve everything scooped straight from the dish.

Having just been persuaded to use WhatsApp, initially I thought \mathbf{WHY} another messenger application, I have enough trouble keeping up with texts and voicemails on my phone.



BUT was then told about the benefits:

- 1. It's a cross-platform, instant messenger for smart phones, so it works with both IPhones and Android phones
- 2. It uses the Internet to send messages, so it's free and doesn't use your text message allowance
- 3. It can send documents, images and videos, which download quickly
- 4. You can see when the message has been received and read by the recipient using a double tick image on the message
- 5. You can set up groups of people to receive messages at the same time
- WhatsApp Web is a computer based extension of the WhatsApp account on your phone. The messages you send and receive are fully synced between your phone and your computer, and you can see all messages on both devices.

God Save the Queen!

HM the Queen has expressed her appreciation of the many prayers said for her. She has also, on many occasions, spoken explicitly about her faith in God.

Prayers for her are not the result of an occasional whim on the part of a local priest. Since 1662 when the Book of Common Prayer came into being the monarch has been prayed for regularly in Church of England worship. Why? Was it because the compliers of the Prayer Book were fervent monarchists?

The answer to the question is to be found in the Bible. In a letter of guidance to Timothy, a young church leader, the apostle Paul wrote this, 'I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone – for kings and all in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.' (1 Timothy 2:verses 1 and 2).

Was there ever a time when prayers for 'all in authority' were more needed? Inevitably our private prayers tend to be focussed on families, friends and local matters but may I suggest that our MP (Helen Whately) and our County, Borough and Parish Councillors should be included.

Since 1662 Her Majesty's predecessors and their families have been prayed for in Morning and Evening services in parish churches. The Prayer Book is still used for some services and regularly in St Nicholas church Boughton Malherbe at 6.30pm on the second Sunday of each month. Why not come along, enjoy the service and pray for the Queen. You will be given a warm welcome.

150 Years

On Ascension Day 1886 Church of England bishops met at Lambeth Palace and decided to create a body of lay ministers to be used in English parishes. They were to be called Lay Readers. Initially only men were licensed but in 1970 women were allowed to become Readers and the first in the Canterbury Diocese was Flora Laundon.

The ministry which began in 1886 continues. Readers are trained to a high standard of theology and the needs of contemporary society. Indeed, Bishop Robert of Sodor and Man, who is Chair of the Central Readers Council prefers to describe Readers as Lay Theologians. Currently there are 10,000 Readers in England and Wales. This is the largest body of trained, commissioned and accountable lay ministers in our churches.

Over the years the Len Valley churches have benefitted from the ministry of Readers. Many will remember the late Robert Hilton and David Essex who has retired. Prior to ordination Marian Bond and Millie Hart were Readers. Pamela Cuerden was licensed last year and I continue to serve.

The Maidstone Archdeaconry celebration of the $150^{\rm th}$ anniversary will be held in St Mary's church Lenham on Sunday 26 June at 3pm. Our Archdeacon Stephen will lead the worship.

Do come and join the celebration. Cream teas will be available after the service.
