

They have thoroughly examined him and decided not to do a full post mortem as there was absolutely no evidence of foul play (excuse the pun). There was no wound on the bird that would suggest he had been shot and we can only assume that he passed away of natural causes.

Roads and Hedges

The hedges on Halam Hill need cutting down back – this will be progressed in the Autumn when hedge trimming can be done.

Note for all residents – a reminder that householders are responsible for all trees and hedges on their property that may overhang and/or encroach on the footpaths or pavements. Please ensure that all vegetation is cut back and does not obstruct any foot path or pavement.

The interactive speed sign on Halam Hill seems to be working intermittently – situation will be monitored, and any faults reported to Highways.

The edges of many of the lanes in Halam are in poor condition with the tarmac broken away and the verges full of large pot holes – County Cllr Bruce Laughton will get the County Council safety inspector to check the safety of these roads and make recommendations for remedial work.

Passing places on single trach lanes – such passing places are unlikely to be funded.

The water running down Mansfield Road is being investigated further.

The poor state of the pavement up Halam Hill has been reported to the County Council.

Please note: - all highways issues – potholes, condition of roadside furniture, street lights etc – can be reported directly on the County Council website - www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk – or by calling the council on 0300 500 80 80. The more people that complain about an issue, the more likely the problem is likely to get resolved.

Allotments

Nothing further to report at this stage. There are currently no plans to move or discontinue the current allotments. Clerk to organise the mowing of the currently unused allotments.

Phone Signal

Following last month's successful appeal for feedback. I have now been in touch with NALC who support and advise Parish Councils and they have been very helpful by informing me that in 2012 we had 14 phone masts serving our area however this has now been reduced to 2 so there is no wonder that we have seen a drop in service in recent years. They have also made some suggestions of how to proceed with this and I will keep you up to date with the progress. For now, a suggestion from myself would be to use a Vodafone sure signal box or other network equivalents. I have used one for guite a few years now and they work really well in your home, but this obviously doesn't help whilst out and about in the village.

Halam Parish Council would like to ask your opinion.

You may have noticed that the Halam signs as you enter the village are looking very tired and are in need of being replaced. Halam P.C. are able to apply for some funding that Nottinghamshire County Council has got set aside for exactly this purpose and will not cost you or the parish council a

single penny. The question that they would like to ask is...

Would you prefer for the old signs to be replaced in the same traditional style that they currently are? or, would you prefer some bespoke metal signs designed and made to our specification like the one pictured here from Hockerton?


