



Farnsfield Parish Council (FPC) is responsible for various spaces within Farnsfield. Some of these areas are owned by the Council, some are owned by Nottingham County Council (but the Council is responsible for maintaining them as part of the Lengthsman Grant Scheme*) and some have no known ownership and the Council maintain them to keep the village looking tidy. FPC has a contract with Newark and Sherwood District Council's street scene team who carry out the work to maintain all these spaces.

*the Lengthsman Grant Scheme is a small amount of funding that is given to Farnsfield Parish Council from Nottingham County Council (NCC) to devolve some minor highway works to Farnsfield Parish Council. It provides an opportunity for local communities to carry out minor works which would not necessarily get done by NCC unless there was a safety issue. The scheme doesn't affect the legal responsibility of NCC to maintain roads and pavements.

Grass Cutting:

The following grass areas are cut 16 times per year, spread between March and October (and occasionally into early November) - approximately every 2 weeks

- Wilsons Field
- Lady Goodwin Play Park (including the small grass strip between the metal railings and the tennis club fencing on Station Lane and on New Hill)
- The Ridgeway
- Brickyard Lane
- The Acres
- Hadleigh Park/Southwell Road Boundary
- Reynolds Field (excluding the allotments)

In addition, the Millennium Wood area has one ride cut to the side of the woodland and one cut and collection of risings in the wildflower meadow area per annum.

Areas that will be Mown/Strimmed as appropriate:

- A. The bottom of Cockett Lane and grass edges along path to the entrance of The Spinney.
- B. The front of Wilsons Field adjacent to Station Lane.
- C. The corner of Broomfield Lane and Far Back Lane.
- D. Outside St. Michael's School.
- E. The corner of The Ridgeway and Crab Nook Lane.
- F. The bottom of the Ridgeway where it meets Main Street (both sides).
- G. The verge alongside Chapel Lane and New Hill adjacent to the bowling complex.
- H. The grass areas along Far Back Lane.
- I. Strim the fenced in area on Wilson's Field.
- J. The grassed area next to the Lock Up.
- K. The footpath and jitty opposite the Plough following access to Cotton Mill Lane, Quaker Lane and Parfitt Drive. Then onwards from Parfit Drive to Reynolds Field.
- L. The footpath from Branston Avenue opposite St Michael's School branching to Ridgeway Close and the Green on The Ridgeway.
- M. The footpath from Murdoch Close to Main Street.
- N. The bus stop opposite the Bottom of Cockett Lane.
- O. The footpath from Tippings Lane to Gregory's Gardens.
- P. Sunnyside.
- Q. The footpath at the rear of Wilsons field to Main Street

Hedges:

Hedges are cut twice per year; the 1st cut to be completed January/February, the 2nd cut to be completed in late October/November.



Other hedges that are maintained by FPC are cut less frequently as the Council deems it necessary.
