'Liverton Hill 30mph Campaign Group'

Just a quick update to let you know progress to date.

A few residents attended the all important Joint Transport Board Meeting at The Town Hall on Wednesday, Anna Farley (Hillside Cottages) kindly spoke very eloquently on behalf of the residents of Liverton Hill.

A copy of our report including residents comments and the press releases to date were sent to the Board members (18) prior to this meeting. Several Board members were clutching these reports at the meeting and it was clear that the Liverton Hill 30mph issue was definitely on the agenda.

Jenny Whittle our County Councillor had kindly arranged for a Kent Highways Transport Officer to visit Liverton Hill today to assess our request. The Officer was present at The Joint Transport Board Meeting on Wednesday and was aware of our requests. I accompanied Jenny Whittle, Pat Anderson & the Highways Officer who seemed very positive, he outlined his views and invited Jenny Whittle to make an application for a 30mph speed limit for part of Liverton Hill with additional yellow backed safety signs for the lower half of Liverton Hill outlining the narrow road and dangers present.

I would at this point like to thank all the residents who have contributed to the campaign so far and also thank Tom & Janetta Sams for their invaluable contribution, advice & help to date.

I will keep you all informed if there is further progress.

I recently met with Robert Stuttle and neighbouring residents on **Liverton Hill** who are campaigning to halve the current speed limit to 30mph. The camber and sharp bends of this road demands a revision of the speed limit for the safety of residents, motorists, cyclists and walkers. I am in discussions with officers from Kent Highways Services and will do my utmost to ensure we achieve a much safer and realistic speed limit for this stretch of road. Well done to Robert for establishing an effective and vocal campaign.

Congratulations to the governing body at **Platts Heath Primary School** who have recently appointed a new Headteacher following the retirement of Ian Priddle. I wish the best of luck to Mr Priddle and the new Headteacher, Piers Anscomb, who was Deputy Headteacher at Cage Green Primary School in Tonbridge and starts at Platts Heath in September.

Unsurprisingly **roads maintenance** has been the hottest topic in my postbag and inbox since I was elected. Six companies have been shortlisted by Kent County Council for the contract to maintain its huge highway network of more than 5,000 miles of roads from next year. They are Atkins, Balfour Beatty, Carillion, Colas, Enterprise and May Gurney. The council is aiming to refine its service requirements by 21st September. Talks will be held with each of the bidding companies about how best to achieve this. The new contract will be awarded in May 2011 and will run for up to 10 years. The current contract will continue to be delivered by Ringway until 31st August 2011. Since April KCC has also employed the services of Detling-based firm Steadline that have undertaken pothole repairs in unclassified lanes and rural areas across the borough. I envisage the Council continuing to use small contractors following positive reports about the quality of repairs undertaken by Steadline and

other firms employed across Kent to fix potholes. This approach has also helped to support small and medium sized companies during a very difficult economic climate.

Grafty Green Speedwatch

Overview

Speedwatch has now started in Grafty Green so you might find a few words about it useful. The scheme is aimed at encouraging drivers to observe speed limits in rural areas, and for our community the 30 mph through Grafty Green. It is a scheme operated by trained volunteers organised under the auspice of Kent Police, Kent County Council and Boughton Malherbe Parish Council. Strict guidelines are in place and the volunteers have no authority whatsoever, they merely monitor results and when necessary pass details to the Police.

Update

We, at the time of writing have been able to carry out three monitoring sessions at different times and all of 2 hours duration.

The results have been significant with 41 vehicles travelling in excess of 36mph and a high percentage well into the 40's. Bearing in mind we can only monitor one way at each session, and most vehicles on seeing the check have slowed before the 'screen' illuminates the figures can only be described as worrying.

All of our data goes back to Maidstone Police traffic management unit and will no doubt result in some official police checks and both they and us re-iterate it is not about catching motorists but educating them to slow down where there are pedestrians, children and animals. At speeds up to 30mph injuries can be bad but increase many times over and sharply as speeds increase.

The Grafty Gourmet

This has got to be the simplest recipe yet. It's more difficult to boil an egg! If ever you do not feel like cooking try this is very simple, yet very tasty dish. It's very versatile and can be served with rice, pasta, noodle, or vegetables.

Easy Spicy Chicken - Serves 4

Ingredients

4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts ½ pint of French salad dressing 1/4 cup salsa 1 teaspoon dried thyme

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 175 degrees C. Lightly grease a medium baking dish.
- 2. Arrange chicken in the baking dish. In a bowl, mix French salad dressing, salsa, and thyme. Pour evenly over chicken.
- 3. Cover with aluminium foil, and bake 20 minutes in the preheated oven. Remove foil, and continue baking 10 minutes, until chicken juices run clear.
- 4. Serve with your choice of rice, pasta, noodles or vegetable.

The August Night Sky

At the start of August the Sun is in the constellation of Cancer, and moves into Leo on Tuesday 10^{th} .

New Moon occurs on Tuesday 10^{th} August. We will not be able to see the waxing crescent until Sunday 15^{th} , low in the southwest after sunset. Full Moon occurs on Tuesday 24^{th} August, in the constellation of Aquarius.

As Mercury is at its greatest elongation east of the Sun on 24th August, you will be lucky to get a glimpse of this planet in the west, as it sets only minutes after the Sun. Whilst on the subject of Mercury, I have read that the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency is to launch an ambitious mission to the planet in the next few years. I will have more about this subject in a later article.

Venus is still visible low in the western sky as soon as it starts to get dark, but it will get increasingly difficult to see as the weeks go by. But the "Evening Star" is so brilliant, it can even be seen in the twilight sky.

Mars is low in the western sky at dusk and can be clearly seen shining with an orange light. Venus is catching up on Mars, and on the night of 19th August it will appear directly below. Mars sets earlier every evening and by the end of the month it will not be visible.

Jupiter is the only planet visible during the night. It rises in the east in late evening, and is well up in the south at dawn. The giant planet is less brilliant than Venus, but can still be seen even against a brightening sky. With binoculars Jupiter's four major moons can easily be seen.

Saturn is low in the western sky at dusk and sets before midnight. Again the famous rings can only be seen through a telescope. Saturn sets earlier every night, and by the end of the month it will not be visible.

August is the month for the famous Perseid meteor shower. They will appear to radiate from a point in the constellation of perseus, which is high in the northeast in the evening. It is expected that the showers will peak on the evening of 12th August.

Some of you may have read that astronomers have discovered a star that is 10million times brighter than the Sun. It was found within two young star clusters in the Tarantula nebula, using the Southern Observatory's Very Large Telescope. Experts have said that, as these monster stars are rarely discovered, the record is likely to last for some time.



Christian Message August 2010

I've always been fascinated by the weird and wonderful place names we pass through when we're travelling through different parts of the country. Then I wonder what strangers to Kent make of the place names that are so familiar to us! Do they ever ask themselves why there are so many ending in 'hurst', 'den' or 'ham' and are they then interested enough to try to find the answer to that question?

Many of the names are centuries old, and have changed little over the years, and may refer to the person who first owned the land in the area or to its geographical situation. But whenever we've been away, we're always glad to be back in Kent, seeing the names we know so well on the signposts, and know for sure we're nearly home. Back in the comfort and security of familiar surroundings again.

Christian names are interesting too. I wonder if you know the origins of *your* name or names, and what they mean? I'm not sure that most parents think about meanings when choosing a name for their new baby, probably they're more concerned with making sure the initials don't form an undesirable word!

Christian names also seem to follow 'fashion' cycles, those which would have been considered 'old fashioned' thirty or forty years ago, are now popular again, but whatever we choose for our offspring, it's an awesome responsibility. Their name is something they will carry with them for the rest of their life, and defines them as a unique individual. God the Father chose a special name for *his* Son, Jesus, meaning 'The Lord saves'. His name showed that he was the one who would be our Saviour, but he also has other names or titles given to him in the Bible. I have a book which lists twenty six for him and explains their meanings and how relevant they are for us, but the one I find the most helpful of all, (after Jesus), is Immanuel, (Matthew 1:23) meaning 'God with us'. To remember *that* when life gets hard, is like coming home at the end of a journey, back to the security and comfort of a familiar presence, who gives us the strength and help to get through the difficult times.
