Are you entitled to council tax help?

You may not know but some people are eligible for help with their council tax. This can be people who are the only adult in the household, people on low income and certain benefits and people with disabilities. School transport

Arrangements for school transport (https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/residents/schools/tr avelling-school) concern all the pupils who get the bus to Eynsham secondary school and there are concerns that OCC hasn't handled recent changes well and we have apologised to parents who have been affected. The Council provides more than it is required to do by law, and more than its funding permits, but then the law doesn't reflect the real needs of residents or the unfairness that a fixed policy creates. A working party has recommended some substantial changes. Where there are issues, OCC are committed to finding solutions. OCC are pleased that the First and Last service, run by a brilliant volunteer team, is a key provider of services into Bartholomew from the south and are grateful that parents entrust their children to the service. That provides a win-win: a good school service and a regular timetabled bus. They are always on the lookout for volunteer drivers.

Speedwatch needs you

The Speedwatch scheme is a community initiative that helps the Police combat speeding. The scheme has recently undergone huge changes and is now more successful than ever. There are people who have undergone the training, but the scheme needs someone to lead it. Do you think you could be that person?
