### **Parish Council**

The Parish Council met on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> February.

There have been incidences of excessive mud being brought onto the roads by farm vehicles. Both Police and Norfolk County Council have been asked to address the issues by concerned parishioners. As there are few landowners in the village, the council ask parishioners to contact a parish councillor. He / she will find out who is responsible for the problem and contact the landowner directly. It is hoped this will save a lot of valuable police time in future. Contact details for your parish councillors are posted on the village notice boards.

Mr Chapmam, owner of the Blacksmiths shop, attended the meeting. He acknowledged that the hedge surrounding his property needs cutting back to improve visibility and to reduce road deterioration.

Mr Chapman is now in correspondence with Norfolk County Councillor Saul Penfold who has volunteered to mediate discussions about the ownership of the land where his cars are parked adjacent to his property.

Councillor Penfold also advised the meeting that he has funds available to spend on local highways projects such as a proposed purchase of a 'SAM 2' speed indicator sign which could be installed on The Street in the 30MPH zone.

The potholes in the village have all been mapped and reported to NCC highways. Potholes on Rectory Road have been filled.

Please continue to support our bottle bank which is situated near the church. It brings in an income into the village which can be used for village projects.

2021 report: on top of all the general, annual maintenance tasks about 10 bat boxes and several bird boxes including a kestrel box have been put up. There is now a donations box on the shed by the visitor's book. The fruit trees have been pruned and the willow igloo has been trained to include a roof. One section of the ditch across the field area was cleared in compliance with a plan put forward by the Norfolk Wildlife Trust. A lot of architectural salvage has been uncovered. There are plans to use some of this for art installations. Anything that cannot be used will be removed.
