UPDATE FROM CLLR CAROLYNE CULVER

Dear Residents

Thames Water and the Environment Agency answered questions from councillors and the public at a special meeting of Scrutiny Commission that I chaired on 11th October. The recording of the meeting is available on West Berkshire Council's page on YouTube. A colourful protest by members of the public happened outside the council offices, followed by nearly three hours of presentations and questions. As a result of the meeting I am following up on several issues with the local flood forums, council officers and with Thames Water.

Scrutiny Commission has a lengthy but very interesting list of topics to consider. Including the educational attainment gap between children who receive free school meals and those who do not, the need for more foster carers, and the council's finances. I have also received a request to look at digital exclusion in West Berkshire (people missing out because they don't have access to the internet or don't know how to use it safely). I am still chairing the 'healthcare on major developments' task and finish group but another councillor kindly agreed to chair the 'lessons learned from covid' task and finish group (I am still a member). Task and finish groups are sub committees of Scrutiny Commission that go off and really dig into the details of a topic.

At Full Council, on 5th October, we updated the council's <u>climate</u> emergency declaration, and pledge to become carbon zero by 2030, to recognise and pledge action to tackle the <u>ecological</u> emergency too. It has been two years since I called for this. Wheels turn slowly. The council also agreed its new five-year strategy and considered two draft Neighbourhood Development Plans from Cold Ash and Hermitage. I spoke on all of the aforementioned agenda items.

I have submitted a bid to WBC for some match funding for windows at West IIsley village hall. The deadline is 31 October, and we should hear in November whether the bid was successful.

The council's financial situation means we have a number of staff vacancies that might not be filled very quickly, if at all. Our officers work incredibly hard and are a great support to me when I'm trying to help residents with a wide range of issues.

West Berkshire Food Bank provides emergency food to local people.

LOCAL FLOODING EXHIBITION - POSTPONED

Pang valley Flood Forum covers 10 West Berks Parishes: West and East Ilsley, Compton, Hampstead Norreys, Frilsham, Bucklebury, Stanford Dingley, Bradfield, Tidmarsh and Pangbourne.

The Pang Valley Flood Protection Exhibition, which was due to be held on **Saturday 4 November**, has now been postponed.

The exhibition will be rescheduled and further details will be posted once the new date has been confirmed. The Flood Exhibition will be an opportunity to learn more about flooding and what can be done to reduce the risks. There will be stands with flood protection devices and an opportunity to see these in situ in a purpose built mobile demonstration vehicle known as the Floodmobile.

THE ILSLEYS NEWS WRITTEN BY TWO YEAR 6s

On Monday 2nd October, two Year 5s were chosen to go to Curridge Primary School and enjoy a fencing lesson. They were picked up and taken to Curridge School to take part in this activity with many other children from other schools. Both the Year 5s had a great time at the fencing activity and had lots of fun. We hope we can do something like this again soon.

As you may already know, it is Black History Month so we, and many other schools, joined a virtual assembly to celebrate it. In this assembly, we were exploring the past behind people from Black heritage. They interviewed famous Black females, as this year's theme is 'Celebrating Our Sisters'. Everybody was fascinated by this truthful assembly and the difficulties Black people have faced in the past.

On Wednesday 11th October, Atlantic Class (which is Year 5 and Year 6) went on an educational, and fantastic, school trip to the British Museum in London. We explored the rooms based around Ancient Mesopotamia. We had booklets to fill in and, later, had lunch in an impressive room. After that, we looked around other rooms based on other ancient civilizations such as Rome, Egypt and Greece. This helped us compare similarities and differences between them. All the children enjoyed this particular trip and would love to go back.

Parent Welcome day was on Tuesday 17th Octoberthis is an opportunity for parents to come into school and view their child's work at the end of the day and have a chat with parents, which everybody enjoys.
