News from Ulcombe Village School

May has, as usual seen a variety of events, including sporting activities and assessments. Whilst the weather has not always been what we might expect of early summer, we have spent a good deal of time looking for signs of spring and new growth. Indeed Barn Owls have been investigating local farm and woodland to see just what does live in our local area.

Testing Times?

Many of you will have heard in the local and national media that changes have been made to the way children are tested at the end of Key Stage 2. The new test in English for all Year 6 children (10 and 11 year olds), introduced for this year, was on punctuation and grammar. The thinking now is that children should be assessed through testing their ability to use the rules for writing. In the past, there has been emphasis on the structure of children's writing and their ability to write for a purpose. Teachers' assessments of children's ability to compose and structure their work will be more appropriate than the formal tests.

As ever with these National Tests (formerly known as SATs) in Maths, Mental Maths, Reading, Spelling, and, now, Punctuation and Grammar, are sent off to be marked. We and, of course, the children in Year 6, will be eagerly awaiting their results in mid-July. In the meantime, most other year groups have completed, or will soon complete, formal assessment activities to support teachers in making their own judgements.

Sporting Times?

On a sporting front, cricket has been very much to the fore for Key Stage 2. All of the children in Years 3-6 have enjoyed sessions with Phil Pass and Tash Newman as part of the Chance 2 Shine programme. A team of eight budding Bothams headed over to Leeds and Broomfield Cricket Club on Thursday 16th May and took part in a Kwik Cricket Festival. Although we were not successful this year, the children certainly enjoyed the chance to play against other school teams. For the girls in Tawny Owls the opportunity has come up to meet some of the England Women's Team. Three international cricketers attended the Girls' Kwik Cricket Day on 22nd May, which was a unique chance for the girls to meet sportspeople at the top of their game.

During the last week of term some of the children spent time thinking about the Queen's Coronation which took place sixty years ago. The children thought about how it might be to step back in time and to have been there at this wonderful occasion, as well as celebrating the enormous contribution of Queen Elizabeth II to British life during her reign.

The end of Term 5 was on Friday 24th May, when we all came in looking our very best for our school photographs. We look forward to seeing the finished product early in June.

What Wikipedia says about 'networking'

Business networking is a socioeconomic activity by which groups of like-minded business people recognise, create, or act upon business opportunities. A business network is a type of social network whose reason for existing is business activity. There are several prominent business networking organisations that create models of networking activity that, when followed, allow the business person to build new business relationships and generate business opportunities at the same time. A professional network service is an implementation of information technology in support of business networking. Many business people contend business networking is a more cost-effective method of generating new business than advertising or public relations efforts. This is because business networking is a low-cost activity that involves more personal commitment than company money.

As an example, a business network may agree to meet weekly or monthly with the purpose of exchanging business leads and referrals with fellow members. To complement this activity, members often meet outside this circle, on their own time, and build their own one-to-one relationship with the fellow member. Business networking can be conducted in a local business community, or on a larger scale via the Internet.

Lenham Valley Business Association has been running since early in 2009, meetings are monthly. Twice a year LVBA meets with South Maidstone Business Association (SMBA). Yoga Classes Grafty Green Village Hall



Neighbourhood Plan for Boughton Malherbe/Grafty Green

I've written several pieces for Malherbe Monthly to keep you up to date regarding the Neighbourhood Plan, what it is and how it could benefit us in Grafty Green/Boughton Malherbe. The Neighbourhood Plan group is, so far, made up of 6 people who have been searching through the masses of stuff written about the plan and attending a variety of talks. The last meeting I attended was Harrietsham's Annual Parish Council Meeting to see the presentation about their plan, which is soon to be ratified by MBC. There is a lot of information on their website.

Key points from all of these talks are that the Neighbourhood Plan is vital even to small parishes like ours; it is about regeneration and conservation, and not just development; all parishes have the right to create a plan, so it is not a lightweight idea, but a serious bit of legislation that gives a lot of power to parishes. There is even a financial incentive to have an accepted Neighbourhood Plan.

Although very much a Community Project, in order to proceed, the approval of the Parish Council is necessary. I'm pleased to be able to say that, at the Annual Parish Council Meeting on 14th May 2013, the Parish Council voted in favour of supporting the development of a Neighbourhood Plan for Boughton Malherbe. The next step is for all interested people to get together with the current group and plan the way forward. The more people we have involved the easier the project will be, so have a think and see what you may have to offer - interest, time and commitment are the most important, though if there is anybody with planning knowledge or project management skills that would also be very useful.

Next month will be further details and a meeting date.

Grafty Gourmet

This is a great but simple Summer recipe. All that we need to go with it, is a 'Summer'. It is great served with New Potatoes and Asparagus. Be sure to use fresh Dill in the sauce, as this really makes a difference.

Salmon Parcels with Dill Sauce

For 2 Servings

Salmon Parcels

2 x 4-5oz salmon fillets 4 x sheets filo pastry

1 oz butter

Zest and juice of 1 lime

1 tsp grated ginger

1 spring onion (finely chopped)

1 clove garlic (pressed)

1 Tbsp fresh coriander (finely chopped)

Salt and pepper

Dill Sauce

2 shallots, finely chopped 2 tablespoons butter 1/2 cup white wine 3 tablespoons chopped fresh dill 1 cup crème fraîche 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard salt and pepper

- 1. For the Dill sauce, melt the butter on low heat in a small sauce pan. Add the shallots and cook, stirring frequently, for five minutes. Be sure not to brown the shallots, otherwise they will turn hard and bitter. Pour in the wine and add half of the chopped dill. Turn up the heat to medium and boil the liquid until reduced to about half. Take off the heat and stir in the crème fraîche and mustard. Warm through just before serving and season to taste with salt and pepper, and stir in the remaining dill.
- 2. For the Salmon Parcels, mix together lime zest and juice, garlic, spring onion, ginger and coriander.
- 3. Melt the butter on a slow heat in a pan. Lay out 1 sheet of filo pastry, and brush with the melted butter. Lay second sheet on top, brush with more butter. Lay a salmon fillet about 2-3 inches from short side of pastry, season with a pinch of salt and pepper and put half of lime mixture on top.
- 4. Fold short end of pastry over salmon, then fold in the 2 long sides. Fold the salmon over twice more, (3 times in total), and cut off any remaining pastry. Do the same with the other fillet.
- 5. Put the parcels on a well-greased baking sheet, and just before baking brush with the remaining butter. Cook at about 170 degrees for 20-25 mins, until brown and crispy.

The June Night Sky

The **Sun** is in the constellation of Taurus at beginning of June, and moves into Gemini on the 21st. The **Summer Solstice** occurs on 21st June, which is the longest day. After this date the days will start getting shorter! (Where's our summer?)

New Moon occurs on Saturday 8th June. **Full Moon** is on Sunday 23rd June when in Libra.

Whilst still on the subject of the Moon, the so-called **"Supermoon"** occurs on Sunday 23rd June. This is an annual event, when the Moon's elliptical orbit brings it closest to the earth, at the same time as full moon.

Mercury rises in the northeast at sunrise in the constellation of Gemini, so again we will not be able to see it in the twilight.

Venus also rises in the northeast at sunrise in Gemini, and sets just after sunset still in the constellation of Gemini, so again will not be visible this month.

Mars is rising in the northeast at sunrise in Taurus, so will also not be visible this month.

Jupiter cannot be seen this month as it rises and sets with the Sun.

Saturn is rising in the southeast in the early evening, near the constellations of Virgo, and is low in the southern sky before setting in the early hours in the west. Through a telescope you should be able to see the famous rings together with many of its moons.

Meteor Showers: The next meteor shower is the "**Perseid"** which starts in late July and early August.

I would like to draw your attention to an exhibition being held at the National Maritime Museum in at Greenwich starting early this month. It is called **Visions of the Universe,** and its aim is to show how astronomical imaging has changed our understanding of our place in the vastness of space. The centrepiece is a 43ft long wall on to which the latest images from Nasa's rover Curiosity will be beamed back from Mars. There will also be pictures of Jupiter's moons taken by the Galileo spacecraft, together with images of the Orion Nebula and the Crab Nebula taken by the Hubble telescope. The exhibition runs from 7th June to 17th September.

Lenham Swimming Club

It is with great regret that the swimming pool at Swadelands School will be unable to open to the public again this summer and this will be the third year in a row. The pool has served residents of Lenham and the surrounding villages for many years.

Health and Safety in Swimming Pools requirements now specify that open swimming sessions must be supervised by a fully qualified pool lifeguard.

In order to continue operating next year (2014), we would need a number of individuals to come forward and be willing and able to undertake the Royal Life Saving Society Emergency Response (Pool) qualification and commit to a voluntary session at the Lenham pool one evening or a Saturday/Sunday per week during June, July and August. The qualification is a two-day course. There may be the opportunity to undertaken the full pool lifeguard qualification (5 day course). We also need helpers to be on the front desk to help take payments for swims and run the tuck shop.

We would like to thank those who previously expressed an interest in becoming involved. We still have your details and will making contact shortly (if you are able to update us with an e-mail address, we would be grateful). Unfortunately, the last appeal did not attract the minimum number of individuals needed to keep the club operating; hence our second attempt. At least ten lifeguards will be needed in addition to a similar number of helpers for the front desk.

Lenham Swimming Club opened every summer between 1977 and 2010 and will be a huge loss to the community if we are unable to continue operating. We have a very loyal but small team of volunteers who have given many hours of their time over the past 36 years. However, changes in health and safety legislation mean that formal qualifications are now also required.


Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age to undertake the qualification but there is no upper age limit. This could potentially create an ideal career opportunity and would be fully funded.

This is a final attempt to engage some volunteers. Aiming to re-open in 2014 will allow us time to put any volunteers through the lifeguard training course and mean that there would be a range of training dates for individuals to choose from in an attempt to accommodate volunteers' availability.
