The proposals are to make the houses very similar to those already in the village. Requests have been received from local residents for family homes, which shows there is a need for this type of development in the village. This will tidy up the area. A member of the PCC spoke about the proposal to wind up the Medley Will fund and asked what the Parish Council were required to do with their 1/2 of the fund as there are conditions attached for the PCC. The stipulation for the Parish Council is "General Maintenance". After the last meeting Cllr Quibell spoke to the school regarding inviting Maureen as per her request, to some events, they emailed her and invited her to sports day and to the summer show amongst other things, but they haven't had a response as Cllr Mrs Dobson has been away on holiday. Cllr Quibell has had some complaints from parents regarding parking on the footpath up to the school while the work on the Medleys bungalows has been taking place, it's not the builders but deliveries which always seem to be done around 9am in the mornings obstructing the footpaths. There has also been a van parked on the path in front of one of the properties doing some work behind the house — this van belongs to Western Power. There has been increased footpath use leading up to the summer holidays as the school have provided the children with scooters to encourage them to exercise more and this has highlighted the issue even more. As much of the deliveries as possible will be completed during the school holidays. This has been raised at the recent SNG and PCSO will speak to Councillor Nolan about possible actions.
