This website is run by Great Coxwell Parish Council.

We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver)

We've also tried to make the website text as simple as possible to understand.

AbilityNet has advice on making your device easier to use if you have a disability.

We know some parts of this website are not fully accessible:

- most older PDF documents are not fully accessible to screen reader software
- any instances of live video streams may not have captions
- any instances of Google maps embedded via iframe

Compliance Status

This website is partially compliant with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.2 AA standard, due to the non-compliances listed below.

Content that’s not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

PDFs and other documents

Many of our older PDFs and Word documents do not meet accessibility standards – for example, they may not be structured so they’re accessible to a screen reader, they lack a document title, or they may contain an image that doesn’t have alternative text. This does not meet WCAG 2.2 success criterion 4.1.2.

Some of our PDFs and Word documents are essential to providing our services. For example, we have PDFs with information on how users can access our services, and forms published as Word documents. We plan to either fix these.

The accessibility regulations do not require us to fix PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018 if they’re not essential to providing our services.

Live & recorded video

Live & recorded video streams that do not have captions will fail WCAG 2.2 success criterion 1.2.4 (captions – live).

We do not plan to add captions to live video streams because live video is exempt from meeting the accessibility regulations.

What we’re doing to improve accessibility

Issues with PDFs and other documents

We are aware that some older documents are not accessible, going forward we are working to ensure all new documents comply with accessibility requirements.

If you have accessibility issues with an older document, please contact us and we will provide it in a different format.

How we tested this website

This website was last tested on 31st December 2025. We tested representative templates using Adobe screen reader and WAVE accessibility extension tools.
