Council News

GE Aviation and Planning

The Council has received news that the GE Aviation Hamble site has been sold to Aernnova, a Spanish aviation company, who it is anticipated will take over ownership from the start of 2020. The new owners have been in touch with the Borough Council to say how important the Hamble site is to them. We will wait to see if this has any implications regarding the current planning application for 148 dwellings on its car park and sports field. At the last Parish Council Planning Committee meeting, the Committee considered an application for the installation of a battery standby facility at Hound Nurseries off of Hamble Lane. Although the Committee was minded to support renewable and low carbon developments, it objected because this facility was located in a local gap and the

countryside that could set a precedent for further developments in this important gap for the parish. When the Local Area Committee considered this application, it was approved.

Hamble Lane

Parishioners travelling up Hamble Lane will have noticed the road to the development off the Jurd Way roundabout has been closed as promised and traffic from this development and the former car boot sale site now use the Bursledon Road access. Residents will have also seen that a tree adjacent to the Parish Council's allotments off Hamble Lane has had to be felled due to its unsafe condition.

St Andrews Cemetery

Several memorial headstones in the cemetery require urgent attention and some of them have been fenced off to ensure safety. Notices have been attached to these headstones asking that the

families concerned contact the Parish Office to seek a remedy to the situation. If you have a family member buried in the cemetery, please can you check to see it doesn't involve your family member's grave. The Council has also commissioned a company to measure and mark out grave plots in the next burial area to ensure the space is utilised to its full potential.

The Mercury Library & Community Hub

As mentioned in a previously, the Parish Council made it clear to the Borough Council that it could not continue undertaking the day to day management of this service at the expense of other Parish Council duties. It asked the Borough Council to seek an appropriate organisation to partner it to manage and develop this facility. This has still not happened, so with regret the Parish Council has given notice that it will limit its support from the end of October. It will continue to source and support community outreach services and the volunteers with their children's story writing competition etc. if this is acceptable with the new provider.

The Parish Council recently organised a celebration event to thank the Mercury Library & Community Hub volunteers for all their hard work and commitment to the project.

Hamble Primary School Sign Awards

Councillor Ryan and the Clerk attended a Primary School assembly to congratulate the pupils on their great effort in producing signs about picking up litter, cleaning up after your dog and looking after the environment that have been put up around the village.

Rights of Ways and Public Landings

At least annually Councillors walk all the Rights of Ways (ROWs) in the Parish, as well as embark and disembark at all the parish's public landings places on the river. Councillors have started this by visiting the public landing places and walking the ROWs in the area that was previously in Hound, Other than the ROW from the Hamble School to Badnam Copse that was overgrown, the others were in reasonably good condition. While undertaking this, Councillor Rolfe took a sack with her to pick up litter along the route. Surprisingly, there was little litter along the ROWs or along Hamble Lane where the school children walk, but Satchell Lane was another matter! Within 50 metres Cllr Rolfe had filled her sack with rubbish, such as bottles, cans and food containers, that had been thrown into the verge from cars.

MESSAGE FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL TEAM

Cemetery

The village cemetery at St Andrew's Church is a very important green corridor frequently visited by deer and other animals. As part of the Council's Policy to support and improve biodiversity across the Parish, the lower meadow in the cemetery is left uncut and will be sown with some native wild-flower seed ready for next summer.

The new burial area has been measured and marked out and in the coming months we will plant a border with English Lavender to support pollinating insects and under plant with native daffodils to provide some spring colour. We have also introduced some benches in key locations to provide a space to stop and reflect.

Remembrance Sunday

This year's Remembrance Sunday service will take place on November 10th. Cllr Hand will attend the church service at St Andrews Church; Cllr Cross will attend the service at the Chapel at Royal Victoria Country Park and Cllrs Rolfe and Nesbit-Bell will represent the parish at St Edwards, Netley.



Allotments

During September, allotment holders contacted the Parish Council with concerns about a diseased/dead tree adjoining the

allotments. Emergency work was carried out to make it safe and it has now been felled by Hampshire County Council.

The allotment plots are always in high demand and we have 20 people on the waiting list at the moment. We are often asked questions about specific plots that are uncultivated and appear unworked. Often, allotment holders are unable to maintain their plot in the short term because of illness or other personal circumstances. In such cases we try to work with them through temporary difficulties. If the problem looks like it will be for an extended period we do encourage them to relinquish the plot to avoid it becoming overgrown and a problem for other users. Please bear this in mind if you are on the waiting list.

At the end of the summer we have seen a spate of vandalism, damage and theft from the allotments. Those effected have been very upset seeing their hard work damaged or taken. The Police have asked that we look at options to improve security which we will do over the coming months.

The Mercury

The Parish Council hosted an event on 13th October to celebrate and thank the wonderful volunteers who have worked so hard to take the Mercury from a building with empty shelves to a well-stocked library and welcoming community hub. We are extremely grateful for their commitment and kind support for this community project. The pilot of Wednesday afternoon opening, 2pm until 5pm, has been a great success and will now continue on a permanent basis. Several new volunteers are currently training and it is hoped these additional volunteers will help to open The Mercury on other weekday afternoons.

HAMBLE CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS



It is proving to be a busy autumn. The prolonged drought created a severe fire risk on the Common and, sadly, a serious fire required the attention of the Fire Service. We monitored the embers and reported to Eastleigh Borough Council on the impact on the grazing cattle. Those who walk regularly along the fire break path will have noticed that we have now managed to remove the burnt remains of the scrub in this area.

On 13th November we anticipate working with Eastleigh Ramblers and Eastleigh Borough Council on Footpath No 505 that runs parallel with the boundary of the Common with Hamble Point Marina. We understand this section of path is likely to become part of the English Coast National Trail and currently it is barely passable in the wetter months. The Common's Site of

Scientific Interest status places significant restrictions on the use of mechanised plant so volunteer turnout is crucial for success.

Regardless of the task we welcome volunteers: the tasks can be arduous but there are roles for a wide range of agilities. Furthermore we appreciate that many people cannot spare the time for the whole task so please do not be put off if you can only be with us for a short time.





ADVICE COLUMN BY CITIZENS ADVICE EASTLEIGH

My mum has a non-visible disability, which causes her walking difficulties. I heard something on the news about how she may now be eligible for a blue badge. How can I find out about this and help her apply?

On 30 August, the Blue Badge scheme was extended to people who live in England and have non-visible disabilities or conditions which affect their ability to walk. As a result, your mother may now qualify for a badge.

Your mother will be automatically eligible if she gets certain types of benefits. These include some categories of Personal Independence Payment and the higher rate mobility component of Disability Living Allowance.

If she's not automatically eligible she can still apply for a badge. Her local authority will use evidence from doctors and other healthcare professionals to determine whether she qualifies or not.

Your mother can check her eligibility and apply for a local authority-issued Blue Badge at gov.uk/apply-blue-badge. If she can't do this herself, you can apply on her behalf.

You'll need a recent digital passport-style photo, proof of her identity, address, details of any benefits she receives, her National Insurance number, and evidence of how her non-visible disability or condition affects


