



Reflection from Revd Mandy

Dear Friends,

Our villages take on new lives at this time of year, don't they? In one of my favourite encounters of November, I was shown which bow tie a favourite dog will be wearing on Christmas day! This year, we face more dilemmas than what Christmas clothes to choose, for ourselves or our pets. Indeed, we may see fewer Christmas lights; maybe have fewer gifts and less Christmas food. It may be a good idea to watch out for each other, to make sure that everyone is warm and well and got good company, because by doing that, we'll reflect the true spirit of Christmas.

When we remember the Christmas story this year, let's try to imagine the people who aren't mentioned. The family and friends who must have helped Mary and Joseph to get ready for their journey to Bethlehem; giving them food and blankets for the journey. The people they met on the way, fellow travellers who like them, were forced to leave home, who helped each other find shelter and shared their food. The owners of the inn who provided a safe space for Jesus to be born, who probably didn't ask too many questions, but just responded to the need in front of their eyes. The people who turned a blind eye as Mary and Joseph sneaked out of Bethlehem by night and the people who supported them on their way to Egypt and helped them make a home as refugees in a strange land.

This Christmas story is a story of political intrigue, hardship and danger. This is the world that Jesus was born into. It's also a story of unsung heroes working together bravely to help each other in the face of powerful and cruel regimes. That's what happens when God's presence in our lives affects the way we respond to the world. Maybe we could be unsung heroes this winter and part of the Christmas story.

Back in our villages, I look forward to celebrating the Christmas story with you and especially singing carols. At St George's, our carol service is on Friday 16th December at 7pm, and I look forward to seeing everyone there.

Then there's a Christmas morning Communion service at 10:30am, so no one needs to miss out on celebrating Jesus' birthday!

Ingham Circular

Distance – approx. 3.75 miles (1.5 – 2 hours) OS Explorer Map 272 An easy and level walk along tracks, field paths and quiet lanes, muddy in places when wet.

1. Leave the village hall/school (LN1 2XT) car park and walk towards the village green. Keep to the left, with the village shop ahead of you. Turn left and walk along West End. Look out for the remains of a windmill now part of a house. As West End bends to the left take the bridleway on the right. Admire the views to your left across the Trent Valley dominated by the cooling towers



- 2. At a junction of tracks turn left for approximately 30m before turning right onto a bridleway which follows the dyke as it weaves its way across the field. At the end of the field turn right and cross two bridges. Follow the bridleway keeping the dyke and then the remnants of a hedge on your right.
- At the road turn right and follow it for approximately 1.5 kilometres until it bends sharply to the left.
- 4. Turn right along the track, a public footpath. When the track bends sharply to the left, continue straight on across a bridge. Walk straight across the middle of the field aiming for the house, visible in the distance. At the end of the field cross the track and bridge, head for the left of the house. Follow the footpath between the houses onto a lane, continue along this lane, to reach the green and return to the village hall/school.

North Clifton Parish Meeting

Septembers Parish meeting started by recording the meetings' sadness on the loss of Queen Elizabeth II on September 8th, and Jane Frost, the Parish meetings immediate past chairperson at the beginning of August. Both people with a strong sense of public duty who will be missed in their respective roles.

I am sure parishioners will have noticed that the telephone box has now been fully refurbished, thanks go to Ed Gibson for the painting and Chris/Jodie Wilkes for the signage. The notice board also now has clean toughened glass which replaces the milky dull Perspex. We are optimistic that the flooding on the green has now stopped thanks to some pipe cleaning works carried out by the NCC but despite a number of phone calls and emails the state of the School Lane path and "the jitty" remain in a poor state. This is still being pursued by our District Councillors.

Of late the village has struggled to attend the Safer Neighbourhoods Group meeting but Andy Hughes has kindly volunteered to try and attend future meetings. (Safer neighbourhoods is a meeting of local Police, Councillors, anti- social behaviour officers, other village reps and the like with a common aim of sharing information to help keep the area safe).

Fibre broadband still continues to rumble along in the back ground. A number of households and businesses have now pledged their vouchers to Open reach but at the time of writing we are unclear if Open reach now have enough vouchers to enable full fibre to be brought into the village. Maggie Firth is persistently pursuing Open Reach and trying to nudge the process along, but it isn't easy going.

A decision has still to be made on the type/material of any public seats that are to be installed in the village. The three locations for discussion are outside the Church, the bottom of Trent Lane, and around the junction of Mill Lane/A1133. If anyone has other suggestions, please let us know.






It was lovely to see so many people in church for our Harvest Festival which the children really enjoyed learning new songs and creating artwork for.




