There is also, now, a new Facebook page for our community. The Acol Village Facebook site... https://facebook.com.acol.village is independent of the parish website, providing an informal medium for community engagement with, and discussion, of local issues, news, events and activities.

Separate Sections provide for **Posts** from the administrators, **Community** observations, comments and discussion, the sharing of **Photos**, which may be arranged into albums, information about upcoming **Events** and the organisation of local **Groups**.

We know that not all of us are comfortable with using social media, but you don't need a Facebook account to view the content (except for "Group" material, to which you must be subscribed) and whether you contribute directly, or not, we hope you'll find the site useful.

Some of the initially planned content will comprise occasional articles on village history, but let us know what you would like to see!

ACOL PARISH COUNCIL

Draft Minutes of the meeting of Acol Parish Council held in the Village Hall, Acol on Monday 4th September 2017 held in the Village Hall, Acol.

Present: Councillors: Miss Bransfield (Chairman), D. Hayfield, J. Inchley,

Mrs. Osborne and R. Steel.

Also present: Councillor Crow-Brown

Apologies: PCSO Raisbeck & KCC Warden Tony Gander.

25. MINUTES

RESOLVED: That the minutes of the meeting held on 3rd July 2017, as amended, be approved and signed by the Chairman.

26. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No declarations of interest were made.

27. REPORT OF THE POLICE/COMMUNITY WARDENS/PCSO'S

No officers were in attendance to report. However the Chairman reported that PCSO Raisbeck had submitted a written report covering the Thanet parishes and the 2 reported, minor, incidents relating to Acol.

28. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman reported upon Kent Highways.

Houses were flooded after a rain and hail storm a few weeks ago and Southern Water came to clear the drains, with a follow-up attendance shortly afterwards. Minster Road was seen to be flooded again last Thursday, following a downpour, especially by the duck pond. No reports of house flooding were received, so hopefully the drain clearance was successful, but we would ask residents to advise Parish Council if they experienced flooding.

At the July meeting, there was mention of traffic monitoring strips seen by Sycamore Cottage. Highway alleged to have no knowledge of them, but we have been advised that they were possibly arranged by RiverOak in relation to an extension to Columbus Avenue.

The Parish Council has contacted Paul Valek today in relation to a few matters, including an all-day burning street lamp and, especially, the weeds growing along the Dilnot Lane wall and the duck pond.

29. CRISPE ROAD - SOUTHERN WATER AUTHORITY

The Chairman reported that Sir Roger Gale M.P. had arranged a meeting for the 15th September with representatives from SWA to discuss the ongoing problems due to failures at the pumping station and invited P.C. Members to attend. The Chairman will ask SWA if a separate pumping station will be constructed for the new buildings on Manston Industrial Estate, especially the new Maple Leaf development, as was promised some time ago.

30. CROWN & SCEPTRE SITE

The Chairman reported upon her correspondence with Iain Livingstone (TDC Planning) in respect of the Parish Council's concerns over the procedures followed in respect of the development of the former public house site

Cllr. Crow-Brown had asked for the application to be "called in" to TDC's Planning Committee and Mr Livingstone has acknowledged its receipt and will confirm to which Committee it will be considered. It will definitely not be September's.

Members expressed surprise that the application site had not been listed and the Chairman indicated that she would send photos of the premises to English Heritage and seek their advice.

31. LITTER PICKING INITIATIVE

Cllr. Steel reported he had purchased equipment for the litter picking team and that he would pass the invoices to the Clerk for payment. The team had litter picked the Village and 6 bags of rubbish had been collected. Members were further advised that he would arrange to meet the manager of McDonald's restaurant to discuss the litter emanating from their premises.

The Chairman thanked Richard for undertaking this initiative.

32. FACEBOOK & PARISH COUNCIL WEBSITE

Council were advised by Councillor Steel of the initiative to create a Parish Council Facebook and Website to allow more detailed information to be made available to the residents of Acol.

However in respect of the Facebook site Members expressed some reservations and it was agreed to meet to discuss this matter separately.

33. RECREATION GROUND

Cllr. Hayfield reported that he and Norman Chidwick had assembled and installed the picnic table in the Recreation Ground.

The Council thanked David and Norman for their efforts and also David for purchasing materials and constructing a gate to facilitate disabled entry. The total cost of all materials for the table and gate had cost £260.00 and Members were reminded that a budget of £500.00 had been allocated for the project.

The Clerk was asked to arrange for RoSPA to inspect the facilities within the Recreation Ground.

34. CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk reported that he would be on leave until 26th September but that he would continue to monitor matters of importance to the Village and keep Members fully advised.

35. FINANCIAL MATTERS

(i) Bank balance: The balance at 1 September 2017 was £10387.40 and Members were advised that within this budget was £425.60 which was the balance from the APEG account.

36. REPORT OF COUNCILLORS MS DAWSON & GREGORY (KCC), & CROW-BROWN(TDC)

Councillor Crow-Brown advised that TDC was facing the prospect of making budget cuts of £2m. The debate on car parking and charging for on-street parking was continuing.

Visitor numbers to Thanet had substantially increased to the levels of the 1970s and Wetherspoons had opened premises in Ramsgate.

Finally Members were advised that TDC had served a section 215 notice on the owners of the land at Spitfire corner requiring it to cleared of rubbish.

37. MATTERS OF REPORT BY MEMBERS

Cllr. Mrs. Osborne:

- (i) Andrew Field, the Speedwatch co-ordinator, had resigned and Cllr. Searle from St. Nicholas at Wade would be taking over these duties.
- (ii) Jonathan Cole was seeking advice from TDC on a proposal to construct a car port on the land adjacent to the Chapel of Rest; and
- (iii) Enquired whether planning consent was being sought for the development of land in Plumstone Road.

There were no additional reports from Members.
