SHAPE Village Consultation - thank you to everybody who came along to see the draft designs for Jubilee Field and The Leys and to listen to SHAPE and the Youth Committee's presentations. The attendance (over 100 people) surpassed our expectations, and we were pleased to be able to discuss the plans, address concerns and answer questions. We would be very grateful if anybody who attended but did not complete a form could spare 5 minutes to email a comment on the plans and SHAPE's project (evidence of community engagement is really important to our grant applications):

The Great Village 100 mile Run

Sunday 9th March, Steady's Lane
<u>Dust off your trainers!</u>

SHAPE has set a challenge...can we muster enough young legs and older legs to run, jog or walk a grand total of 100 miles (or more)?

Participants can choose to run any distance from

Participants can choose to run any distance from 1/2 mile upwards along Steady's Lane (a tarmacked, traffic-free route).

10am start (for participants running under 1 mile) / 10.20 start for participants running over 1 mile Adult participants: £3 entry fee (payable on day) / children are asked to collect sponsorship – with a medal awarded to all under 16s taking part If you'd rather wear wellies than trainers, we still need volunteers to help on the day (marshalling and totting up the miles).

We will soon be submitting a grant application to WREN which we hope will fund the bulk of the project, but we now need our community's support to help reach a target of £20,000 locally.
