SUMMARY FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL WEDNESDAY 10th JANUARY 2024

Below is a summary of some of the topics and discussions which took place at the Parish Council meeting held in January.

Planning

The following Discharge of Conditions application was noted:

P24/S0024/DIS - The Site of Milton House Gold Street Little Milton

Discharge of condition 7 (Drainage) on planning application P22/S1241/FUL Demolition of existing dwelling. Redevelopment of existing site to provide four dwellings with associated development including access works to Gold Street access.

Finance

The draft budget for 2024-25 was discussed in detail together with key financial assumptions related to planned major projects and the projected summary of closing reserves for 2023-24 through to 2026-27.

In agreeing the budget, the Council accepted that there will be a significant reduction in the Council's Reserves. It was further agreed that careful management of major projects, from a financial point of view was important and if necessary, some projects could be deferred to 2025-26.

Resolved to approve the budget for 2024-25. The budget covers improvement to public open spaces in the village, new speed indicator devices, replacement fencing around the playground, MUGA refurbishment, improved MUGA lighting as well as the usual services provided to the village by the Parish Council.

Resolved to increase the 2024-25 Precept to £14,000, an increase of £500 on the current year.

Reports from Councillor Representatives

Playground / Planning

Part of the fencing around the playground blew down during the recent storm. Cllr Wakeling will obtain quotations in wood and metal material to replace all the fencing around the playground. Cllr Harrison will obtain a quotation for recycled plastic fencing.

Communication

Cllr Horwell reported he had received several responses to the request via social media for areas of the village to be included in the Deep Clean scheduled for February.

Community

The Village Hall Committee have had initial discussions with a software developer to provide an online booking management system. It may be possible to include bookings for the MUGA.

Highways

Cllr Sheppard has written to Thames Water regarding reports of 55 releases of effluent into Haseley Brook last year but has yet to receive a reply. Cllr Sheppard has also enquired again about investigation works into effluent leaks into the school car park and possible water ingress into the sewage network from the surrounding fields.

The effluent release map for Thames Water has been checked and unfortunately the monitor for Gainsbridge Brook is not working correctly, it may be submerged by flooding. Cllr Sheppard will chase Thames Water for an answer.

A request to clear the gulleys has been made via Fix My Street. Several residents have also reported flooding issues via Fix My Street.

Next Meeting

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 10th January 2024, in Pine Lodge, commencing at 7.30pm.

RECTOR'S PINT

I find that January and February are possibly the hardest months of the year to get through. It is partly the post-Christmas effect. Our 2023 Christmas in all three parishes was remarkably good, and I left our Christmas Day service in Little Milton with a feeling of joy and goodwill. I was then clobbered by the inevitable bug. I was in bed at 9pm on New Year's Eve, and spent New Year's Day in a haze, having cancelled a meet up with friends. I did not face the New Year filled with great enthusiasm! I had just turned 64 a couple of days earlier, and was feeling every one of those years.

However, I write this following a rare and crisp frosty morning. The first snowdrops are showing and as I walked with Oscar past the windmill, the sun was rising over the Chilterns. To the south are The Clumps and beyond those, the foggy outline of the Downs; ancient Wessex. I was overwhelmed with gratitude, and with a reminder that moments of joy, when they come, need to be welcomed and cherished.

We are already looking forward to Lent. As usual, there will be a weekly reflective service of Compline every Wednesday at 6pm. There will also be a series of Lent Lunches, and in addition, we will be hosting a series of studies every Tuesday looking at St Paul's letter to the Thessalonians. The details are included here, following The Pint. Further details of venues for all the Lent activities will follow once they are known.

On another matter entirely, I have been so struck with how divided things are now. This came to a head for me with the demonstrations around the world relaying to Gaza, and the corresponding rise in antisemitism, not least in London. In December I organised a simple and non-partisan 'vigil for peace' in St Mary's. I hope that for those who did come, they found it helpful. I am grateful to Andrew Meynell for letting me have a prayer he came across some years ago, which comes from St George's Anglican Cathedral in Jerusalem. I believe it still has relevance now.

FRIENDS OF WELLS FARM

Some pretty cold weather in January meant we needed to keep breaking the ice on the livestock water troughs but they are pretty hardy and the Hebridean sheep seemed unconcerned. With over 100 sheep on the reserve due to other sites being flooded it has been quite busy and pretty tough counting them!

Vacancy: Would you like to help. We need a volunteer "stock watcher" to count the animals on Sunday's and check they are ok. Training given but it is straightforward. Please contact me via the email below.

When will we see the first blossom on the blackthorn? This is the first to flower and an important source of food for the early insects. Look out for emerging bumblebee queens. The birds should become more active too with lots of territorial singing. I have counted 4 pairs of hares in the fields at least. Badgers should have given birth to young underground but it will be too early for them to surface just yet.

Last month we completed the clearance of the top path in the north east corner. As time and weather allows we will now focus on laying the hedge at the end of that path down along the bridleway towards the footbridge. Basically it is pruning on steroids! So if you would like to help, please come along or reach out to me so I can add you to the WhatsApp group.

Weather permitting, I am planning more than one work party in Feb. Current plans are **Sunday 4th, Saturday 10th and Sunday 18th**. Please contact me to confirm or check the signs. We meet by the barn at 10am (Google maps ref 51.7026524, -1.1035352, W3W pancakes.expanded.talkative) to collect tools and then head for the north east corner (GM 51.7056097, -1.0918156, W3W stop.aimlessly.warmers). Usually finish around 1pm but may carry on through the afternoon if the weather is good.

VIEW FROM VIEWS

For a change I won't bore anyone with a comment on the weather, I think we all know it has been wet, I have never known the river to be as high as it was on the 6th of Jan, nor have I known it to have been in flood for so long end!!

There is no question now as to what we have to do with 2/3 of our planted ground which, is a complete washout literally. Let's hope the respite in the weather in the middle of January when, I write this column continues and, we can get our planting done in good time and conditions, to let the spring planted crops flourish.

Most of our land was drained by my predecessor but, now unfortunately they are beginning to cause problems, exacerbated by the wet weather. We find that some are blocked with root fibres that can be cleared once they are found. This is a process not aided by the 60 plus years since they we laid, these are all mapped, measured in imperial, with most of the reference points either not there or in the same place. These rely on what we call Mole draining, this is done by pulling a round 3" diameter cylinder through the ground about 18-24" below the ground crossing the drains at strategic angles to create channels for water to percolate into the drains all these now need renewing, those we have already show how effective they are, this is just another job we will have to do, as well as making sure all other water courses are free running mainly ones that come from water courses from other land, the law being the lower land has to take the higher.

Sir James Dyson, of Vacuum cleaner fame, is also a very big Farmer, owns as much land if not more than the Monarchy, known as "Beeswax Farming". He is producing Strawberries 12 months of the year under glass, in a completely sustainable way, all rainwater is collected and used for irrigation, he has anaerobic digesters that provide the electricity, and all berries are picked by robot. What the produce is like is up to those who eat them but, it does illustrate what the future could hold for food production. It does take those with his resources to lead the way and, experiment. If we are to survive in the future with the increase in population and, less labour, or willingness to do these mundane jobs, then these practices will have to be developed. You could argue is this the way we should be going? But it does have some merit.

I don't know if anyone has noticed how much more Mistletoe there is in trees around lately. This parasitic growth has mainly been prevalent in apple orchards and in Herefordshire, but now appears to have spread over the whole country, particularly noticeable here along the roadside at Adwell between Wheatfield and Lewknor. I read that this is due to there being more Blackcaps now overwintering in Britain, possibly due to Climate Change (Global Warming). Apparently, these birds like Mistletoe berries but not their seeds which get wiped off on other trees, unlike Mistle Thrushes (hence the name) and Fieldfares who I guess eat the whole lot and spread the seeds in other ways. Another possible sign of Global warming we saw a couple of hares (on the 7th January), cavorting as they are known to do in March, Partridges paired up around

Christmas time, untimely early. In spite of the reports, we hear that nature in this country is depleted, I would defy anyone to come here and say that, the other day we counted at least 20 tits and others around our feeders, and whenever I walk our fields there are always flocks of unidentifiable birds flying around, I suspect Sky Larks, Buntings, Fieldfares, Starlings and, I suspect many other species. When mentioning Starlings there certainly do not seem to be so many about although, I understand plenty around the Otmoor reserve, there was a report on Faming today a few days ago where a farmer was having to erect netting around his cattle feeders because, Starlings were nicking all the best bits of the cattle food, I can remember in my student days, being responsible for a group of Barley beef animals and having the same problem. At the time this was the latest system now not accepted anymore as the beef it produced was lacking in all sorts of ways, flavour, texture and many other ethical issues.

So, with the storms we have been having, just as was predicted some 30 years ago the above habit of the Blackcap could be caused by Global Warming. So, if this is the case are we taking it seriously enough, our politicians certainly don't seem to be in spite of their rhetoric, the recent Cop conference statement may have some effect, unfortunately it hasn't so far, but let's hope. Unfortunately most of the measures we need to take will cost us all money, something we have to accept if we are to save the planet, in the past we have had our energy and, food far too cheaply, now we need to accept that it should cost us more to fill our cars, or feed ourselves and become more realistic on what spend on the necessities of life.

Our new Minister, Steve Barclay, came to Oxford for the annual Farming Conference, and as usual with Ministers, gave a paper saying, how marvellous we farmers are and, he would do all he could to support us. We have heard this record so many times before we await with bated breath. Some things sound good but, they often do but then fizzle out in delivery. All the Shadow Minister said was they would support green energy







January 2024

Even before the Christmas decorations were down, or perhaps before they went up, speculation on the date of the General Election has been hotting up. It could actually be as late as January 2025, but whatever the date, the campaigning is already underway. Not just in the battle for media attention and getting messages out, but also in more subtle ways. In Parliament the increase in emails on specific issues referring to the next Party Manifesto is noticeable. In parliament the use of mechanisms to promote specific issues, such as Early Day Motions and Westminster Hall debates appears to be increasing.

Early Day Motions (EDMs) are motions that formally call for debate in the House of Commons but there is no timeline, simply at an 'early day' and few ever get debated. They are often used on behalf of campaign groups the reality, known by all involved, is that they rarely achieve anything. In any one Parliamentary session there will be well over a thousand EDMs tabled, and at an average cost of a several hundred pounds each, this is a substantial cost to the taxpayer. Given that they are ineffective, along with many colleagues on both sides of the House, I decided some time ago that I would not sign EDMs. Instead, there are many other more effective ways for an MP to raise an issue or lobby government. Whilst EDMs can only be signed by MPs we now have e-petitions which can be signed by anyone. These have much more success in raising awareness of different issues and some do get debated.

There is also a note of caution on Westminster Hall debates. I said above that I have often held a Westminster Hall debate. An MP uses a Westminster Hall debate to raise issues of concern to them. They are formal debates recorded in Hansard, but there are not votes. However, they do get a response from a Minister. So, whilst the debate is important to the MP holding it, the attendance of other MPs is neither critical nor representative of the wider support for the issue. Sometimes it is just not possible to attend.

I have already made public that it is not my intention to put myself forward as a candidate for the next General Election. I have served the Constituency since initially being elected in 2008 and have been returned to Parliament in four subsequent elections. I continue to take an interest in the views of constituents and, with the support of my team, assist those constituents wanting help. However, I am in the happy position of being able to sit light when an email tells me that the senders vote at the next General Election depends on my reply to their email. Such emails often spring from campaign groups and, whilst I will continue to reply with my view, it is really the views of the various Parliamentary Candidates for the Constituency that should be of greater interest. I will have moved on to pastures new.
